# SCH-r561 PORTABLE Dual-Mode TELEPHONE

User Guide

Please read this manual before operating your phone, and keep it for future reference.



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## Warning

Depending on the user interface used in the handset, you may experience slow keypad response when performing tasks in the background. This can impact making phone calls. When there is no activity or change in the icons at the top of the main LCD display, the handset will resume normal operations.

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## Getting Started Closed View of Phone



1 Getting Started

- Front LCD: The Front LCD shows signal and battery strength, time, day, and date. It also displays incoming calls or messages.
- Volume Keys: Allows you to adjust the ringer volume in idle mode (with the phone open) or adjust the voice volume during a call. To mute the ringer during an incoming call, press the volume key up or down.
- 3. Menu/OK Key: Pressing when navigating through a menu accepts the highlighted choice in a menu.
- Left Softkey: This key is used to navigate through menus and applications by selecting the choice available in the Left Softkey Option.
- 5. Music Store: This key is used to launch the Music Store application.
- TALK Key: Allows you to place or receive a call. In idle mode, press the key once to access the recent call log.
- microSD<sup>™</sup> Card Slot: This expansion slot allows you to insert a microSD<sup>™</sup> memory card to add additional memory and storage capacity.
- 8. Alpha-numeric Keypad: Use these keys to enter numbers, letters, and characters.
- 9. Headset Jack: Allows you to plug in an optional headset for safe, convenient conversations.
- 10. Hole: The Hole is used to hang an accessory, such as a keychain.
- Power/Accessory Connector: The power/accessory interface connector is used to plug in the charging accessories and also connect any available accessory cables to your phone.
- Navigation Keys/Wheel Key: Allows you to scroll through the phone menu options and provides a shortcut to phone functions from standby mode.
- 13. Right Softkey: This key is used to navigate menus and applications by selecting the choice available in the Right Softkey Option.
- 14. Clear/BACK Key: Deletes characters from the display when you are in text entry mode. Press to return to the previous menu or screen when navigating features on your phone.

- 15. END Key: Ends a call. If you press and hold the END key, the power goes On or Off. When you receive an incoming call, press to ignore the call and send the call to voicemail.
- 16. Camera/Camcorder Key: This key is used to launch the integrated digital camera.
- 17. Microphone: The Microphone allows the other caller to hear you clearly when you are speaking to them.

## Viewing the Display Screen

The following list identifies the icons you'll see on your phone's display screens:

indicates that your 1X connection is active. Incoming voice calls go directly to Voicemail; outgoing voice calls can be made, but the connection will terminate.

indicates that data is being transferred over the 1X network. The arrow direction indicates whether the handset is sending or receiving data.

indicates that your 1X connection is dormant.

indicates that the EV-DO connection is dormant.

indicates that you have an active EV-DO connection. When the arrows are moving, data is being transferred over the EV-DO network. indicates that position location is active.

indicates that position location is inactive.

indicates that your phone is in web security mode.

indicates that your phone is roaming.

indicates that a that Memory Card is inserted.

indicates that you missed a call.

indicates that you have a missed picture message.

indicates that you have a missed text message.

indicates that you have a missed voice mail.



- indicates that you have missed scheduler.
- indicates that you have a missed alarm.
- indicates that you have a new message.
- indicates that the message is locked.
- indicates that the TTY option is On.
- indicates that your phone is in vibrate all mode.
- indicates that your phone is set to ringer plus vibrate mode.



- indicates that the ringer is set to 1-Beep.
- indicates that the phone is set to 1-Beep plus vibrate mode.
- indicates that the ringer is turned on.
- indicates that the ringer is turned off and the vibrate option is enabled.
- - indicates that the ringer is turned off.
  - indicates that the phone is set to Silence.
  - indicates that an alarm is set on your phone.
  - tells you a call is in progress.
  - means there is no service, as your phone cannot find a signal.
  - displays your current signal strength. When you are receiving maximum signal strength, six bars are shown.
  - displays your current battery strength.



displays your current battery strength at empty.

indicates that the handset is in Mute mode.

indicates that the handset is in Key Mute mode.

indicates that the handset is in Speaker mode.

indicates that the handset is in Whisper mode.

indicates that the Camera is enabled

indicates that the Camcorder is enabled.

indicates that the self-timer function is enabled. With the self timer enabled, a set amount of time is required prior to taking a picture.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Sunny. This is used for taking pictures outdoors on bright sunny days.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Cloudy. This is used for taking pictures outdoors under cloudy conditions.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Tungsten. This is used for taking pictures indoors under normal lighting conditions.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Fluorescent. This is used for taking pictures indoors under fluorescent lighting conditions.

indicates that the white balance has been set to Manual. This is used for taking pictures indoors or outdoors using your own custom settings.

indicates that a voice memo or video is being recorded. indicates the key you must press to pause playback.

indicates the key you must press to play.

indicates that media has been uploaded to an online album or folder.

indicates that media is pending upload to an online album or folder.

indicates that there is a voice caption attached to an image.

indicates that Bluetooth technology is enabled.



indicates that Bluetooth technology is connected.

indicates that Bluetooth technology is active and hidden.

#### Your phone can also display a handy glossary of icons:

- 1. Press (), select the **Phone Support** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Phone Info.
- 3. Select Icon Glossary.
- 4. Use the navigation keys to scroll through the list of icons.

## Turning Your Phone On and Off

#### To turn your phone on:

Press and hold states to turn your phone on.

Once your phone is On, it displays "Looking for Service" which indicates that your phone is searching for a signal. When your phone finds a signal, it automatically enters standby mode – the phone's idle state. At this point, you are ready to begin making and receiving calls.

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. When a signal is found, your phone automatically returns to standby mode.

In Power Save mode, your phone searches for a signal periodically without your intervention. You can also initiate a search for service by pressing any key (when your phone is turned On).

**Tip**: The Power Save feature helps to conserve your battery power when you are in an area where there is no signal.

#### To turn your phone off:

 Press protection for two or more seconds until you see the powering down animation on the display screen.

Your screen remains blank while your phone is off (unless the battery is charging).

## Using Your Phone's Battery and Charger

#### **Battery Capacity**

Your phone is equipped with a Lithium Ion (Lilon) battery. It allows you to recharge your battery before it is fully drained.

When the battery runs low, the battery icon will blink to remind you to recharge the battery. When the battery capacity is close to completely drained, the phone sounds an audible alert and then powers down.

Note: Long backlight settings, low signal strength, searching for service, vibrate mode, playing games, or browser use affect the battery's talk and standby times.

Tip: Be sure to watch your phone's battery level indicator and charge the battery before it runs out of power.

# Getting Started

#### **Installing the Battery**

#### To install the Lilon battery:

1. Press the top of the battery cover and slide the battery cover in the direction of the arrow to release it. Lift the cover up by the bottom corners to remove it.



2. Insert the bottom end of the battery into the phone housing by using the direction of the arrow printed on the battery. The gold contacts on the bottom of the battery should match up with those on the phone.



3. Push the top end of the battery down until it snaps into place.



 Insert the top end of the battery cover into the grooves of the phone. Snap the lid into place.



#### **Removing the Battery**

**Note**: Make sure the power is off so that you don't lose any stored numbers or messages.

#### To remove your battery:

• Use your finger to lift the battery (top end first) up and away from the phone.

#### **Charging the Battery**

Your phone's Lilon battery is rechargeable and should be charged as soon as possible so you can begin using your phone.

Keeping track of your battery's charge is important. If your battery level becomes too low, your phone automatically turns off and you will lose all the information you were just working on. For a quick check of your phone's battery level, glance at the battery charge indicator located in the upper-right corner of either of your phone's display screens. Imp indicates that the battery is full. If the battery charge is getting too low, the battery icon phinks and the phone sounds a warning tone.

Always use a Samsung-approved desktop charger, travel adapter, or vehicle power adapter to charge your battery.

**Note**: You must unplug the adapter before removing the battery from the phone during charging to avoid damage.

## Using the Travel Adapter

- 1. Locate the interface connector on the side of the phone and pull out and turn the plastic cover.
- Plug the terminal end of the adapter into the phone's interface connector, orienting the adapter's gold contact pin upward.



3. Plug the other end into an electrical outlet.

 An animated battery icon is displayed on the main screen. The icon provides an indication of whether the battery is being charged or is fully charged.

**Note**: It takes approximately 4 hours to fully recharge a completely drained standard battery. With the Samsung approved Lilon battery, you can recharge the battery before it drains completely.

## Using a microSD Memory Card in Your Phone

Your phone is capable of supporting a memory storage media known as a microSD<sup>™</sup> memory card. This card is the newest standard of flash memory specifically designed for use with ultra-small mobile phones and other devices. It is ideal for storing media-rich files such as music, videos, and photographs in your phone.

The maximum storage size for this media card is 8 GB.

Note: Compatibility with all high capacity microSD<sup> $\mathrm{TM}$ </sup> memory cards is not guaranteed.

#### Installing the microSD<sup>™</sup> Memory Card

Your phone has a memory card slot on the lower left side. You can install a microSD<sup>M</sup> card to provide additional memory for storing files (such as sound files and photos) in your phone.

#### To install the card:

- 1. Locate the memory slot on the left side of the phone and pull out and turn the plastic cover.
- Insert the microSD<sup>™</sup> card—pin side facing you and smaller end pointing toward the phone—into the memory card slot.
- Carefully insert the microSD<sup>™</sup> card into the opening and firmly push it in until you hear a click, which indicates that the card is now securely installed.

Getting Started

**Note**: To remove the card once it has been inserted, firmly push the end of the card further into the phone and release—the card should pop out of the memory card slot. If this does not work, repeat the process again.

4. With the card now securely installed, resecure the plastic cover over the microSD slot on the phone.

# Phone Basics

Your handset supports a flexible user interface that allows you to modify the user interface via downloadable themes. The availability of a custom user interface is subject to your carrier. The following description of the basic capabilities of the phone is a general description and not specific to a particular user interface. However, there are some general principles that govern the handset's user

interface. For each user interface, there will be a mechanism to access a main menu that provides access and control for most of the phone's capability.

## Accessing Menus

- 1. Select the user interface's main focus button or press 🔿 to activate the main menu.
- 2. Select menu items by highlighting them with the navigation key and pressing O.

## Displaying Your Phone Number

- 1. Press (), highlight the **Phone Support** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Phone Info.
- 3. Select Phone Number.

## Making and Answering Calls

#### To make a call:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on.
- Enter a phone number. (If you make a mistake while dialing, press sto erase one digit at a time. Press and hold sto erase the entire number.)
- 3. Press to call.
- 4. Press 📻 when you are finished.

Tip: To redial your last recent call, press 🚬

twice.

**Tip**: Some networks support + dialing. + dialing automatically indicates to the network that you are dialing an international call and adds the international dialing prefix (typically '011') to the call automatically. To use + dialing, press and hold the 0 key (until the + appears) before entering the phone number.

#### To answer an incoming call:

- 1. Make sure your phone is on. (If your phone is off, incoming calls go to Voicemail.)
- 2. Press 🤤.

Your phone notifies you of incoming calls in the following ways:

- The phone rings or vibrates (unless set to Silence All).
- The screen displays an incoming call message.

If the incoming call is from a number stored in your Contacts, the Contacts entry's name is displayed. The caller's phone number may also be displayed, if available. The following options are also available to handle an incoming call:

- Press s or the volume key on the side of the phone to quiet the ringer.
- Press the right softkey for Ignore or press and hold the volume key to send the incoming call to your Voicemail box immediately.

#### To disconnect a call when you are finished:

Press

#### Missed Call Notification

When an incoming call is not answered, a Missed Call message is displayed on your screen.

To dial a missed call back press 🥃

#### Calling Emergency Numbers

You can place calls to 911 (dial **911** and press **(**), even if your phone is locked or your account is restricted.

**Warning**: After initiating a 911 call, you must end the call by pressing \* and # on your keypad. This notifies the phone that the 911 call was terminated intentionally by the user. No other calls can be made prior to terminating the emergency call.

#### **In-Call Options**

During a call, use the left softkey to **Mute** or **UnMute** your phone's microphone. Additional actions are available by pressing the right softkey for **Options** during a call. (To select an option, press the corresponding keypad number or highlight the option and press ().)

- (1) Speaker On or Speaker Off allows you to activate or deactivate the speakerphone.
- (2) Save allows you to save the new number in your Contacts.
- (3) 3-Way Call allows you to talk to two different people at the same time. (For more information, see "Making a Three-Way Call" on page 19.)
- (4) Contacts accesses the Contacts menu options.
- (5) Voice Memo allows you to record the current conversation. (For more information on recording a voice memo, see "Voice Memo" on page 79.)
- (6) Phone Info displays the phone number, icon glossary, the hardware/ software version, and advanced information.
- (7) Key Mute or Key Unmute allows you to mute the key tones on your phone so the other caller cannot hear you pressing any keys on your phone.
- (8) Messaging allows you to check notifications and access the contents of voice or text messages.
- (9) Recent History checks your call log for Missed, Outgoing, Incoming and Recent calls. You can also erase the logs from this menu.
- (0) Tools accesses the Tools menu options.
- (\*) Whisper On or Whisper Off allows you to whisper (such as when you are in a public area) and your voice will be amplified so that the other caller can hear you.

**WARNING:** Because of higher volume levels, do not place the device near your ear during speakerphone use.

#### End-of-Call Options

After receiving a call from or making a call to a phone number that is not in your Contacts, the phone number and the duration of the call are displayed. Press the right softkey for **Options** and then press **Save** to save the new number in your Contacts. (See "Saving a Phone Number" on page 16" below for more information.)

Note: The End-of-Call options are not displayed for calls identified as Unknown ID or Restricted Number.

#### Saving a Phone Number

You can store up to 600 phone numbers in the Contacts list. (For more information, see "Adding a New Contact" on page 60.)

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode.
- 2. Press the right softkey 🗖 for Options.
- 3. Select Save.
- 4. Select New Entry and press 🔘.

Note: Step 4 does not appear when your Contacts list is empty.

5. Select the **Type** using the navigation key and press ().

- 6. Enter the name using the keypad and press ().
- 7. Press the left softkey **—** for **Done**.

#### Finding a Phone Number

- 1. From the Idle screen, press the right softkey 🚍 for **Contacts**.
- Scroll down through your list of contacts to highlight the name and press to make the call.

Others

**Tip**: To search through your list more quickly, enter the first few letters in the **Name** box. The display will move down the list to the first entry that matches the text in the Name box.


Tip: If the entry contains more than one phone number, scroll left or right to display the number you wish to call and press to make the call.

#### Dialing and Saving Phone Numbers With Pauses

You can dial or save phone numbers with pauses for use with automated systems, such as Voicemail or credit card billing numbers.

There are two types of pauses available on your phone:

• Hard Pause sends the next set of numbers when you press



**Note**: You can have multiple pauses in a phone number and combine 2-second and hard pauses.

#### To dial or save phone numbers with pauses:

- 1. Enter a phone number from standby mode.
- Press the right softkey a for Options and select Hard Pause or 2sec Pause. Hard pauses are displayed as a "P" and 2-second pauses as a "T".
- 3. Enter additional numbers.
- 4. Press to dial the number.

Press the right softkey **b** for **Options** and select **Save** to save the number in your Contacts.

When dialing a number with a hard pause, press et to send the next set of numbers.

#### Abbreviated Dial

Abbreviated dialing allows you to program a five or six digit prefix for commonly used phone numbers. When abbreviated dialing is on, you can enter the last four or five digits of any phone number that matches the five or six digit prefix, and the number is dialed.

#### To set up abbreviated dialing:

- 1. Press (), highlight the **Settings** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Call Setup.
- 4. Select Abbreviated Dial.

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- 5. Select **On** and press ().
- 6. Input the five or six digit prefix (for example, area code and prefix) and press ().

#### Making an Abbreviated Dial Call

 Enter the last four or five digits of the phone number. Abbrev. Dial is displayed in the lower left corner with the prefix digits displayed.

**Note:** If there is more than one Contact entry that matches the last four or five digits, a list is displayed which allows you to select the desired number to call.

2. Press to make the call.

#### Using Speed Dialing

You can store up to 98 numbers in your phone's speed dial memory to make contacting friends and family as easy as pressing a few buttons. With this feature, you can dial Speed Dial entries using one key press for locations 2-9, or two key presses for locations 10-99.

#### To use One-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 2-9:

Press and hold the appropriate key for approximately two seconds.

#### To use Two-Touch Dialing for Speed Dial locations 10-99:

- 1. Press the first digit.
- 2. Press and hold the second digit for approximately two seconds.

## Using Caller ID

#### To block your phone number from being displayed for a specific outgoing call:

- 1. Dial **\*67** on your keypad.
- 2. Enter the number you want to call.
- 3. Press

To permanently block your number, call the Customer Service department of your network service provider.

## Responding to Call Waiting

When you're on a call, Call Waiting alerts you of incoming calls by sounding two beeps. Your phone's screen informs you that another call is coming in and displays the caller's phone number (if it is available and you are in digital mode).

#### To respond to an incoming call while you're on a call:

Press
 (This puts the first caller on hold and answers the second call.)

#### To switch back to the first caller:

Press again.

## Making a Three-Way Call

With Three-Way Calling, you can talk to two people at the same time. When using this feature, the normal airtime rates will be charged for each of the two calls.

#### To make a Three-Way Call:

- 1. Enter a number you wish to call and press
- Once you have established the connection, press the right softkey for Options and select 3-way Call.
- 3. Select Contacts, Recent History, or Enter Phone # to dial the second number and press
- 4. When you're connected to the second party, press again to begin your three-way call.

If one of the people you called hangs up during your call, you and the remaining caller stay connected. If you initiated the call and are the first to hang up, all three callers are disconnected.

Tip: You can also begin a Three-Way Call by displaying a phone number stored in your Contacts, Recent History, or Messaging. To call the third party, press

## TTY Use With Handset

A TTY (also known as a TDD or Text Telephone), is a telecommunications device that allows people who are deaf or hard of hearing, or who have speech or language disabilities, to communicate by telephone.

Your phone is compatible with selected TTY devices. Please check with the manufacturer of your TTY device to ensure that it supports digital wireless transmission. Your phone and TTY device will connect via a special cable that plugs into your phone's headset jack. If this cable was not provided with your TTY device, contact your TTY device manufacturer to purchase the connector cable.

**Note:** Not all service providers support TTY. Consult your service provider for more information.

#### To turn TTY Mode on or off:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Accessibility.
- 4. Select TTY Options. (A brief explanation of TTY will display.)
- 5. Press 🔾 again to continue.
- Press the navigation key up or down to select TTY On or TTY Off and press 
   to save and exit.

**Note**: In TTY Mode when your headset is plugged in, your phone will display the TTY access icon. If TTY mode is enabled, the headset cannot be used.

**IMPORTANT 911 Emergency Calling**: We recommend that TTY users make emergency calls by other means, including Telecommunications Relay Services (TRS), analog cellular, and land line communications. Wireless TTY calls to 911 may be corrupted when received by public safety answering points (PSAPs) rendering some communications unintelligible. The problem encountered appears related to TTY equipment or software used by PSAPs. The wireless industry and PSAP community are currently working to resolve this.

# **Entering Text**

#### To change the character input mode:

- When you display a screen where you can enter text, press the right softkey for Options then select Text Mode.
- 2. Select a character input mode:
  - **T9 (English)**: To enter characters using predictive T9 Text Input (see page 21).
  - Alpha: To enter characters by tapping the keypad (see page 22).
  - Symbols: To enter symbols (see page 22).
  - Number: To enter numbers (see page 22).
  - Emoticons: To enter emoticon symbols.
  - Text Options: To customize your character input mode.

## **T9** Text Input

T9 Text Input analyzes the letters you enter using an intuitive word database and creates a suitable word. (The word may change as you type.) Other possible words appear in a list below your text.

- To choose a word displayed in the list, scroll up and down using the up and down navigation keys.
- To accept a word, press 

   .
- To accept a word and insert a space, press the #spece key.
- Press 📮 to erase a single character. Press and hold 🗲 to delete an entire entry.
- To enter a period, press **I (b)**. To enter other special characters, press **(b)** and then repeatedly press **(b)** to cycle through other special characters until the desired character is displayed. If the desired character does not display, press the right softkey **(b)** for **Options**, select **Text Mode**, and then select **Symbols**.
- To insert a number, press and hold the corresponding number key.

#### To enter text using T9:

- 1. From the text entry screen (for example, a new event in scheduler), press the right softkey for **Options**, select **Text Mode**, and then select **T9 (English)**.
- 2. Use your keypad to enter the new event.

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# Entering Text


## Alpha Mode

To enter characters by tapping the keypad, select the **Alpha** mode. Press the corresponding key repeatedly until the desired character appears.

Use the Key to switch between uppercase, lowercase, and mixed case.

#### To enter text using Alpha:

- 1. From a text entry screen, press the right softkey 🚍 for Options, select Text Mode, and then select Alpha.
- 2. Use your keypad to enter the contact's name. Characters scroll in the following order:



After a character is entered, the cursor automatically advances to the next space after two seconds or when you enter a character on a different key.

**Note**: When the Dual Language text option is enabled, accented characters are also displayed.

## Numbers, Symbols, Emoticons and Preset Messages

See "To change the character input mode:" on page 21 to enter the following types of input.

#### To enter symbols:

 Select the Symbols mode. To enter a symbol, press the corresponding number key indicated on the display. Use the navigation keys to scroll up or down to see additional symbols.

#### To enter numbers:

Select the Number mode and press the appropriate key.

#### To enter "emoticons" (smileys):

 Select the Emoticons mode. To enter an emoticon, press the corresponding number key indicated on the display. Use the navigation keys to scroll up or down to see additional emoticons. Emoticons are also referred to as "smileys", which are icons that express an emotion through a facial expression.

#### To enter preset messages:

- 1. Press the right softkey for **Options** then select **Add Preset Message**.
- 2. Scroll to the desired pre-programmed message and press ().
- For more information on preset messages, see "Quick Messages" on page 54.

## Roaming

#### **Recognizing Icons on the Display Screen**

Your phone's display screen always lets you know when you're off the network.

**Note**: You may pay a higher per-minute rate for roaming calls.

#### **Roaming on Other Digital Networks**

When you're roaming, you may not be able to access certain features, such as web services.

**Note**: If you're on a call when you leave the network and enter an area where roaming is available, your call is dropped. If your call is dropped in an area where you think service is available, turn your phone Off and On again to reconnect to the network.

## Setting Your Roaming Mode

By using the **Roaming** menu option, you can determine which signals your phone accepts. Choose from three different settings on your phone to control your roaming experience:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Roaming.
- 4. Select Set Mode.
- 5. To select an option, highlight it and press ().
  - Automatic: This setting seeks service. When service is unavailable, the phone searches for an alternate system.
  - **1X-Only Mode**: This setting allows you to access 1X networks. No EVDO service is available.
  - Home Only Mode: This setting allows you to access the home network only and prevents roaming on other networks.

## Update PRL<sup>1</sup>

You can manually update your PRL (Preferred Roaming List) to access additional networks provided by new roaming partners of your service provider, or by new systems that have been enabled. This typically results in either a better signal or expanded coverage. This is not a frequent activity and does not require constant checking. Access this feature if you know you will be traveling outside of your carrier's network to ensure that you always have the best coverage possible.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press 🔘.
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Roaming.
- 4. Select Update PRL.

1. This sub-menu may not be available depending on the UI version configured for your phone.

#### 25 Roaming

## Voice Service

Voice recognition allows you to say commands to perform common functions supported by your phone.

#### To activate voice recognition:

- 1. Press and hold a. (The phone prompts you to say a voice command.)
- 2. Wait for the beep and then say one of the following commands:
  - Call <Name or #>
     Lookup <Name>
  - Send Text <Name or #>
- Go To <Menu>
- Send Picture <Name or #>

Check <Item>

#### Call <Name or #>

You can dial any valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number. You can also dial by pronouncing a name stored in your Contacts.

Tips for using Call <Name or #>:

- Voice Service works best in quieter environments.
- When saying a number, speak at a normal speed and say each digit clearly. There is no need to pause between digits.
- The phone recognizes the digits one, two, three, four, five, six, seven, eight, nine, zero, and oh. The phone does not recognize numbers such as "one eight hundred" for "1-800." Instead, say "one-eight-zero-zero."
- The phone recognizes only valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone numbers.
- If your phone does not usually recognize you correctly when you are using Voice Service, try adapting Voice Service to your voice, which can significantly improve accuracy for some speakers.

#### To place a call using Call <Name or #>:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- 2. Say "**Call**" followed by either a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number naturally and clearly.

- Alternatively, you can call a person in your Contacts by saying the name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Contacts. (The phone plays the name through the earpiece and displays it on the screen.)

If you said a name listed in your Contacts that has more than one number associated with it, the phone displays the different locations (**Home**, **Work**, **Mobile**, **Pager**, **Others**) and asks you which one to dial. Say one of the location names and the phone will dial the number for the location you specified.

#### Send Text <Name or #>

#### To compose a text message using Voice Service:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- Say "Send Text" followed by either a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number.

  - If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect number, say No. (If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct number from the Choice List.)
- Compose your text message. For more information, see "To send a text message:" on page 48, beginning at step 6.

#### Send Picture <Name or #>

#### To compose Pic/Video Message using Voice Service:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- 2. Say "Send Picture" followed by a name stored in your Contacts or a valid 7, 10 or 11 digit North American phone number.

- If the phone asks you, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say No. (If there are other alternatives, the phone will prompt you with the next one. You can also press the navigation key up or down to select the correct address from the Choice List.)
- Compose your message using the keypad. For more information, see "Pic/Video Messages" on page 50.

#### Lookup <Name>

You can retrieve contact information for any person in your Contacts by saying the full name of the person.

#### To retrieve information using Lookup <Name>:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- Say "Lookup" followed by the name of the person, exactly as it is entered in your Contacts. (The phone will play the name it recognized through the speaker, and then open the contact information for that name.)

If the phone says, "Did You Say," followed by an incorrect name, say **No**. The phone then prompts you with the next name, if there is one. If there are no more names, the phone will say "Sorry, No Match Found."

#### Go To <Menu>

You can open an application or access a menu by saying "Go To" followed immediately by the "destination", either an application or menu.

#### To see a list of possible destinations:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- Say "Go To" by itself. A list of valid destinations is displayed and prompts you with "Please Choose." If the list is too long to fit on one screen, the screen displays "Next Menu." You can say the name of a destination, or say "Next Menu" to view the next screen.

#### Check <Item>

The voice recognition Status option gives you an update on your phone's service, signal strength, and battery level.

#### To retrieve your phone's status information:

- 1. Activate voice recognition. (See page 26.)
- 2. Say "Check" followed immediately by one of the following items:
  - Status plays back and displays ALL status information.

- Time plays back and displays current date and time information.
- Signal Strength plays back and displays current signal strength.
- Network plays back and displays the type of network coverage.
- Battery plays back and displays the current level of battery charge.
- My Phone Number plays back and displays your phone number.

## **Customizing Voice Service**

#### **Configuring Confirmation**

You can configure your phone's confirmation setting for voice-based commands.

#### To configure confirmation:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Accessibility.
- 4. Select Voice Service.
- 5. Select Confirmation.
- 6. Highlight one of the following options: Automatic, Always Confirm, or Never Confirm.
- 7. Press the left soft key 🗖 for **OK**.

#### Configuring Voice Adaptation

You can configure your phone to adapt to your voice when using voice-based commands.

#### To configure voice adaptation:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Accessibility.
- 4. Select Voice Service.
- 5. Select Adaptation.
- 6. Select Adapt Voice.
- 7. Press the left soft key 🚍 for **Start**.
- You will be prompted to record a series of commands. To reject a recording, press the right soft key for Back and record again.

Tip: To reset voice, press Reset Voice while in the Adaptation menu.

#### Changing Audio Guidance Mode

By default, your phone is set to prompt mode and provides audio prompts such as "Please say a command".

#### To change the audio guidance mode:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press O.
- 2. Select More....
- 3. Select Accessibility.
- 4. Select Voice Service.
- 5. Select Audio Modes.
- 6. Highlight one of the following:
  - Expert Mode: Audio guidance is provided by beeps only.
  - Prompt Mode: Prompts for the required information.
- 7. Press the left soft key 🗖 for **OK**.

# Main Menu

#### User Interface

The SCH-r561 is equipped with the capability to provide multiple user interfaces that can provide a different look and feel, and be customized to user preference. The availability of a customized user interface is subject to your service provider. Below the idle screen, all user interfaces provide a main menu to support the operation and configuration of the handset's feature. This will be accessible via either a special soft "button" (softkey) or pressing the  $\bigcirc$  key. This user guide focuses on describing the functions and features of the main menu. For other ways to access the main menu, please see the additional printed material that comes with your phone or talk to your service provider's customer support.

#### Menu Styles

Your phone can display the various features and options in one of two different menu styles: grid and list. By default, your handset is set to the grid menu style.

### Grid style

The grid style displays the first level menu choices with graphical icons arranged in a grid pattern. In other menu levels, choices are arranged in a vertical list.

 To navigate through a first level menu, simply press the navigation key in the direction towards your desired menu choice. Once the desired menu option is highlighted, press .

## List style

The list style displays all the various menu choices in a vertical list. As you navigate through the menu, menu options are highlighted. You can use your navigation keys to scroll through menus quickly and easily. The scroll bar at the right of the menu keeps track of your position in the menu at all times.

- To navigate through a menu, simply press the navigation key up or down. If you are in a first-level menu, such as **Settings**, you may also navigate to the next menu by pressing the navigation key left or right.
- You can also press the number on the keypad that corresponds to the menu choice to immediately access the menu.

## Changing the Phone's Menu Style

Your phone allows you to choose how the menu appears on your display screen. To select the display's menu style:

- 1. Activate the main menu.
- 2. Press the right soft key 🗖 for Option.
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- 3. Select Menu Style.
- 4. Select Grid Menu or List Menu and press ().

- Entertainment: Play live and pre-packaged video and audio. Please see "Entertainment" on page 36 for more information. Purchase and listen to downloaded music. Please see "Music" on page 36 for more information.
- Messaging: Stay in touch with others via messaging. Please see "Messaging" on page 48 for more information.
- Missed Alerts: Display list of missed alerts to catch up with events. Please see "Missed Alerts" on page 62 for more information.
- My Downloads: Download contents like screen savers, ringers, games, and applications to personalize your phone. Please see "My Downloads" on page 41 for more information.
- Phone Support: Access a directory of useful customer service and assistance. Please see "Phone Support" on page 104 for more information.
- Ringers: Access and configure settings for the ringer, voice calls, messaging, and the scheduler. Please see "Sounds" on page 89 for more information.
- Settings: Configure the phone to your preferences and network environment. Please see "Settings" on page 86 for more information.
- **Tools**: Access productivity tools to help manage your daily work. Please see "Tools" on page 72 for more information.
- Web: Access the internet to browse pages customized for mobile devices. Please see "Web" on page 34 for more information.

# Web

When you launch the browser, the phone will connect to the Internet and the service indicator icon will display.

Launching the Web Browser

Activate the main menu, highlight the Web menu, and press 
 .

The first time you use the Web Browser, you will be prompted to go through a setup process that takes approximately three minutes. If you had a previous web connection, the last page you visited will be displayed.

#### Navigating the Wireless Web

Use the following keys to navigate the Web:

Softkeys	Select an item
Navigation key	Scroll up and down on a web page
Volume keys	Scroll one page at a time
Wheel key	Scroll up and down on a web page

Use the following tips when navigating the Web:

 Select on-screen items by using the navigation key to highlight the desired item, then press the desired softkey button (or press ).

You'll find that the left softkey **a** is used primarily for selecting items. This softkey is often labeled **OK** or **Go**.

- If the items on a page are numbered, you can use your keypad (number keys) to select an item.
- Select links by highlighting the link and then selecting the appropriate softkey.

Tip: The tenth item in a numbered list may be selected by pressing the **0** key on your phone's keypad, even though the number **0** doesn't appear on the screen.

• To go back one page, press S on your phone. (Note that C is also used like a BACKSPACE key to delete text.)

#### Using the Menu to Navigate

By pressing the Menu softkey, you can navigate between web pages. Press the **Menu** softkey and select one of the following options:

- 1. Home to return to the carrier's home page.
- 2. Forward one web page (if you have not returned from a previous web page, this option is greyed out).
- 3. Mark this page to create a Bookmark.
- 4. My Bookmarks to see your list of Bookmarks.
- 5. Search takes you to a search engine.
- 6. Send Page to embeds the current URL in a picture or video message that can be sent to others.
- 7. Go to Web Address to directly jump to a specific web page.
- 8. History to see a list of web pages you have browsed this session.
- 9. Page Info to see details of your current page.
- 10. Browser Options displays the following options:
  - Setting allows you to select settings for Font Setting, Privacy, and Preference.
  - Show URL to view the URL of your current webpage.
  - Reload This Page to reload your your current page.
  - Restart Browser to reload your Browser and return to your home page.
  - View Error Log shows any scripting errors that have occurred on the page.
  - Browser Info to view information about your Mobile Browser.

## Entertainment

The Entertainment menu allows you to listen, view, and download media content onto your phone. The content can be streamed to your phone from your network provider's server, which allows you to stay up to date, or from your memory card. After you access the **Entertainment** menu, you will see the following options:

- TV & Radio displays television and radio clips that are available on the network or your memory card.
- **Music** displays music files that are available for purchase and download.
- Memory Card displays all the media content that is saved on your memory card, if installed.

#### TV & Radio

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Entertainment** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight **TV & Radio** and press (). Please note that additional charges may apply for accessing this service.
- Once the application launches, navigate through the media content offered by your service provider using the navigation keys. Press to make your selections.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to purchase and play the desired media clip.

#### Music

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Entertainment** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight **Music** and press (). The Music Store is displayed.
- 3. Follow the onscreen instructions to download songs or other audio tracks. A service charge may apply.

### **Music Player**

#### To start the music player:

- Activate the main menu, highlight the Entertainment menu, and press O. The Music Store is displayed.
- 2. Highlight **Music** and press (). The Music Store is displayed.

3. Select a song track and press 🔿 to begin playing.

#### To exit the music player:

 Press I When the phone prompts you to confirm, highlight Exit and press .

### **Music Player Controls**

- Press 
   O to play or pause the current track.
- Press the right navigation key to skip to the next song in the current playlist.
- Press the left navigation key to skip to the previous song in the current playlist.
- Press the up or down navigation key to display all the tracks in the current playlist. Press up or down using the music player or navigation keys to move through the list and press to select a song.
- Use the side volume keys to adjust song volume.
- While the Media Player is running, you can press the right softkey for Menu to access one of the following options:
  - **Repeat Song** to repeat the current song.
  - Shuffle Order to randomize the current playlist.
  - Others Bought to view others bought.
  - More From Artist to view more from artist.
  - Go to Store to view and purchase new music.
  - Go to Player to return to the main player menu.
- While the Media Player is running, you can press the left softkey for **Pause** to pause the song.

### Memory Card

## **Connect to PC**

You must insert a memory card into the phone in order to connect the phone to a computer. The memory card is the destination for all file transfer.

#### To transfer files between your phone and your computer:

- 1. Connect your phone to the data cable.
- 2. Connect the data cable to your computer.
- Activate the main menu, highlight the Entertainment menu, and press O.
- 4. Highlight Memory Card and press ().

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 Select Connect to PC. The phone now appears as a removable disk on your computer.

Warning: Call is disabled when the device is connected as a mass storage device.

6. Using your computer's navigation systems, transfer your files between the computer and the phone.

**Warning**: Do not disconnect the phone from the data cable while transferring files! Please follow proper shutdown procedure for removable storage device to avoid file corruption.

- 7. When you are finished transferring files, select **Disconnect**.
- 8. It is now safe to remove the phone from the data cable.

#### **File Manager**

You can view and manage the files stored on your phone. Your phone can include any of the following folders that are used by different applications:

- DCIM stores your photos and videos.
- MEDIA is used for media and music files. If you transfer music files from your computer to your phone to be played by the music player application, you can place them here.

**Note**: There is no moving of files from one folder to another folder via the phone UI. If you need to move files, connect the phone to your computer via the data cable and use the **Connect to PC** application.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Entertainment** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Memory Card.
- 3. Select File Manager.
- 4. Using the navigation keys, highlight Phone or Memory Card and press ().
- 5. Navigate through your phone's menu tree to the desired file.

- To erase a file, highlight the file to be deleted, and press the right softkey a for **Options**, followed by **Delete**.
- If the file is viewable or playable on your phone, press 
   to view/ play. Not all files can be viewed or played.

#### **Format Memory Card**

Use this menu to format a memory card that has been inserted into the card slot. Your handset is capable of supporting memory cards with a maximum memory of 8 GB.

#### To format an inserted memory card:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Entertainment** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Memory Card.
- 3. Select Format Memory Card.
- 4. Enter your lock code.

Tip: If you can't recall your lock code, try using the last four digits of your Mobile Directory Number or try 1234. If none of these work, call Customer Service at 1-800-Samsung.

5. Press the left soft key for Format or press the right soft key for Cancel.

Note: Do not remove your memory card while it is being formatted.

### **Memory Info**

To view the amount of storage space used on your phone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Entertainment** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Memory Card.
- 3. Select Memory Info.

- 4. Using the navigation keys, highlight ALL, Phone or Card and press O.The amount of storage space used and available is displayed on-screen.
- 5. When you are finished, press the left softkey for **Done**.

# My Downloads

You can download the following types of items to your phone:

- Ringers allows you to download and assign ringer types to voice calls.
- Screen Savers allows you to download and assign screen savers to your phone.
- Games allows you to download and play games. You can also play preinstalled demo games.
- Applications allows you to download and run applications on your phone.

## Downloading

### To download items to your phone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **My Downloads** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringers, Screen Savers, Games, or Applications.
- 3. Highlight the **Get** option and press O. The browser will launch and take you to the specified download menu.
- Use your navigation key to highlight and select an item you wish to download. (For more information on navigating the Web, see "Navigating the Wireless Web" on page 34.)
- 5. Follow the web page instructions to complete your purchase.

**Note:** You may store a limited number of downloaded applications, ringers, screen savers, games, and themes on your phone, depending on the file sizes. When in the **My Downloads** menu, you can check the Memory Status by pressing the right softkey for **Options**, then highlighting **Memory Status** and pressing  $\bigcirc$ .

## Assigning Ringers and Screen Savers

### **Assigning Downloaded Ringers**

You may assign a ringer to more than one type of call.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **My Downloads** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight **Ringers** and press ().

If you wish to hear the ringer, highlight the desired ringer and press (). When you are finished, press C to return to the **Ringers** menu.

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- 3. Press the right softkey and select Set As....
- 4. Select Voice Calls.

Note: Ringers for Contacts, Messages, Alarms, and Schedules can also be set.

#### 5. Select With Caller ID or No Caller ID.

6. Press 📻 to exit.

Note: Downloaded ringers are also available through the Settings menu (see "To select Ringer Types for Voice Calls, Messages and Schedule:" on page 90).

#### **Assigning Downloaded Screen Savers**

You may assign a Screen Saver to more than one task.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **My Downloads** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight Screen Savers and press ().

If you wish to see the screen saver, highlight the desired screen saver and press (). When you are finished, press **G** to return to the **Screen Savers** menu.

- 3. Press the right softkey and select Set As....
- 4. Select Screen Saver.

Note: Screen Savers for Contacts and Incoming/Outgoing Calls can also be set.

5. Press 🔂 to exit.

**Note**: Downloaded Screen Savers are also available through the Settings menu (see "Screen" on page 86).

## Playing Games

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **My Downloads** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight Games and press ().

- 3. Select the game you wish to play and press ().
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to play the game. When you are finished, select Exit (or Quit) or press

## Launching Applications

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **My Downloads** menu, and press O.
- 2. Highlight Applications and press ().
- 3. Select the application you wish to launch and press O.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to launch the application. When you are finished, select **Exit** (or **Quit**) or press

**Note**: Your phone comes equipped with preloaded tools such as **Backup Manager**. To activate these services, please contact your service provider.

## Ringers Volume

#### To adjust the volume of the ringer and voice:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Volume.
- 4. Select Ringer, Voice, Headset, Speaker Phone, Text Message, Pic/ Video Message, or More....
  - For Ringer, press the navigation key up or down until the desired volume level is selected. Press to select or deselect Always Vibrate. Press () to save and exit.
  - For Voice, Headset, Speaker Phone, select a Level (1-8).
  - For Text Message and Pic/Video Message, use the navigation keys to select Use Ringer Volume or Adjust Volume. Press to select or deselect Always Vibrate. Press () to save and exit.
  - For More..., select Alarm, Applications, or Voice Mail.
    - For Alarm and Voice Mail, use the navigation keys to select Use Ringer Volume or Adjust Volume. Press to select or deselect Always Vibrate. Press () to save and exit.
    - For Applications, select Volume and use the navigation keys to select Use Ringer Volume or Adjust Volume. Press to save and exit. To enable game vibration, select Game Vibration, select On, and press .

#### Silence All

There may be times when you need to silence your phone entirely. The phone's Silence All option allows you to mute all sounds without turning your phone off.

 With the phone open, press and hold the down volume key in standby mode. (The screen will display "Silence All.") To deactivate Silence All, press the up volume key repeatedly to select a desired volume level.

## **Ringer Type**

You can assign ringer types to individual Contacts entries, types of calls, Schedule entries, and types of messages.

- **Ring Tones** include a variety of standard ringer types.
- Melodies include a variety of musical melodies.

- My Downloads include all the ringtones you have previously downloaded.
- My Video includes videos you have recorded and can be used for playback.

#### To select Ringer Types for Voice Calls, Messages and Schedule:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Ringer Type.
- 4. Select Voice Calls, Messages, or Schedule.
  - If you selected Voice Calls, select With Caller ID or No Caller ID. Use the navigation keys to select Ring Tones, Melodies, My Downloads, or My Video.
  - If you selected Messages, select Voicemail, Text Message or Pic/ Video Message. Use the navigation keys to select Ring Tones, Melodies, or My Downloads.
  - If you selected **Schedule**, use the navigation keys to select **Ring Tones**, **Melodies**, or **My Downloads**.
- 5. Use the navigation keys to select the desired Ringer.
- 6. Press 🔿 to save and exit.

### **Selecting Ringer Type for Roaming**

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Ringer Type.
- 4. Select Roaming.
- 5. Select Normal or Distinctive and press () to save and exit.

## Alerts

Your phone can alert you with an audible tone when you change service areas, once a minute during a voice call, when a call has been connected, and when turning your phone on and off. The different options available are:

- Minute Beep: An alert tone is sounded every minute that you are connected.
- Service Change: An alert tone is sounded when you come in or out of your coverage area.
- Call Connect: An alert tone is sounded when you are initially connected.

- Signal Fade/Call Drop: An alert tone is sounded when your phone partially loses signal due to network conditions or leaving network coverage area.
- Power On: An alert tone is sounded when powering on.
- Power Off: An alert tone is sounded when powering off.

#### To enable or disable alert sounds:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Alerts.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to select the desired alert.
- 5. Select **On** or **Off** using the navigation key and press  $\bigcirc$  to save and exit.

## **Key Tones**

You can select the audible tones accompanying a key press. There are three different tones available:

- Xylophone: Polyphonic 'xylophone' tones are heard when a key is pressed.
- DTMF: Normal, touch-tone beeps are heard when a button is pressed.
- Voice: The number or symbol of the key is heard when you press a key.

#### To select a key tone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Key Tones.
- 4. Select Tone Type.
- 5. Press the navigation key up or down to select the desired tone type.
- 6. Press 🔿 to save and exit.

You can change the tone volume and tone duration of a key press. Voicemail or other automated systems may require long or short time lengths to activate different features.

#### To select a tone volume:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Key Tones.

- 4. Select Tone Volume.
- 5. Select Key Tones Off or Level 1-8 and press () to save and exit.

#### To select a tone length:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Ringers** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Ringer Settings.
- 3. Select Key Tones.
- 4. Select Tone Length.
- 5. Select Short or Long and press () to save and exit.

# Messaging

After you access the Messaging menu, you will see the following options:

- Send Message allows you to send text, picture and video messages.
- Text Messages allows you to view text messages that you have received, sent, and saved.
- Pic/Video Message allows you to view Picture and Video messages that you have received, sent, and saved.
- Instant Messaging allows you to send instant messages.
- Email allows you to send email messages.
- Voicemail allows you to listen to any voice messages saved in the voice mail server.
- Settings allows you to configure the messaging options.

#### To send a text message:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Messaging menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Send Message.
- 3. Select Text Message.
- 4. Using the navigation keys highlight a contact and press  $\bigcirc$  or select one of the following options:
  - Go to Contacts: scroll through your Contacts list and press () to select a desired recipient.
  - Left soft key for **Multiple**: select a contact and press O. Repeat to add more contacts. Press the left soft key for **Continue** when finished.
  - Right soft key for **New Addr**: enter the recipient's phone number or email address and press ().
- Enter your message using the keypad. If you wish to change your text message options, press the right softkey for Options, press Text Mode, and then select one of the following:
  - **T9 (English)** changes the text entry mode to T9. For more information, see page 21.
  - Alpha changes the text entry mode to Alphabet. For more information, see page 22.

- Symbols changes the text entry mode to Symbol. For more information, see page 22.
- Number changes the text entry mode to Numbers.
- Emoticons allows you to add emoticons such as : ) to your message.
- Text Options allows you to access the following options:
  - Auto-Capital: When on, capitalizes the first word of a sentence.
  - Used Words: When on, adds the words used to the phone's dictionary.
  - Word Candidate: When on and you are in T9 Mode, displays possible word choices on the screen.
  - Prediction Start: Sets the number of letters required to activate the Display Candidate feature.
  - Dual Language: When on and you are in T9 Mode, displays choices from both the English and French dictionaries.
  - Auto-Space: When on, adds a space after you select a word in T9 Mode.
  - Auto Word Insertion: When on, shows the next word in T9 Mode.
- Press the left softkey to Send. If you wish to change your text message options, press the right softkey for Options and select one of the following:
  - Text Mode allows you to reenter the message.
  - Add Preset Message allows you to choose from a list of preset messages.
  - Add Signature allows you to add a signature.
  - Add/Change Recipients allows you to reenter the message recipients.
  - Mark as Urgent allows you to set the priority level as urgent.
  - Set Callback # allows you to enter or omit a call back number in your message.
  - Save as Draft stores a copy of the text message in your Drafts folder.

#### To reply to the text message:

1. While the message is open, select the left softkey for **Reply**.

- 2. Compose your reply, or use a pre-composed messages.
  - To type a message, use your keypad to enter text. Use the right softkey is to select a character input mode.
  - To use pre-written messages, press the right softkey for Options and select Add Preset Message. Press the corresponding number on the keypad to enter the preset message response.
- 3. Press the left softkey **to Send**.

#### To erase messages:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Text Message.
- 3. Highlight a message.
- 4. Press the right softkey a for **Options** followed by:
  - Delete. Using the navigation keys select Yes or No, and press 🔘.
  - Delete All. Using the navigation keys select Unlocked messages or All messages, and press ().

## Pic/Video Messages

Your phone lets you take pictures, view them using the phone's display, and instantly send them to your friends and family.

Sending Picture/Video Messages from your Phone

- 1. Press (), highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Send Message.
- 3. Using the navigation keys, select **Pic/Video Message** and press O.

**Note:** If you have not registered and configured this feature, you will be prompted to do so. Follow the instructions on screen, then continue with this procedure.

- 4. Using the navigation keys highlight a contact and press  $\bigcirc$  or select one of the following options:
  - Go to Contacts: scroll through your Contacts list and press () to select a desired recipient.
  - Left soft key for Multiple: select a contact and press . Repeat to add more contacts. Press the left soft key for Continue when finished.

- Right soft key for New Addr: enter the recipient's phone number or email address and press .
- 5. Using the navigation keys select:
  - In Phone, Memory Card or Online Albums to send a picture that is already saved. Use the navigation keys to highlight a picture and press 

     .

A checkmark appears beside the picture. You can select more than one picture. Once you have finished selecting all the pictures you wish to send press the left softkey for **Next**.

- Select Take New Picture to take a new picture prior to sending your message. For more information on taking a picture, see "To take a picture:" on page 63.
- Select Take New Video to take a new video prior to sending your message.
- Select Text Only to make your message text only. Although this message is text only, it is not sent as a simple text message (SMS), and the receiver will receive the message differently depending on his or her phone's capability.
- When you have finished entering all the desired destinations, press the left softkey for Next.
  - If you wish to add a subject to your picture message, highlight Subj: and press the right softkey for Add. Enter your text and press the left softkey for Next.
  - If you wish to add text to your picture message, highlight Text: and press the right softkey for Add. Enter your text and press the left softkey for Next.
  - If you wish to add an audio clip, highlight Audio: and press the right softkey for Record. From the Add Voice Memo screen, press the left softkey for Record to record your message. When finished, press the left softkey for Done.
  - Press the left softkey for Send.

## Instant Messaging

Your phone is capable of engaging in online chat sessions.

#### To access Instant Messaging:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Messaging menu, and press 🔘.
- 2. Select Instant Messaging.
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3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

## E-Mail

Your phone is capable of accessing online e-mails using the preloaded My Email application.

#### To access the online e-mail service:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Email.
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions.

### Voicemail

All unanswered calls to your phone are automatically transferred to your Voicemail, even if your phone is in use or turned off. However, you are only notified of new messages when your phone is turned on and you are in a Service Area.

#### To set up your Voicemail:

- 1. Press and hold 1 on your phone's keypad.
- Follow the system prompts to create your passcode, record your greeting, and record your name announcement.

#### To call your Voicemail:

Press and hold 1 on your phone's keypad.

#### To display your Missed Calls:

 Press (), highlight the **Calls** menu, and press (). The missed calls are indicated with an "X".

Important: When you are roaming off the network, you may not receive notification of new Voicemail messages. It is recommended that you periodically check your Voicemail by dialing 1 + area code + your Phone Number. When your Voicemail answers, press the reference key and enter your passcode. You will be charged roaming rates when accessing Voicemail while roaming off the network.

#### **Retrieving Your Voicemail Messages**

You can review your messages directly from your phone or from any other touchtone phone. To dial from your phone, you can either speed dial your Voicemail or use the menu keys.

#### Using One-Touch Message Access

Press and hold 1 on your phone's keypad. Follow the system prompts.

#### Using the Menu Keys on Your Phone to Access Your Messages

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voicemail.
- 3. Select Call Voicemail to call the Voicemail server.

#### Clearing the Message Icon

Your phone may temporarily continue to display the message icon after you have checked your voice and text messages.

#### To clear the icon from the display screen:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press 🔘.
- 2. Select Voicemail.
- 3. Select Clear Envelope.
- 4. Press the navigation key up to select **Yes** and press ().

#### Voicemail #

This menu allows you to change your voice mail number.

#### To change your voice mail number:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Voicemail.
- 3. Select Voicemail #.
- 4. Use the navigation key to highlight **Other** and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 5. Enter the new voice mail # and press the left softkey **=** for **Done**.

#### To change your voice mail back to the default voice mail:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select Voicemail #.
- 2. Use the navigation key to highlight the default number and press  $\bigcirc$ .

## Settings

There are several options associated with voice mail, text and pic/video messaging. The Settings menu allows you to customize the options to fit your preferences.

#### To access the Settings menu:

1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Messaging** menu, and press ().

#### 2. Select Settings.

#### General

General settings affect voice mail, text and picture/video messages.

- Notification: Allows you to configure whether new messages will appear with a pop-up message or with an icon.
- Quick Messages: Allows you to edit, delete or add pre-written messages.
- Message Alert: Allows you to configure the Volume, Type, and Reminder settings for Message Alerts.
- Auto-Erase: Sets the phone to automatically delete old messages from the mail boxes when they become full. This allows new messages to be added to a full mail box without having to manually delete old messages to free up space first.

#### Notification

#### To change the display pop-up option:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Notification.
- 3. Select Message & Icon or Icon only using the navigation key and press O to select.

#### Quick Messages

A quick message can be selected and automatically entered into the message.

#### To edit a quick message:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Quick Messages.
- 3. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the desired message or available entry and press  $\bigcirc$  to edit.
- 4. Press and hold **G** to erase the message. Enter your new message or edit the existing one and press  $\bigcirc$  to save.

#### To delete a preset message:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Quick Messages.
- 3. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the desired message.
- 4. Press the right softkey **a** for **Options**.

- 5. Select Delete.
- 6. Select Yes.

#### To add a preset message:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Quick Messages.
- 3. Press the right softkey 🚍 for Options.
- 4. Select Add New.
- 5. Enter your message using the keypad.
- 6. Press the left softkey for **Done** when finished to add your message to the list.

**Note**: When you send a message using Quick Messages, the last message selected automatically displays as the first choice when sending a new message.

#### **Message Alert**

The Message Alert menu allows you to configure the volume and message reminder default settings for your messages.

#### To set the volume:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Message Alert.
- 3. Select Volume.
- 4. Select one of the following options:
  - Voicemail
  - Text Message
  - Pic/Video Message
- Use the navigation keys to select the desired volume level and press 
  to save.

### To set the ringer type:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Message Alert.
- 3. Select Ringer Type.
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- 4. Select one of the following options:
  - Voicemail
  - Text Message
  - Pic/Video Message
- Press the navigation key left or right to select between Ring Tones, Melodies, or My Downloads and press O.
- Press the navigation key down to preview the first ringer. Press left or right to preview the other ringers associated with the ringer group selected. When finished, press 
  to save the desired ringer.

#### To set the message reminder option:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Message Alert.
- 3. Select Reminder.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to select the desired duration and press  $\bigcirc$  to select.

#### Auto-Erase

This option allows you to automatically delete old messages when the memory becomes full. This prevents new messages from being rejected due to the Inbox being full.

#### To turn this option On or Off:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select General.
- 2. Select Auto-Erase.
- Press the navigation key up or down to select Yes or No and press to select.

#### Text Message

Text Message settings only affect text messages.

- Save In Outbox allows you to save a copy of the outgoing text message in the outbox.
- Priority allows you to configure the default Priority level for your text message.
- Call Back # allows you to change the default call back number for your text message.

 Edit Signature allows you to create a signature of up to 15 characters that is automatically appended to all your text messages.

#### To turn the Save in Outbox option On or Off:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select **Text Message**.
- 2. Select Save in Outbox.
- 3. Press the navigation key up or down to select **Yes** or **No** and press to select.

#### To select the priority level:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select **Text Message**.
- 2. Select Priority.
- 3. Select Normal or Urgent using the navigation key and press 🔿 to select.

#### To change the call back number:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select **Text Message**.
- 2. Select Call Back #.
- 3. Use the navigation key to highlight **None**, your mobile directory number, or **Other** for a different phone number and press ().
- 4. For the Other call back #, enter the number using the keypad and press  $\bigcirc$  to save.

#### To edit your signature, or to turn signatures on or off:

- 1. In the Settings menu, select **Text Message**.
- 2. Select Edit Signature.
- 3. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight **On** or **Off** and press O.
- 4. If signatures are on, your current signature is now displayed. Press and hold to erase the signature. Enter your new signature or edit the existing one using the keypad and press the left softkey or to save.

### Alerts Setup

This menu allows you to set your phone to automatically connect to the Internet to receive Web Alerts.

1. In the Settings menu, select Alerts Setup.

2. Press the navigation key up or down to select **On** or **Off** and press  $\bigcirc$  to select.

# Calls

Your phone will display calls you have missed. You can also access your list of recent calls from the idle screen by pressing the the key.

#### Calls Options

When in a Recent History menu (call history in threaded structure), press the right softkey **a** for **Options** to select one of the following options for a call:

- New Group to create a new Group.
- Save to create a new Contact for this phone number. (Appears only if this number is not already stored as a Contact.)
- Contact Details: displays Contact information. (Appears only if this number is already stored as a Contact.)
- Delete to erase this number from your call history.
- Delete All to erase all entries.

**Note:** The available options depend on whether or not the phone number has been saved.

**Note**: To view additional information about a phone number's conversation history highlight the call and press  $\bigcirc$ . Highlight an entry and press  $\bigcirc$  to display the time and date of the call.

#### Making a Call From the Calls Menu

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Calls** menu, and press 🔘.
- 2. Highlight the entry you want to call and press entry to dial the number.

## Contacts Finding Contacts

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Contacts** menu, press O.
- 2. Select Contacts.
- 3. Scroll down through your list of contacts to highlight the name and press to make the call.

## Adding a New Contact

Your phone can store up to 600 phone numbers. Each contact entry can store up to a total of seven phone numbers, three email addresses, one URL, one memo, and each entry's name can contain up to 64 characters.

- 1. Enter a new phone number and press the right softkey 🗖 for **Options**.
- 2. Press Save and select New Entry.
- 3. Select the Number Type using the navigation keys (Mobile, Home, Work, Pager, Fax, or Others) and press ().
- 4. Enter the name using the keypad and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 5. Press the left softkey for **Done**.

## **Editing an Existing Contact**

#### To add a number to an existing entry:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Contacts** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Contacts.
- 3. Select the desired entry and press ().
- 4. Press the right softkey a for **Options**.
- 5. Select Edit Contact.
- 6. Scroll down to the Add Number box. Enter the phone number using the keypad and press ().
- 7. Select a label (Mobile, Home, etc.) for this number and press O.
- 8. When you are finished, press the left softkey a for **Done**.

#### To edit an entry's phone number:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Contacts** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Contacts.
- 3. Select the desired entry and press 🔘.

- 4. Press the right softkey a for **Options**.
- 5. Select Edit Contact.
- 6. Select the phone number (Home, Work, etc.) to be edited.
- 7. Press and hold C to erase the entire number or press once to erase just the last digit.
- 8. Enter the phone number and press ().
- 9. Select the Number Type using the navigation keys (Mobile, Home, Work, Pager, Fax, or Others) and press ().
- 10. Press the left softkey **—** for **Done**.

#### To select a ringer type for an entry:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Contacts** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Contacts.
- 3. Select the desired entry and press 🔘.
- 4. Press the right softkey a for **Options**.
- 5. Select Edit Contact.
- 6. Press the navigation key down until **Ring** is selected and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 7. Press the navigation key up or down and highlight the desired Ringer Category and press O.
- 8. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight and listen to the desired Ringer and press  $\bigcirc$  to save.
- 9. Press the left softkey for Done.

## Backup<sup>1</sup>

This function allows you to launch the browser, where you can download applications to your phone, as well as back up your address book, allowing you to safeguard and migrate your contacts list. You can also launch the browser from the My Downloads menu. See "My Downloads" on page 41 for more information.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Contacts** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- Select **Backup**. The browser will launch and take you to the download menu.

1. The Backup sub-menu may not be available depending on the UI version configured for your phone.

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# **Missed Alerts**

The Missed Alerts menu serves as a centralized location so you don't have to go through different menus to check for missed calls, unheard voice mail or unread messages, etc. This menu is only a reminder. The actual information is still saved in the various locations even when the missed alert has been viewed.

The Missed Alerts screen appears when you have unviewed Missed Alerts. You can also view your alerts by going to the Missed Alerts menu.

#### To view your Missed Alerts:

• Activate the main menu, highlight the Missed Alerts menu, and press 🔘.

#### **Missed Alerts options**

Using the navigation keys, highlight the desired alert and select one of the following:

- To view more details about the alert, press (). Viewing the alert will delete it from the Missed Alerts list.
- If the alert is a call, press the left softkey at to Call the person back.
- If the alert is a voicemail message, press the left softkey to Listen to the message. Follow the normal procedure you use to access the voice mail server.
- If the alert is a text or picture or video message, press the left softkey to View the message.
- To delete an alert without viewing it, press the right softkey for Dismiss.

## Camera

You can activate the camera and take pictures when the phone is open. In addition to taking pictures, you can also record, view, and send videos to your friends and family with your phone's built-in video camera.

#### To take a picture:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Camera.

**Shortcut**: To activate Camera mode, you can also press and hold the side camera button (see illustration on page 1).

- 3. Using the phone's front LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject.
  - To zoom in or out, press the left and right navigation keys. The levels of zooming available depends on the resolution selected.
  - To adjust the brightness, press the up and down navigation keys.
- Press either the left softkey for Capture, O or the side camera button until the shutter sounds. (Make sure the camera is steady.)

The picture taken appears on-screen and is saved in your default file location. For more information, see "Status Bar" on page 71.

#### To record a video:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Camcorder.
- 3. Select either:
  - Video Mail to take a short video up to 30 seconds that is suitable for transfer via Pic/Video messaging.
  - Long Video to take a longer video. Videos over 512 KB cannot be sent via messaging. The length of the video depends on how much free memory remains in your handset.
- Using the phone's main LCD as a viewfinder, aim the camera lens at your subject. To zoom in or out, press the right and left navigation keys.
- 5. Press the left softkey 🚍 for **Record**. Make sure the camera is steady.

6. When you are finished recording, press the left softkey again for **Done**.

## Camera and Camcorder Options

Once you have captured the picture or video, you can press the right softkey for **Options (Next** if you are in Camcorder mode) and select one of the following options:

- Send Pic/Video to send your picture to someone using Pic/Video Msg. For more information. See "Send Pic/Video" on page 68.
- Play to view your video (Camcorder Mode).
- Camera Mode to take another picture (Camera Mode).
- Upload to upload the picture/video to your online folder. See "Creating an Online Album" on page 67.
- Assign to assign the picture/video to a Picture ID, Screen Saver, Incoming/ Outgoing Calls, Video Ringer, or Voice Calls. See "Display" on page 86.
- Erase to erase this picture/video.
- Camcorder to take another video (Camcorder mode).
- Review Album to review the pictures/videos stored in your camera.
- To exit Camera or Camcorder Mode, press 5.

## Camera Settings

The settings associated with the full-color digital camera allow you to customize how the camera operates when taking pictures.

### To set a camera option:

- 1. Start the camera. For more information, see "To take a picture:" on page 63.
- 2. Press the right softkey 🚍 for **Options**.
- 3. Press the number key corresponding to the desired option.
  - Selftimer allows you to configure a timer to be Off, 5 sec or 10 sec.
  - Multi Shot: allows you to select either Series Shot or Divided Shot.
  - Fun Tools allows you to select either Fun Frames or Color Tones.
  - Controls allows you to set the Brightness, White Balance,Night Shot, and Metering for your pictures.
  - Settings allows you to change the following camera settings:

Resolution allows you to change the resolution of images. Images taken at a higher resolution require more memory to save. The available sizes are 2M, 1.3M, High, Med, or Low.

**Tip**: While in Capture mode, the zoom feature is available using the navigation keys. As the resolution increases, zooming capability is reduced. At the highest resolution, the zoom feature is not available.

- Quality allows you to select between Fine, Normal, and Economy. These settings reflect the image quality settings for the pictures.
- Shutter Sound allows you to select between different shutter sounds. The shutter sound is heard when you take a picture.
- Status Bar allows you to switch the Status Bar On or Off.
- Storage allows you to switch the saved file location between Phone or Card.
- Launch: allows you to select the following:
  - Review Pictures allows you to review pictures currently stored in your camera's internal or external memory.
  - Camcorder switches the phone to Camcorder mode. For more information, see "To record a video:" on page 63.

#### **Setting the Self-timer**

#### To activate the Self-timer and get yourself in the picture:

- With the phone open and in Camera mode, press the right softkey for Options.
- 2. Select Selftimer.
- 3. Using the navigation key, highlight the length of delay you want the timer to use (5 or 10 seconds) and press O.
- Press the left softkey for Capture. (A timer is displayed in the upper right portion of the main LCD during the Self Timer countdown)
- 5. Prepare for the picture. At 3 seconds, the timer icon turns red.

#### To cancel the Self-timer after it has started:

Press ⊂.

## **Camcorder Options**

The settings associated with the full-color digital camcorder allow you to customize how the camcorder operates when taking videos.

#### To set a camcorder option:

- Start the camera. For more information, see "To record a video." on page 63.
- 2. Press the right softkey 🗖 for Options.
- 3. Press the number key corresponding to the desired option.
  - Selftimer allows you to configure a timer to be Off, 5 sec, or 10 sec.
  - Fun Tools allows you to select Color Tones to select between several different color tones by pressing the navigation key left or right. When you find the desired tone, press O.
  - Controls allows you to select White Balance to set the white balance of the camcorder automatically or manually using the different preset modes. The modes available are Auto, Sunny, Cloudy, Tungsten, Fluorescent, Manual.
  - Settings allows you to change the following camcorder settings:
    - Quality allows you to select between Fine, Normal, and Economy. These settings reflect the image quality settings for the videos.
    - Storage allows you to change the saved file location between Phone and Card.
    - Video Length: allows you to select Video mail or Long video.
  - Launch allows you to select the following:
    - Review Videos allows you to review videos currently stored in your phone's memory.
    - Camera switches the phone to Camera Mode. For more information, see "Camera" on page 63.

## My Albums

Your media can be stored in the phone, on your memory card, or in an Online Album.

## To view media stored in an Album:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select My Albums.
- 3. Select either In Phone, Memory Card or Online Albums and press

- 4. Use the navigation keys to scroll though your media. The media type is indicated by either a camera or a camcorder icon in the top right corner.

  - To view the currently-highlighted picture or video, press the left softkey for Expand.
  - To access the video or picture options, press the right softkey for **Options**.

## My Albums Options

Some of the options described below are available only for videos or still pictures:

- Play (video only) the current video.
- Send the picture or video to another user using Pic/Video Msg.
- Upload the picture or video to an online album.
- PicBridge Print (picture only) to print selected pictures.
- Assign to assign the current picture as a Picture ID, Screen Saver, Incoming/Outgoing Calls, Video Ringer, or Voice Calls.
- Erase to erase the selected pictures and videos.
- Copy/Move to copy or move the files to the memory card.
- Detail/Edit to attach a text message or view the media information associated with the picture or video.
- Album list to display the list of albums saved in your phone.
- Media Filter to filter just pictures, just videos or to display all media types.
- Camera Mode (picture only) switches back to the camera.
- Camcorder (video only) switches back to the camcorder.

## Creating an Online Album

The first time you access Online Albums you will need to establish a Picture Messaging password. This password will also allow you to log in to the Picture Messaging Web site. Please contact your service provider for the web site details to access and manage your uploaded pictures and albums.

## To create your Picture Messaging password:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select My Albums.
- 3. Select Online Albums and press 🔘.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions.
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Once you have received confirmation that your account has been successfully registered, you may upload and share pictures and access the Picture Messaging Web site.

#### To access the Picture Messaging Web site:

- 1. From your computer's web browser, go to the Picture messaging web site provided by your service provider.
- 2. Enter your Phone Number and Picture Messaging password to log in.

## Send Pic/Video

#### To send Pic/Video messages from your phone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Pic/Video Message.
- 3. Press the left softkey for **Compose**.

**Note**: If you have not registered and configured this feature, you will be prompted to do so. Follow the instructions on screen, then continue with this procedure.

- 4. Using the navigation keys, select either the **Contacts**, **Mobile #**, or **Email** box and press ().
  - if you selected Contacts, scroll through your Contacts list and press 
     to check/uncheck desired recipients. When you are finished, press the left softkey 
     for Done.
  - if you selected **Mobile #** or **Email**, enter the recipient's phone number or email address and press ().

**Tip**: The recipients of the message appear in the lower half of the screen. If you wish to send your text message to multiple numbers or addresses, repeat step 4. You can send a text message to a maximum of 10 numbers.

- 5. Press the left softkey for Next.
- 6. Using the navigation keys select:
  - In Phone, Memory Card or Online Albums to send a picture or video that is already saved. Use the navigation keys to highlight an item and press ().

A checkmark appears beside the picture or video. You can select

more than one. Once you have finished selecting all the pictures or videos you wish to send press the left softkey for **Next**.

- Select Take New Picture to take a new picture prior to sending your message. For more information on taking a picture, see "To take a picture:" on page 63.
- Select Take New Video to take a new video prior to sending your message.
- Select Text Only to make your message text only. Although this message is text only, it is not sent as a simple text message (SMS), and the receiver will receive the message differently depending on his or her phone's capability.
- When you have finished entering all the desired destinations, press the left softkey for Next.
  - If you wish to add a subject or text to your picture message, highlight Subj: or Text: and press the right softkey for Add. Enter your text and press the left softkey for Next.
  - If you wish to add an audio clip, highlight Audio: and press the right softkey for Record. From the Add Voice Memo screen, press the left softkey for Record to record your message. When finished, press the left softkey for Done.
- 8. Press the left softkey for Send.

## Print

A USB data cable must be connected between the printer and the phone before any printing can occur.

#### To print pictures from your phone:

- 1. Insert one end of the data cable into the USB slot on the printer.
- 2. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Camera** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 3. Select Print.
- 4. Insert the data cable into your phone.
- 5. Read the onscreen "Please connect printer first" message and press the left softkey for Next.
- 6. Highlight the desired image and press the left softkey for Next. (To select multiple images, press ) to place a check mark next to each image selected.)

- 7. Highlight **Copies** and press the navigation key left or right to select the desired number of copies to print.
- 8. Press the navigation key down to select **Size**. Press the navigation key left or right to select one of the following sizes:
  - 4x6Default

Note: These sizes may vary and are dependent on the printer's capabilities.

- Press the navigation key up to select Type. Press the navigation key left or right to select one of the following:
  - Standard prints the standard image.
  - Index prints the index information.

Note: These options may vary and are dependent on the printer's capabilities.

- 10. Press the navigation key down to select **Border**. Press the navigation key left or right to select **on** or **off**.
- 11. Press the navigation key up to select **Date Print**. Press the navigation key left or right to select **on** or **off**.
- Press the right softkey to Preview the image or press the left softkey to Print the image.
- 13. Select **Yes** to confirm printing and press ().

## Settings and Info

## Auto Save To

You can change the default saved file location for your pictures and videos. Select **Phone** or **Memory Card** and press  $\bigcirc$ .

**Note**: Even when this setting is set to **Memory Card**, photos and videos will be saved to the phone if the memory card is not in the phone. The File Manager can be used to move the media files to the memory card later.

## **Status Bar**

You can set whether the status bar icons are displayed onscreen while taking pictures or recording videos. Select **On** or **Off** and press  $\bigcirc$ .

## Account Info

The Account Info screen allows you to check the details of your online album(s), such as your account number, the number of pictures you have loaded, and comments. Contact your service provider for more details.

# Tools

After you access **Tools** menu, you will see the following options:

- GPS Nav allows you to launch the GPS Navigation system application on your phone.
- Alarm Clock allows you to set multiple alarm times on your phone.
- Calendar helps organize your time and reminds you of important events.
- Calculator allows you to use your phone's built-in calculator.
- **Tip Calculator** allows you to use your phone's built-in tip calculator.
- Bluetooth allows you to connect wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices.
- World Clock displays the time in different time zones around the world together with one or more major cities, states, regions, or countries in a time zone.
- Memo Pad allows you to compose and store reminders and notes to help keep you organized.
- Voice Memo allows you to record brief memos to remind you of important events, phone numbers, or other items.
- Voice Service allows you to use Voice recognition to perform common functions supported by your phone
- Update Phone allows you to download and update the software in your phone automatically. Only the internal software is updated; no contact entries or other information saved to your phone will be deleted.

## **GPS** Nav

## To use GPS Nav:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- Select GPS Nav. This launches the Telenav GPS Navigator application, where you can enter your origin and destination and then receive voice and onscreen directions.<sup>1</sup>

## Alarm Clock

#### To use the alarm clock:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Alarm Clock.
- 3. Select Alarm #1, Alarm #2, or Alarm #3.

1.The GPS Nav sub-menu may not be available depending on the UI version configured for your phone.

- 5. Press the navigation key down once and enter the alarm time.
- 6. Press the navigation key down once to select the desired ringer. (Cycle through the ringers by pressing the navigation key left or right.)

- Press the navigation key down once to select Snooze Interval. Press the navigation key left or right and select the desired interval.
- 10. Press the left softkey 🗖 for Done.

## Calendar

There are four options available in the Calendar:

- Today shows events that are scheduled for today. You can create new events for later in the day.
- Scheduler shows a monthly calendar, highlighting days with scheduled events. You can create new events for future dates.
- Task List shows a to-do list, with optional priority settings and due dates.
- Countdown allows you to enter a future date and time into the phone and then see the amount of days, hours, and minutes until that time is reached.

- 7. When you are finished with the event details, press the left softkey for **Done**.

#### Scheduler

#### To add an event for a specific calendar date:

- 2. Select Calendar and then select Scheduler.
- 3. Using the navigation keys, scroll to the desired date.
- 4. Press the left softkey for View.

(When the scheduled event occurs, this entry will be displayed onscreen, making the person convenient to contact.)
- When you are finished with the event details, press the left softkey for Done.

#### Task List

#### To add a task:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Calendar.
- 3. Select Task List.
  - If you have no events currently scheduled for today, then the **New Task** menu is automatically displayed.

- If you have one or more events scheduled for today, they are displayed. Press the left softkey for Add New.
- Enter the task description using the keypad and press the left softkey
   for Next.
- 5. Press the navigation keys left or right to select a Low or High priority.
- Enter the Due Time and Date using the keypad. (Press the right softkey to toggle between AM and PM.)
- 7. Press the left softkey for **Done**.

#### To view a task:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Calendar.
- 3. Select Task List.

## Countdown

#### To set up a new countdown:

- 2. Select Calendar.
- 3. Select Countdown.
  - If there are no existing countdowns, the New Countdown screen is automatically displayed.
  - If you have one or more composed memos, they are displayed. Press the left softkey for Add New.
- 4. Enter a name using the keypad and press ().
- 5. Enter the time and date values and press the left softkey **—** for **Done**.

#### To view a countdown:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Calendar.
- 3. Select Countdown.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to highlight the desired countdown and press 🔿 to view.

**Tip**: When viewing an existing countdown, press the navigation key left or right to cycle between the other countdown entries.

#### **Viewing Events**

#### To view your scheduled events:

## Calculator

## To use the calculator:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Calculator.
- 3. Enter a number with the keypad. (Use Kom to insert a decimal point and/or store to make the number negative or positive.)
- 4. Use your navigation key to select a mathematical function:
  - Left to Subtract
  - Right to Add
  - Up to Multiply
  - Down to Divide
- 5. Enter the next number using the keypad. Repeat steps 4 and 5 as necessary.
- 6. Press 🔿 to view the results.

## **Tip Calculator**

The tip calculator calculates the tip on a meal or service and splits the bill between the number of people paying.

#### To use the tip calculator:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Tip Calculator.
- 3. Using the numeric keypad and Keyna (to enter the decimal point), enter the total amount of the bill in Bill.
- 4. If you want a percentage other than the default 15%, choose Tip (%) and enter the new value.

- 5. If more than one person is paying, choose **# paying** and enter the number.
- 6. The total amount of the tip is shown in **Tip (\$)** and the amount each person pays in **You pay**.

## World Clock

#### To access the World Clock:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select World Clock.
- 3. Press the navigation key left, right, up, or down to display the different time zones.
- 4. Press the left softkey for Set DST to turn Daylight Savings Time (DST) On or Off. The DST setting is intended to show the time if DST is on or off. It is not intended to show if DST is in use for a particular region/country/city.

## Memo Pad

#### To compose a memo:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Memo Pad.
- 3. Press the left softkey for Add New.
- 4. Enter up to 512 characters in the memo using the keypad and press the left softkey for Done.

#### To view a memo:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Memo Pad.
- 3. Use the navigation keys to scroll to the desired memo and press () to view the memo details.

#### To delete saved memos:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Memo Pad.

- 3. Highlight the memo you wish to delete using the navigation keys.
- 4. Press the right softkey **—** for **Options**.
- Select Delete to erase the highlighted memo or Delete All to erase all memos.
- 6. Highlight **Yes** with the navigation key and press  $\bigcirc$  to confirm.

#### To send a saved memo:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Memo Pad.
- 3. Highlight the memo you wish to send using the navigation keys.
- 4. Press the right softkey a for **Options**.
- 5. Select **Send Msg**. For more information on sending messages, see 'Messaging' on page 48.

## Voice Memo

A total of 10 minutes in 10 separate memos can be recorded and saved. Individual memos can record up to 60 seconds of audio.

**Recording Voice Memos** 

#### To record a voice memo:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- 3. Select **Record**. (The phone prompts you to start recording after the beep.)
- 4. Wait for the beep and then start speaking.

Press the left softkey **to Pause** the memo. (When a memo is paused, press the left softkey **a** again to **Resume** recording.)

5. To finish recording, press  $\bigcirc$  or the right softkey  $\blacksquare$  for **Finish**.

#### To record a conversation during a phone call:

- 1. During a call, press the right softkey a for **Options**.
- 2. Select Voice Memo.

Press the left softkey **to Pause** the memo. (When a memo is paused, press the left softkey **a** again to **Resume** recording.)

3. Press the right softkey for **Finish** to end the recording prior to the countdown completion.

**Note**: When recording a conversation during a call, only the other speaker's audio is recorded.

#### **Reviewing and Erasing Memos**

#### To play the voice memos you have recorded:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- Select Review. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- 4. Select a memo and press O.

— or —

Press the number corresponding to the memo you want to review. (The phone replays the memo.)

Press the left softkey **to Pause** the memo. (When a memo is paused, press the left softkey **a** again to **Resume** playing.)

#### To erase an individual memo:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- 3. Select **Review**. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- 4. Highlight the memo to erase.
- 5. Press the right softkey 🚍 for **Options** and select **Erase**.
- 6. Press the navigation key up to select **Yes** and press ().

#### To erase all voice memos:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- 3. Select Erase All.
- 4. Press the navigation key up to select **Yes** and press  $\bigcirc$ .

### **Editing Voice Memo Captions**

#### To edit a voice memo caption:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- Select Review. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- 4. Highlight the desired memo.
- 5. Press the right softkey **m** for **Options** and select **Edit Caption**.
- 6. Edit the caption and press the left softkey for **Done** when finished.

### Viewing Voice Memo Information

#### To view voice memo information:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Voice Memo.
- 3. Select **Review**. (The phone displays a list of saved memos, with the first one selected.)
- 4. Highlight the desired memo.
- 5. Press the right softkey and select Info.
- View the information (Title, Length, Recorded at) of the voice memo. Press the left softkey for Done when finished.

## **Update Phone**

The Update Phone screen allows you to update your phone firmware.

#### To access the Update Phone setting:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Update Phone.
- 3. Select Update Firmware.
- 4. Follow the on-screen instructions to update your phone.

# Bluetooth

Bluetooth is a short-range communications technology that allows you to connect wirelessly to a number of Bluetooth devices, such as mono or stereo headsets, hands-free car kits, and Bluetooth-enabled handhelds, PCs, printers, and wireless phones. The Bluetooth communication range is usually up to approximately 10 meters (30 feet).

**Note**: There are many Bluetooth devices in the market whose compatibility with the SCH-r561 cannot be guaranteed.

## Enable

By default, your device's Bluetooth functionality is turned off.

#### To turn Bluetooth on or off:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select Enable.
- 4. Select **On** or **Off** and press  $\bigcirc$ .

## **Bluetooth Status Indicators**

The following icons show your Bluetooth connection status at a glance:

- Bluetooth is active and visible.
- Bluetooth is connected to a device.
- Bluetooth is active and hidden.

## Visibility

The Visibility setting allows you to manage your availability to other Bluetooth devices.

#### To configure your phone's visibility (discoverability) to other Bluetooth devices:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select Visibility.
- 4. Select your desired Visibility setting and press ():
  - Always visible allows other Bluetooth devices to detect and identify your phone.

- Visible for 3min allows other devices three minutes before changing your status to hidden.
- Hidden prevents other Bluetooth devices from detecting and identifying your phone.

## **Device Name**

Your phone's Bluetooth name will appear to other in-range Bluetooth devices, depending on your Visibility settings.

### To change your Bluetooth name for your phone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select My Device Name.
- 4. Press and hold **C** to clear the current name.
- 5. Use your keypad to enter a new name and press  $\bigcirc$  to save and exit.

**Tip**: Give your handset an easily recognized name so other people can select your handset quickly in environments where multiple Bluetooth devices are visible.

## **Device Info**

#### To view the device information for your phone:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press ().
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select My Device Info.

## Pairing Bluetooth Devices

## Paired Devices

The Bluetooth pairing process allows you to establish trusted connections between your phone and another Bluetooth device. When devices are paired, a passkey is shared between devices, allowing for fast, secure connections while bypassing the discovery and authentication process.

## To pair your phone with another Bluetooth device:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select Trusted Devices.

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- 4. If no devices are currently listed, press the left softkey for Add New.
- Select Search and press O. Your phone displays a list of discovered in-range Bluetooth devices.
- Select the device you wish to pair with and press the left softkey for Add to list.
- 7. Enter the passkey and press ().
- The name of the Bluetooth device is displayed. Press the left softkey for Done. Pairing between the devices is complete at this point.

### Waiting for Pairing

If you are going to be using a Dial-Up Network (DUN) profile to pair with a PC or PDA, you will want to allow the other device to initiate pairing with your phone.

#### To allow your phone to be paired with another Bluetooth device:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Tools** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Bluetooth.
- 3. Select Trusted Devices.
- If no devices are currently listed, press the left softkey for Add New.
- 5. Select Wait for request and press ().
- 6. Enter the passkey and press ().
- 7. On the other device, initiate the search process. Follow the prompt and enter any relevant information to complete the pairing.

## Options

After a device is added to your list of Trusted Devices, press the right softkey to select from the following options (the list may change depending on the device type):

- Add New adds another device to your Trusted Devices list.
- Edit name shows the name given to your phone for Bluetooth® purposes. You can edit the name if needed.
- Erase allows you to delete the highlighted trusted device.
- Erase all allows you to delete all the trusted devices.
- Auto-accept allows you to accept requests from the trusted device without being prompted for confirmation.

• Info allows you to view information about the highlighted trusted device.

# Settings Display

#### Screen

You can set what image appears on the display screen when in standby mode and for incoming/outgoing calls.

#### To change the screen saver:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Screen.
- 4. Select Screen Saver.
- 5. Press the navigation keys up or down to select **Preset Image**, **My Downloads** or **My Albums**. Press ().
- 6. Use the navigations keys to select the desired image.
- 7. Press () to save and exit.

#### To change the screen for incoming/outgoing calls:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Screen.
- 4. Select Incoming/Outgoing Calls.
- Press the navigation keys up or down to select Preset Animation, My Downloads or My Albums. Press 
   .
- 6. Use the navigations keys to select the desired animation.
- 7. Press  $\bigcirc$  to save and exit.

#### Phone Interface

You can set which interface to use to navigate menus on your phone.

#### To change the phone interface:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Phone Interface.
- 4. Select Samsung or Bell and press ().

## Brightness

You can change the brightness of the LCD screen, making it brighter or dimmer.

#### To change the brightness setting:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Brightness.
- 4. Using the navigation keys, select a brightness level and press  $\bigcirc$ .

## Backlight

The backlight setting lets you select how long the display screen is backlit after any key press is made.

### To change the backlight setting:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Backlight.
- Use the navigation key to select Slide Open, 30 seconds, 15 seconds, or 8 seconds.
- 5. Press 🔿 to save and exit.

Note: Long backlight settings reduce the battery's talk and standby times.

## **Dialing Font Size**

You can adjust the size of your dialing font.

#### To change the dialing font size:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press 🔘.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Dialing Font Size.
- 4. Press the navigation keys up or down to select Large or Small and press  $\bigcirc$  to save your changes.

## Power Save Mode

You can adjust the power save mode setting.

#### To change the power save mode setting:

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press ().
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- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Power Save Mode.
- 4. Select **On** or **Off**. Turning on the power save mode will slow down the user interface response in order to conserve power.
- 5. Press () to save and exit.

### Keypad Light

The keypad light setting lets you select how long the keypad light is on after any key press is made.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Keypad Light.
- 4. Use the navigation key to select Slide Open, 30 seconds, 15 seconds, 8 seconds or Off.
- 5. Press () to save and exit.

#### Language

Language selection changes all menus settings.

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the Settings menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Language.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to select **English** or **French**.
- 5. Press () to save and exit.

#### Greeting

- 1. Activate the main menu, highlight the **Settings** menu, and press O.
- 2. Select Display.
- 3. Select Greeting.
- 4. Select **Custom** using the navigation key and press  $\bigcirc$ .
- 5. Press and hold **C** to clear the existing greeting.
- 6. Use the keypad to enter a new custom greeting.
- 7. Press the left softkey for **Save**.
- 8. Press () to save and exit.

**Note**: Greeting menu does not appear when using the Bell phone interface.

### Volume

### To adjust the volume of the ringer and voice:

    - For Applications, select Volume and use the navigation keys to select Use Ringer Volume or Adjust Volume. Press 
       to save and exit. To enable game vibration, select Game Vibration, select On, and press 
       .

## Silence All

There may be times when you need to silence your phone entirely. The phone's Silence All option allows you to mute all sounds without turning your phone off.

 With the phone open, press and hold the down volume key in standby mode. (The screen will display "Silence All.") To deactivate Silence All, press the up volume key repeatedly to select a desired volume level.

## **Ringer Type**

You can assign ringer types to individual Contacts entries, types of calls, Schedule entries, and types of messages.

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- **Ring Tones** include a variety of standard ringer types.
- Melodies include a variety of musical melodies.
- My Downloads include all the ringtones you have previously downloaded.
- My Video includes videos you have recorded and can be used for playback.

## To select Ringer Types for Voice Calls, Messages and Schedule:

- 2. Select Sounds.
- 3. Select Ringer Type.
- 4. Select Voice Calls, Messages, or Schedule.
  - If you selected Voice Calls, select With Caller ID or No Caller ID. Use the navigation keys to select Ring Tones, Melodies, My Downloads, or My Video.
  - If you selected Messages, select Voicemail, Text Message or Pic/ Video Message. Use the navigation keys to select Ring Tones, Melodies, or My Downloads.
  - If you selected **Schedule**, use the navigation keys to select **Ring Tones**, **Melodies**, or **My Downloads**.
- 5. Use the navigation keys to select the desired Ringer.
- 6. Press 🔿 to save and exit.

## Selecting Ringer Type for Roaming

#### Alerts

Your phone can alert you with an audible tone when you change service areas, once a minute during a voice call, when a call has been connected, and when turning your phone on and off. The different options available are:

• Minute Beep: An alert tone is sounded every minute that you are connected.

- Service Change: An alert tone is sounded when you come in or out of your coverage area.
- Call Connect: An alert tone is sounded when you are initially connected.
- Signal Fade/Call Drop: An alert tone is sounded when your phone partially loses signal due to network conditions or leaving network coverage area.
- **Power On**: An alert tone is sounded when powering on.
- Power Off: An alert tone is sounded when powering off.

#### To enable or disable alert sounds:

- 2. Select Sounds.
- 3. Select Alerts.
- 4. Press the navigation key up or down to select the desired alert.

# Opening Your Phone to a Landscape View

# Safety Getting the Most Out of Your Reception

#### **Keeping Tabs on Signal Strength**

The quality of each call you make or receive depends on the signal strength in your area. Your phone informs you of the current signal strength by displaying a number of bars next to the signal strength icon. The more bars displayed, the stronger the signal. If you're inside a building, being near a window may give you better reception.

#### **Understanding the Power Save Feature**

If your phone is unable to find a signal after 15 minutes of searching, a Power Save feature is automatically activated. If your phone is active, it periodically rechecks service availability or you can check it yourself by pressing any key. Anytime the Power Save feature is activated, a message displays on the screen. When a signal is found, your phone returns to standby mode.

#### **Understanding How Your Phone Operates**

Your phone is basically a radio transmitter and receiver. When it's turned on, it receives and transmits radio frequency (RF) signals. When you use your phone, the system handling your call controls the power level. This power can range from 0.006 watts to 0.2 watts in digital mode.

#### **Knowing Radio Frequency Safety**

The design of your phone complies with updated NCRP standards described below. In 1991-92, the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers (IEEE) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) joined in updating ANSI's 1982 standard for safety levels with respect to human exposure to RF signals. More than 120 scientists, engineers and physicians from universities, government health agencies and industries developed this updated standard after reviewing the available body of research. In 1993, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) adopted this updated standard in a regulation. In August 1996, the FCC adopted hybrid standard consisting of the existing ANSI/IEEE standard and the guidelines published by the National Council of Radiation Protection and Measurements (NCRP).

#### **Maintaining Your Phone's Peak Performance**

There are several simple guidelines for operating your phone properly and maintaining safe, satisfactory service.

Speak directly into the mouthpiece.

 Avoid exposing your phone and accessories to rain or liquid spills. If your phone does get wet, immediately turn the power off and remove the battery. If it's inoperable, return it to a dealer store or call Customer Support for service.

**Note**: For the best care of your phone, only authorized personnel should service your phone and accessories. Faulty service may void the warranty.

# Maintaining Safe Use of and Access to Your Phone

Failure to follow the instructions outlined may lead to serious personal injury and possible property damage.

#### **Using Your Phone While Driving**

Talking on your phone while driving (or operating the phone without a hands-free device) is prohibited in some jurisdictions. Laws vary as to specific restrictions. Remember that safety always comes first.

When using your phone in the car:

- Get to know your phone and its features, such as speed dial and re-dial.
- When available, use a hands-free device.
- Position your phone within easy reach.
- Let the person you are speaking to know you are driving; if necessary, suspend the call in heavy traffic or hazardous weather conditions.
- Do not take notes or look up phone numbers while driving.
- Dial sensibly and assess the traffic; if possible, place calls when stationary or before pulling into traffic.
- Do not engage in stressful or emotional conversations that may divert your attention from the road.
- Dial 911 to report serious emergencies. It's free from your wireless phone.
- Use your phone to help others in emergencies.
- Call roadside assistance or a special non-emergency wireless number when necessary.

#### **Following Safety Guidelines**

To operate your phone safely and efficiently, always follow any special regulations in a given area. Turn your phone off in areas where use is forbidden or when it may cause interference or danger.

#### **Using Your Phone Near Other Electronic Devices**

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, RF signals from wireless phones may affect inadequately shielded electronic equipment.

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic operating systems and/or entertainment systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or their representative to determine if these systems are adequately shielded from external RF signals. Also check with the manufacturer regarding any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Consult the manufacturer of any personal medical devices, such as pacemakers and hearing aids, to determine if they are adequately shielded from external RF signals.

**Note**: Always turn off the phone in health care facilities and request permission before using the phone near medical equipment.

#### **Turning Off Your Phone Before Flying**

Turn off your phone before boarding any aircraft. To prevent possible interference with aircraft systems, the U.S. Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regulations require you to have permission from a crew member to use your phone while the plane is on the ground. To prevent any risk of interference, FCC regulations prohibit using your phone while the plane is in the air.

#### **Turning Off Your Phone in Dangerous Areas**

To avoid interfering with blasting operations, turn off your phone when in a blasting area or in other areas with signs indicating that two-way radios should be turned off. Construction crews often use remote-control RF devices to set off explosives.

Turn off your phone when you are in an area with a potentially explosive atmosphere. Although it is rare, your phone or its accessories could generate sparks. Sparks could cause an explosion or a fire resulting in bodily injury or even death. These areas are often, but not always, clearly marked. These areas include:

- Fueling areas such as gas stations.
- Below deck on boats.
- Fuel or chemical transfer or storage facilities.

- Areas where the air contains chemicals or particles such as grain, dust or metal powders.
- Any other area where you would normally be advised to turn off your vehicle's engine.

**Note**: Never transport or store flammable gas, liquid or explosives in the compartment of your vehicle that contains your phone or accessories.

#### **Restricting Children's Access to your Phone**

Your phone is not a toy. Children should not be allowed to play with it because they could hurt themselves and others, damage the phone, dial 911 by mistake or make calls that increase your phone bill.

# Caring for the Battery

#### **Protecting Your Battery**

The guidelines listed below help you get the most out of your battery's performance.

- Use only Samsung approved batteries and desktop chargers. These chargers are designed to maximize battery life. Using other batteries or chargers voids your warranty and may cause damage.
- In order to avoid damage, charge the battery only in temperatures that range from 32° F to 113° F (0° C to 45° C).
- Don't use the battery charger in direct sunlight or in high humidity areas, such as the bathroom.
- Never dispose of the battery by incineration.
- Keep the metal contacts on top of the battery clean.
- Don't attempt to disassemble or short-circuit the battery.
- The battery may need recharging if it has not been used for a long period of time.
- It's best to replace the battery when it no longer provides acceptable performance. When used correctly, the battery can be recharged hundreds of times before it needs replacing.

- Don't store the battery in high temperature areas for long periods of time. It's best to follow these storage rules:
  - Less than one month: -4° F to 140° F (-20° C to 60° C)
  - More than one month: -4° F to 113° F (-20° C to 45° C)

#### **Disposal of Lithium Ion (Lilon) Batteries**

For safe disposal options of your Lilon batteries, contact your nearest service center.

**Special Note**: Be sure to dispose of your battery properly. In some areas, the disposal of batteries in household or business trash may be prohibited.

What is important to remember is that each phone meets strict federal guidelines. Variations in SARs do not represent a variation in safety.

All phones must meet the federal standard, which incorporates a substantial margin of safety. As stated above, variations in SAR values between different model phones do not mean variations in safety. SAR values at or below the federal standard of 1.6 W/kg are considered safe for use by the public.
