



Display Icons

Service Icons

Signal Strength – Your phone's current signal strength. (More bars = stronger signal.)

No Service – Your phone cannot find a usable signal.

Roaming – Your phone is "roaming" off the Boost Mobile network.

Data Service – Data service is available. When active, the icon is animated.

Data Service Dormant – Data service is currently dormant.

Data Service Unavailable – Data Service is currently unavailable.

Status Icons

Battery – Your phone's current battery charge level. (The icon to the left shows the battery is fully charged.) The icon is animated while the battery is charging.

Location On – Your phone's location feature is on and available for location-based services such as GPS Navigation.

Location Off – Your phone's location feature is off. Your location is available only for 911.

Silence All - Your phone's sound is turned off.

Vibrate All – Your phone's sound is turned off but vibrate is turned on.

Ringer Off – Your phone's ringer is turned off.

1 Beep – A beep sounds when you receive an incoming call, a message, etc.

1 Beep and Vibrate – 1 Beep and vibrate are set.

Ringer and Vibrate – The volume level is set to between 1 and 8 and vibrate is turned on.

Speaker Mode – Your phone is in speaker mode.

Messaging Icons

Email - You have new email message(s) waiting.

Picture Messages – You have new picture message(s) waiting.

SMS Voice Messages – You have new SMS voice message(s) waiting.

Text Messages - You have new text message(s) waiting.

Voicemail - You have new voicemail message(s) waiting. Urgent Messages – You have new urgent message(s) wating.

Multiple Messages – You have two or more different types of new messages waiting.

Bluetooth Icons

Visible – Your phone is discoverable by (visible to) other Bluetooth devices.*

Connected – Your phone is connected to a Bluetooth device.*

Enable - Your phone's Bluetooth feature is enabled.*

Voice Call Icons

Missed Call – You have missed voice calls.

Bluetooth Device - A call is in progress using a Bluetooth device.

Headset – A call is in progress using an optional wired headset.

Car Kit – A call is in progress using an optional car kit device.

Others

TTY - Your phone is connected to a TTY device.

Alarm Clock - Alarm clock or countdown is set.

Notification – You have events, call reminders, alarm clock, or countdown notification(s).

HAC Enabled - Your phone's HAC setting is enabled.



Keys

Earpiece

Earpiece lets you hear the caller and automated prompts.

Display Screen

Display Screen displays all the information needed to operate your phone, such as the call status, the Contacts list, the date and time, and the signal and battery strength

MENU/OK kev

Lets you access the phone's menus and selects the highlighted choice when navigating through a menu.

TALK key

Allows you to place or receive calls, answer Call Waiting, use Three-Way Calling, or activate Automatic Speech Recognition (ASR)

TEXT key

Lets you access the text message entry screen.

Navigation key

Scrolls through the phone's menu options and acts as a shortcut key from standby mode. These keys can be reassigned to create customized shortcuts.

Microphone

Allows other callers to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.

Camera Lens

Camera Lens, as part of the built-in camera, lets you take pictures.

Speaker

Lets you hear the different ringers and sounds. You can mute the ringer when receiving incoming calls by pressing [BACK] or side buttons. The speaker also lets you hear the caller's voice in speakerphone mode.

10 Softkeys

Lets you select softkey actions or menu items corresponding to the bottom left and right lines on the screen.

11 END/POWER key

Lets you turn the phone on or off, end a call, or cancel your input and return to standby mode.

12 Back key

Deletes characters from the display in text input mode. When in a menu, pressing it returns you to the previous menu. This key also allows you to return to the previous screen in a data session.

13 QWERTY keyboard

Lets you enter numbers, letters, and characters, and perform functions with single key press or combined key presses.

14 Battery Release Latch

Lets you open the battery cover to replace the battery.

15 .com kev

16 Internal Antenna

Facilitates reception and transmission. To maximize performance, do not obstruct the internal antenna while communicating.

17 Volume Button

Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in standby mode or the voice volume during a call. The volume button can also be used to scroll up or down to navigate through the different menu options.

18 Camera Button

Lets you open the Photos menu. Press and hold to activate the camera mode and take pictures.

19 Micro-USB Connector

Allows you to connect a charging cable or optional USB data cable.

20 Headset Jack

Allows you to plug in an optional headset for convenient, hands-free conversations.



Mobile Email

The SCP2700 supports "push" email from popular sites such as Yahoo!, Google, AOL, MSN as well as IMAP/POP3 accounts. Also stay up-to speed with work email if you have either a Microsoft Exchange or Lotus Domino corporate email server.

The SCP2700 offers easy access to GPS Navigation right from the main menu.

GPS Navigation is an optional application that can be downloaded. It provides audio and visual turn-by-turn directions with full color



Threaded Text Messaging

Easily follow a chain of text messages to and from a particular contact, in reverse chronological order.

How to view threaded text messages

- 1. To display the thread list from standby mode, press MESSAGES (left soft key) > Text Messages
- 2. Highlighting a thread shows the first few works of the most recent message in that thread.
- 3. Press O to view the highlighted thread.
- 4. Press O to view the highlighted messages detail's, including date and time of the message.

Bluetooth

Supports wireless headsets, hands-free car kits. wireless printing, dial-up networking (Phone as modem) and vCard transfer

How to Pair a Bluetooth Device

- 1. Press > Tools > Bluetooth
- 2. Highlight an option and press \bigcirc .
- Handsfree Pairing to find a headset or hands-
- Add to Trusted to find a device per device type. Select a device type to be searched.
- Trusted List to find all device types. Select Add New to start searching.
- 3. Highlight a device and press 🔾
- 4. Enter the passkey and press

 . When the owner of the other device enters the same passkey, the pairing is complete.

Restrict and Lock

With easy access under Settings menu, parents and business owners can:

- Restrict incoming and/or outgoing calls
- Lock or unlock data services
- Input up to 3 "special numbers" that are always available
- Lock contact list
- Lock camera and any pictures that are saved in the phone

How to use Restrict and Lock

- 1. From the Main Menu go to Settings > More.. > Restrict and Lock.
- 2. Select Voice and enter your lock code.
- 3. Restrict > Outgoing Calls or Incoming Calls.
- 4. Select Allow All, Contacts Only, or Special #s Only.

Auto Key Guard

The auto key guard will lock keys automatically after one minute or once the sleep mode time elapses (options for sleep mode: Off, 5, 30 or 60 seconds) To unlock keys press [Space] and then [Back]. To manually lock the keys, press and hold [Back].

How to disable the Auto Key Guard

1. Press \bigcirc > Settings > More... > Auto Key Guard 2. Select off
