## Optional Accessories

## Installing the SIM Card

Your SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card contains your phone number, service details, and phonebook/message memory.

Caution: Do not bend or scratch your SIM card. Avoid exposing your SIM card to static electricity, water, or dirt.


## Battery Use

Battery performance depends on many factors, including your wireless carrier's network configuration; signal strength; the temperature at which you operate your phone; the features and/or settings you select and use; items attached to the phone's accessory connector port; and your voice, data, and other application usage patterns.

Caution: To prevent injuries or burns, do not allow metal objects to contact or short-circuit the battery terminals.

To maximize your battery's performance:

- Always use Motorola Original batteries and battery chargers. The phone warranty does not cover damage caused from using non-Motorola batteries and/or battery chargers.
- New batteries or batteries that have been stored for a long time may require a longer charge time.
- Maintain the battery at or near room temperature when charging.
- Do not expose batteries to temperatures below $-10^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ $\left(14^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$ or above $45^{\circ} \mathrm{C}\left(113^{\circ} \mathrm{F}\right)$. Always take your phone with you when you leave your vehicle.
- When you do not intend to use a battery for a while, store it uncharged in a cool, dark, dry place, such as a refrigerator.
- Batteries gradually wear down and require longer charging times. This is normal. If you charge your battery regularly and notice a decrease in talk time or an increase in charging time, then it is probably time to purchase a new battery.

$\epsilon$
The rechargeable batteries that power this phone must be disposed of properly and may need to be recycled. Refer to your battery's label for battery type. Contact your local recycling center for proper disposal methods.

Warning: Never dispose of batteries in a fire because they may explode.

## Installing the Battery



Your phone is designed to use only Motorola Original batteries and accessories. We recommend that you store batteries in their protective cases when not in use.

Note: Your phone is shipped with a clear protective tape covering the battery door latch. Remove the tape to ensure that the battery door attaches and closes properly.


## Charging the Battery

New batteries are shipped partially charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery as described below. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

## Action

1 Insert the travel charger plug into your phone with the release tab facing up.
Be sure to insert the plug's

connectorhooks
straight into the phone's charger slots, so that both hooks engage to lock the plug in place.

Note: It may take up to ten seconds for your phone to indicate that the battery is charging, depending on the current battery charge level.
2 Plug the other end of the travel charger into the appropriate electrical outlet.
3 When your phone indicates Charge Complete, press the release tab and remove the travel charger.

Tip: You can safely leave the travel charger connected to the phone after charging is complete. This will not damage the battery.

## Turning Your Phone On



## Action

1 Open your phone.
2 Press and hold (3) for 2 seconds to turn on the phone.

Note: It may take up to four seconds
 for the display to illuminate after you turn the phone on.
3 If necessary, enter your SIM card PIN code and press OK $(\odot)$ to unlock the SIM card.

Caution: If you enter an incorrect PIN code 3 times in a row, your SIM card is disabled and your phone displays SIM Blocked.
4 If necessary, enter your 4-digit unlock code and press $\mathbf{O K}(\odot)$ to unlock the phone.

## Adjusting Volume

Press the up or down volume keys to:


- increase or decrease earpiece volume during a call
- increase or decrease the ringer volume setting when the home screen is visible (flip must be open)
Tip: At the lowest volume setting, press the down volume key once to switch to vibrate alert. Press it again to switch to silent alert. Press the up volume key to cycle back to vibrate alert, then ring alert.
- turn off an incoming call alert


## Making a Call

## Answering a Call

When you receive a call, your phone rings and/or vibrates and displays an incoming call message.

When the phone flip is active, open the phone to answer the call. (To activate, press $\square>$ Settings
$>$ In-Call Setup > Answer Options > Open to Answer.)

## Highlight Features

You can do much more with your phone than make and receive calls! This section describes some of your phone's highlight features.

## Taking and Sending a Photo

Shortcut: From the home screen, press CAMERA ( $\odot$ ) to activate the camera.

To activate your phone's camera:
Find the Feature $\quad \gg$ Multimedia $>$ Camera
The active viewfinder image appears on your display.


Return to previous screen.

Point the camera lens at the photo subject, then:

## Sending a Multimedia Message



A Multimedia Messaging Service (MMS) multimedia message contains one or more slides with text and embedded media objects (including photos, pictures, animations, sounds, and/or voice records). You can send the multimedia message to other wireless phone users, and to email addresses.

## Receiving a Multimedia Message



When you receive a multimedia message or letter, your phone displays the $\square$ (message waiting) indicator and a New Messaye notification, and sounds an alert.

Multimedia messages that you receive can contain different media objects:

- Photos, pictures, and animations are displayed as you read the message.
- A sound file begins playing when its slide is displayed. Use the volume keys to adjust the volume as the sound file plays.

Note: In a multimedia letter, you may have to highlight an indicator embedded in the text to play a sound file.

- Attached files are added to the end of the message. To open the attachment, highlight the file indicator/filename and press VIEW $(\odot)$ (image file type), PLAY $(\odot)$ (sound file), or OPEN $(\odot)$ (vObject such as phonebook or datebook entry, or unknown file type).


# Learning to Use Your Phone

## Using the Display

The home screen is displayed when you are not on a call or using the menu. You must be in the home screen to dial a phone number.


Note: Your phone's display normally is visible only when the display backlight is on, or when the display is viewed in direct sunlight. To extend battery life, the backlight turns off automatically when no activity is detected for a period of time. The backlight turns back on when you open the flip or press any key. To set the time that the backlight stays on, see page 54.

Press the 5 -way navigation key (©.) left, right, up, or down to select a menu feature icon. If you select a menu icon by mistake, press ${ }^{-3}$ to return to the home screen.

Note: Your home screen may look different than the display shown above. For example, your service provider may hide the menu feature icons to allow a better view of the wallpaper image. You can still select the menu icons when they are hidden from view. To show or hide the menu icons, see page 76 .

The $\equiv$ (menu) indicator indicates that you can press the menu key ( $\square$ ) to enter the main menu.
Labels at the bottom corners of the display show the current soft key functions. Press the left soft key ( $\odot$ ) or right soft key $(\odot)$ to perform the function indicated by the left or right soft key label.
Your phone can display an analog or digital clock in the home screen (see page 76).

## Using the

 5-Way Navigation Key

Use the 5-way navigation key ( $\odot$ ) to scroll up, down, left, or right through the menu system, highlight menu items, change feature settings, and play games. Press the center select button to select a highlighted menu item. The center select button usually performs the same function as the right soft key $(\odot)$.

## Using Menus

From the home screen, press $\Xi$ to enter the main menu.


Press (.) to scroll to and highlight a menu feature icon in the main menu. The following icons represent features that may appear in the main menu, depending on your service provider and service subscription options.

This example shows that from the home screen, you must press $\Xi$, scroll to and select 暍 Recent Calls from the main menu, then scroll to and select Dialed Calls. Press ©.) to scroll, and the left/right soft keys to select the functions listed in the bottom left and right corners of the display.

## Selecting a Feature Option

Some features require you to select an option from a list:


Press $\square$ to open sub-menu.

- Press (.). to scroll up or down to highlight the option you want.
- In a numbered list, press a number key to highlight the option.
- In an alphabetized list, press a key repeatedly to cycle through the letters on the key and highlight the closest matching list option.
- When an option has a list of possible values, press
 left or right to scroll through and select a value.
- When an option has a list of possible numeric values, press a number key to set the value.


## Entering Text

Some features require you to enter information.


## Choosing a Text Entry Method

Multiple text entry methods make it easy for you to enter names, numbers, and messages. The method you select remains active until you select another method.

Press $\odot$ in any text entry screen to select one of the following entry methods:

## Using Tap Method

This is the standard method for entering text on your phone．

Regular Tap method cycles through the letters and number of the key you press. Tap Extended method also cycles through additional symbols as shown in the "Character Chart" on page 37.

## Tap Method Text Entry Rules

- Press a keypad key repeatedly to cycle through its characters.
- Press (o) left or right to move the flashing cursor to the left or right in a text message.
- The first character of every sentence is capitalized. If necessary, press © down to force the character to lowercase before the cursor moves to the next position.
- If you enter or edit information and do not want to save the changes, press 8 to exit without saving.


## Using iTAPTM Method

iTAP ${ }^{\text {TM }}$ software provides a predictive text entry method that lets you enter a word using one keypress per letter. This can be faster than Tap method, because your phone combines the keypresses into common words.

For example, if you press combinations that match your keypresses display:


If you want a different word (such as Progress), continue pressing keypad keys to enter the remaining characters.

## Entering Words

In a text entry screen, you can press $\Theta$ to switch entry methods. An indicator tells you which method is active (see page 34). If iIAP method is not available as the Primary or Secondary entry method, see page 33.

If you enter a word your phone does not recognize, the phone stores it to use as one of your word options. When you fill memory space for unrecognized words, your phone deletes the oldest words to add new words.

## Using Numeric Method

In a text entry screen, press $\sigma$ to switch entry methods until the 123 (numeric) indicator displays.

Press keypad keys to enter the numbers you want. When you finish entering numbers, press $\sigma$ to switch to another entry method.

## Deleting Letters and Words

Place the cursor to the right of the text you want to delete, and then:

## Action

Press DELEIE ( $\odot$ ) to delete one letter at a time.
Hold DELEIE ( $\odot$ ) to delete the entire message.

## Using the Smart Key

The smart key gives you another way to perform
 many basic phone functions. It anticipates the next action you are likely to perform. For example, when you highlight a menu item, you can press the smart key to select it. You can use the smart key to make and end calls, turn features on and off, and open your phonebook. The smart key usually performs the same function as the right soft key ( $\odot$ ).

## Using the External Display

When the flip is closed, the external display shows the time and phone status information. It also displays messages to notify you of incoming calls and other events. You can perform the following functions in the external display.

Note: Because the microphone and earpiece are unavailable when the phone is closed, you must use a headset or other handsfree device with this feature.

## Using the Handsfree Speaker

When you activate your phone's integrated handsfree speaker, you can talk to the other party without holding the phone to your ear.

Press SPEAKER $(\odot)$ to turn the handsfree speaker on or off during a call.

When you turn the handsfree speaker on, your phone displays Spaaker On in the home screen. The handsfree speaker remains on until you press SPEAKER $(\odot)$ again or turn the phone off.
Note: The handsfree speaker is disabled when you connect your phone to a handsfree car kit or headset accessory.

## Password

Your phone's 4-digit unlock code is originally set to 1234, and the 6-digit security code is originally set to 000000. Your service provider may reset these codes before you receive your phone.
If your service provider has not reset these codes, we recommend that you change them to prevent others from accessing your personal information. The unlock code must contain 4 digits, and the security code must contain 6 digits.
You can also reset your SIM card PIN code, PIN2 code, and/or call barring password if necessary.

To change a code or password:

## Locking and Unlocking Your Phone

You can lock your phone manually or set the phone to lock automatically whenever you turn it off.
To use a locked phone, you must enter the unlock code. A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages, but you must unlock it to answer.

You can make emergency calls on your phone even when it is locked (see page 57).

## Recording a Voice Name

When creating a phonebook entry, scroll to Voice Name and press RECORD ( $\odot)$. Press and release the voice key and say the entry's name (within 2 seconds). When prompted, press and release the voice key and repeat the name. Press DONE ( $\odot)$ to store the voice name.

Note: This option is not available for entries stored on the SIM card.

Set the display to turn off when no activity is detected for a period of time. You can set the display to stay on for 1 or 2 minutes, or set 0ff to deactivate display timeout.

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## Specific Absorption Rate Data

## The model wireless phone meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your wireless phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured not to exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health.
The exposure standard for wireless mobile phones employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit set by the FCC and by the Canadian regulatory authorities is $1.6 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$. ${ }^{1}$ Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions accepted by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the phone transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the phone while operating can be well below the maximum value. This is because the phone is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.
Before a phone model is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. The tests are performed in positions and locations (e.g., at the ear and worn on the body) reported to the FCC and available for review by Industry Canada. The highest SAR value for this model phone when
tested for use at the ear is $1.23 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$, and when worn on the body, as described in this user guide, is $0.43 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$. The SAR value for this product in its data transmission mode (body-worn use) is $0.79 \mathrm{~W} / \mathrm{kg}$. (Body-worn measurements differ among phone models, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements). ${ }^{2}$
While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various phones and at various positions, they all meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure. Please note that improvements to this product model could cause differences in the SAR value for later products; in all cases, products are designed to be within the guidelines.
