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safety and information

Comply with the following precautions to avoid dangerous or illegal situations and ensure peak performance of your mobile phone.



Safety warnings

Keep your phone away from small children and pets

Keep your phone and all accessories out of the reach of small children or animals. Small parts may cause choking or serious injury if swallowed.

Protect your hearing



Excessive exposure to sound at high volumes can cause hearing damage. Always turn the volume down before plugging the earphones into an audio source and use only the minimum volume setting necessary to hear your conversation or music.

Install mobile phones and equipment with caution

Ensure that any mobile phones or related equipment installed in your vehicle are securely mounted. Avoid placing your phone and accessories near or in an air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment can cause serious injury when air bags inflate rapidly.

Handle and dispose of batteries and chargers with care

- Use only Samsung-approved batteries and chargers specifically designed for your phone.
 Incompatible batteries and chargers can cause serious injuries or damage to your phone.
- Never dispose of batteries or phones in a fire.
 Follow all local regulations when disposing used batteries or phones.

- Never place batteries or phones on or in heating devices, such as microwave ovens, stoves, or radiators. Batteries may explode when overheated
- Never crush or puncture the battery. Avoid exposing the battery to high external pressure, which can lead to an internal short circuit and overheating.

Avoid interference with pacemakers

Maintain a minimum of 15 cm (6 inches) between mobile phones and pacemakers to avoid potential interference, as recommended by manufacturers and the independent research group, Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that your phone is interfering with a pacemaker or other medical device, turn off the phone immediately and contact the manufacturer of the pacemaker or medical device for guidance.

Turn off the phone in potentially explosive environments

Do not use your phone at refuelling points (service stations) or near fuels or chemicals. Turn off your phone whenever directed by warning signs or instructions. Your phone could cause explosions or fire in and around fuel or chemical storage and transfer areas or blasting areas. Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.

Reduce the risk of repetitive motion injuries

Use only Samsung-approved accessories

Using incompatible accessories may damage your phone or cause injury.

Turn off the phone near medical equipment

Your phone can interfere with medical equipment in hospitals or health care facilities. Follow all regulations, posted warnings, and directions from medical personnel.

Turn off the phone or disable the wireless functions when in an aircraft

- If your phone has a camera flash or light, avoid using it.

Use your phone in the normal position

- Avoid charging batteries for more than a week, as overcharging may shorten battery life.

In normal use, the actual SAR is likely to be much lower, as the phone has been designed to emit only the RF energy necessary to transmit a signal to the nearest base station. By automatically emitting lower levels when possible, your phone reduces your overall exposure to RF energy.





assembling and preparing your mobile phone


Get started by assembling and setting up your mobile phone for its first use.

Install the SIM card and battery

When you subscribe to a cellular service, you will receive a Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) with subscription details, such as your personal identification number (PIN) and optional services.

To install the SIM card and battery,

1. Remove the battery cover.





If the phone is on, press and hold [lot turn it off

2. Insert the SIM card.





- Place the SIM card in the phone with the gold-coloured contacts facing down.
- Without inserting a SIM card, you can use your phone's non-network services and some menus.

3. Insert the battery.



4. Replace the battery cover.



Charge the battery

Before using the phone for the first time, you must charge the battery.

 Open the cover to the multifunction jack and plug the small end of the travel adapter.





Improperly connecting the travel adapter can cause serious damage to the phone. Any damages by misuse are not covered by the warranty.

- Plug the large end of the travel adapter into a power outlet.
- When the battery is fully charged (the min icon is no longer moving), unplug the travel adapter from the power outlet.
- 4. Unplug the travel adapter from the phone.
- 5. Close the cover to the multifunction jack.



About the low battery indicator

When your battery is low, the phone will emit a warning tone and a low battery message. The battery icon will also be empty and blinking. If the battery level becomes too low, the phone will automatically power off. Recharge your battery to continue using your phone.

Insert a memory card (optional)

To store additional multimedia files, you must insert a memory card. Your phone accepts microSD™ or microSDHC™ memory cards up to 8 GB (depending on memory card manufacturer and type)...



Formatting the memory card on a PC may cause incompatibility with your phone. Format the memory card only on the phone.

1. Remove the battery cover and battery.

2. Insert a memory card with the label side facing down.



- 3. Push the memory card in the memory card slot until it locks in place.
- 4. Replace the battery and battery cover.

To remove the memory card, remove the battery and battery cover, push it gently until it disengages from the phone, and then pull the memory card out of the memory card slot.

Attach a hand strap (optional)

- 1. Remove the battery cover.
- 2. Slide a hand strap through the slot and hook it over the small projection.



3. Replace the battery cover.

Learn how to perform basic operations and use the main features of your mobile phone.

Turn your phone on and off

To turn your phone on,

- Press and hold [].
- 2. Enter your PIN and press < OK> (if necessary).
- When the setup wizard opens, customise your phone as desired by following the screen.

To turn your phone off, repeat step 1 above.

Switch to the offline profile

By switching to the offline profile, you can use your phone's non-network services in areas where wireless devices are prohibited, such as aeroplane and hospitals.

To switch to the offline profile, in Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles → Offline.



Follow all posted warnings and directions from official personnel when in areas where wireless devices are prohibited.

Access menus

To access your phone's menus,

In Idle mode, press < Menu > to access Menu mode.



You may need to press the Confirm key to access Menu mode depending on your region or service provider.

- Use the Navigation key to scroll to a menu or option.
- 3. Press < Select>, < OK>, or the Confirm key to confirm the highlighted option.

Use shortcut menus from the shortcut toolbar

Learn to use the items on the toolbar.

To access an item from the shortcut toolbar, in Idle mode, scroll left or right to the menu item you want and press the Confirm key.

To edit items on the shortcut toolbar.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Shortcuts toolbar.
- 2. Press <Options> → Edit.
- 3. Select your favourite menus.

Press <Save>. or press <Options> → Save.



To deactivate the shortcuts toolbar, in Menu mode, select Settings \rightarrow Display and light \rightarrow Home screen \rightarrow Shortcuts toolbar \rightarrow Off \rightarrow Save.

Customise your phone

Get more from your phone by customising it to match your preferences.

Adjust the volume of the key tones

In Idle mode, press the Volume key up or down to adjust the key tone volume.

Switch to or from the silent profile

In Idle mode, press and hold [$\underline{\ \ }^{\ \ \ }$] to silence or unsilence your phone.

Set a phone profile

To change the ringtone of the current profile,

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Scroll to the profile you are using.



If you are using the silent or offline profile, you are not allowed to change the ringtone.

- 3. Press <Options> → Edit → Voice call ringtone.
- 4. Select a ringtone category → a ringtone.
- 5. Press < Save>.

To switch to another profile, select it from the list.

To create a phone profile.

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone profiles.
- 2. Press <Options> → Create.
- 3. Enter a name for the profile and press < Save >.
- 4. Customise the sound settings as desired.
- 5. When you are finished, press < Save>.

Select a wallpaper (Idle mode)

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → Home screen.
- 2. Scroll left or right to Images.
- 3. Select Wallpaper.
- Select an image category → an image.
- 5 Press < Select> → < Save>

Select a theme for the display

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Display and light → My theme.
- 2. Scroll to a theme and press < Save>.

Set menu shortcuts

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Phone settings → Shortcuts.
- 2. Select a key to use as a shortcut.
- 3. Select a menu to assign to the shortcut key.



When the shortcuts toolbar is activated, the Navigation keys (left/right) do not work as shortcuts.

Lock your phone

- In Menu mode, select Settings → Security → Phone lock → On.
- 2. Enter a new 4- to 8-digit password and press < OK>.
- 3. Enter the new password again and press < OK>.



- The first time you access a menu that requires a password, you will be prompted to create and confirm a password.
- Samsung is not responsible for any loss of passwords or private information or other damages caused by illegal software.

Use basic call functions

Learn to make or answer calls and use basic call functions.

Make a call

- In Idle mode, enter an area code and a phone number.
- 2. Press [] to dial the number
- 3. To end the call, press [].

Answer a call

- When a call comes in, press [-].
- 2. To end the call, press [.

Adjust the volume

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume key up or down.

Use the speakerphone feature

- During a call, press the Confirm key → <Yes> to activate the speaker.
- 2. To switch back to the earpiece, press the Confirm key again.



In noisy environments, you may have difficulty hearing the calls while using the speakerphone feature. For better performance, use the normal phone mode.

Record a conversation



This feature may not be available depending on your region or service provider.

- During a call, press < Options> → Menu → Applications → Voice recorder.
- Press the Confirm key to start recording.
- 3. Press the Navigation key down to stop recording.

Use the headset

By plugging the supplied headset into the headset jack, you can make and answer calls:

- To redial the last call, press the headset button twice.
- To answer a call, press the headset button.
- To end a call, press the headset button.

Send and view messages

Learn to send or view text (SMS), multimedia (MMS), or email messages.

Send a text or multimedia message 1. In Menu mode, select Messages → Create

message → Message.

You can also send messages by pressing [⋈]



in Idle mode.

- Enter a destination number or an email address and scroll down.
- Enter your message text. ▶ p. 29
 For sending as a text message, skip to step 5.
 For attaching multimedia, continue with step 4.

- Press < Options> → Add multimedia and add an item.
- 5. Press the Confirm key to send the message.

Send an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Create message → Email.
- 2. Enter an email address and scroll down.
- 3. Enter a subject and scroll down.
- 4. Enter your email text.
- Press < Options> → Attach multimedia and attach a file (if necessary).
- 6. Press the Confirm key to send the email.

Enter text

When entering text on the QWERTY keyboard, you can use the following functions:

- Press [☆] to change case or switch to Number mode.
- Press [m] to switch to Symbol mode.
- Press [Alt] to enter characters on the upper half of the keys.
- Press [Alt] → [_⁴] to open the emoticon list.
 Enter text in one of the following modes:

Mode	Function
ABC	Press the appropriate alphanumeric key until the character you want appears on the display.
Number	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a number.
Symbol	Press an appropriate alphanumeric key to enter a symbol.

View text or multimedia messages

- 1. In Menu mode, select **Messages** → **Inbox**.
- 2. Select a text or multimedia message.

View an email

- In Menu mode, select Messages → Email inbox.
- Select an account.
- 3. Press < Options> → Download.
- 4. Select an email or a header.
- If you selected a header, press < Options> → Retrieve to view the body of the email.

Add and find contacts

Learn the basics of using the phonebook feature.

Add a new contact

- 1. In Idle mode, enter a phone number and press < Options>.
- 2. Select **Save contact** → a memory location (phone or SIM) → **New**.
- 3. Select a number type (if necessary).
- 4. Enter contact information.
- Press <Save>, or press <Options> → Save to add the contact to memory.

Find a contact

- 1. In Menu mode, select Phonebook.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact's name from the search list.



Once you have found a contact, you can:

- call the contact by pressing [-
- edit the contact information by pressing the Confirm key

Use basic camera functions

Learn the basics to capture and view photos and videos.

Capture photos

- In Idle mode, press and hold [6] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 3. Press the Confirm key or [15] to take a photo. The photo is saved automatically.
- 4. Press <(🕏) or [🗟] to take another photo (step 2).

View photos

In Menu mode, select My files \rightarrow Images \rightarrow My photos \rightarrow a photo file.

Capture videos

- 1. In Idle mode, press and hold [固] to turn on the camera.
- 2. Press [1] to switch to Recording mode.
- 3. Aim the lens at the subject and make any adjustments.
- 4. Press the Confirm key or [6] to start recording.
- Press <回>, the Confirm key, or (面) to stop recording.
 The video is saved automatically.
 After capturing videos, press the Confirm key to view the video.
- 6. Press < Prev.> or [1] to record another video (step 3).

View videos

In Menu mode, select My files → Videos → My video clips → a video file.

Listen to music

Learn how to listen to music via the music player or FM radio.

Listen to the FM radio

- 1. Plug the supplied headset into the phone's headset iack.
- Use a 3.5 mm headset for listening to the radio.
 - While listening to the radio, do not connect the travel adapter or PC data cable to your
 - phone. The adapter or cable may interrupt the headset's function as a radio antenna.

- In Menu mode, select FM radio.
- 3. Press the Confirm key to turn on the FM radio.
- 4. Press < Yes> to start automatic tuning. The radio scans and saves available stations. automatically.



The first time you turn on the FM radio, you will be prompted to start automatic tuning.

Control the FM radio using the following keys:

6. To turn off the FM radio, press the Confirm key.

Listen to music files

Start by transferring files to your phone or memory card:

- Download from the wireless web. ▶ p. 34
- Download from a PC with the optional Samsung PC Studio. ▶ p. 44
- Receive via Bluetooth. ▶ p. 48
- Copy to your memory card. ▶ p. 44

After transferring music files to your phone or memory card,

- 1. In Menu mode, select Music → Music player.
- 2. Select a music category → a music file.

Browse the web

- 2. Navigate web pages using the following keys:

Use advanced call functions

Learn about your phone's additional calling capabilities.

View and dial missed calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed on the display. To dial the number of a missed call,

- Press < View >.
- 2. Scroll to the missed call you want to dial.
- 3. Press [] to dial.

Call a recently dialled number

- In Idle mode, press [] to display a list of recent numbers.
- 2. Scroll to the number you want and press [] to dial.

Hold a call or retrieve a held call

Press < Hold> to place a call on hold or press < Retrieve> to retrieve a held call.

Dial a second call

If your network supports this function, you can dial another number during a call:

- 1. Press < Hold> to place the first call on hold.
- 2. Enter the second number to dial and press $[\hline{m{ au}}].$
- 3. Press < Swap> to switch between the two calls.
- To end the call on hold, press < Options > → End held call.
- 5. To end the current call, press [.

Answer a second call

If your network supports this function, you can answer a second incoming call:

- Press [] to answer the second call.
 The first call is automatically placed on hold.
- 2. Press < Swap> to switch between the calls.

Make a multiparty call (conference call)

- Call the first party you want to add to the multiparty call.
