



USIM/SIM card information

When you subscribe to a cellular network, you receive a plug-in SIM (Subscriber Identity Module) card loaded with your subscription details, such as your PIN and available optional services. For 3G services, you can purchase an USIM (Universal Subscriber Identity Module) card.

Install and charge the phone



Important memory card information

- Frequent erasing and writing will shorten a card's lifespan.
- Do not remove a card from the phone or turn off the phone while data is being accessed or transferred. This could result in loss of data and/or damage to the card or phone.
- Do not subject cards to strong shocks.
- Do not touch card terminals with your fingers or metal objects. If dirty, wipe the card with a soft cloth.
- Keep cards away from small children or pets.
- Do not expose cards in a place subject to electro-static discharge and/or electrical noise.

Insert a memory card

 Slide a memory card into the card slot, with the label side face up.



2. Press the card until it locks into place.

Remove the memory card

- Press the memory card so that it is disengaged from the phone.
- 2. Slide the card out of the slot.

Use a card adapter

Using a card adapter and a USB card reader/writer, you can read the card on a PC.

 Insert a memory card into a card adapter, and then the adapter into a card reader/ writer.

- Plug the USB connecter of the card reader/writer into the USB port on your PC.
- Access the appropriate memory disk and copy to and from the card.

Switch applications

You can switch to other applications from a menu, without closing the menu screen you were using.

Enter text

ABC, T9, Number, and Symbol modes

You can enter text in some features such as Messaging, Contacts, or Calendar, using ABC mode, T9 mode, Number mode, and Symbol mode.

Changing the text input mode

- Press and hold [*] to switch between
 T9 (T9 **Ab) and ABC (Abc) modes.
- Press [*] to change case or to switch to Number mode (123).
- Press and hold [#] to switch to Symbol mode
 (SYM).

Using T9 mode

T9 is a predictive text input mode that allows you to enter any character using single keystrokes.

Entering a word in T9 mode

- 1. Press [2] to [9] to start entering a word. Press each key once for each letter.
 - For example, press [4], [3], [5], [5], and [6] to enter *Hello* in T9 mode.
 - T9 predicts the word that you are typing, and it may change with each key that you press.
- Enter the whole word before editing or deleting characters.

- When the word displays correctly, go to step 4.
 Otherwise, press [0] to display alternative word choices for the keys that you have pressed.
 For example, Of and Me use [6] and [3].
- Press [#] to insert a space and enter the next word.

Other T9 mode operations

- Press [1] to enter periods or apostrophes automatically.
- Press [#] to insert a space.
- Press the Navigation keys to move the cursor.
- Press [C] to delete characters one by one. Press and hold [C] to clear the entire display.

Adding a new word to the T9 dictionary

This feature may not be available for some languages.

Other ABC mode operations

- To enter the same letter twice or to enter a different letter on the same key, wait for the cursor to move to the right automatically or press [Right]. Then, enter the next letter.
- Press [#] to insert a space.

- Press [C] to delete characters one by one. Press and hold [C] to clear the entire display.

Making a call from Contacts

You can quickly dial a number from the USIM/SIM card using its location number assigned when stored.

Answering a call

When you receive an incoming call, the phone rings and displays the incoming call image.

- When Slide up in Slide settings is set to **Accept call**, you can simply open the phone. ▶ p. 81

- Press and hold [▲/▼] to reject a call or mute the ringer, depending on the Volume key setting. ▶ p. 81

Viewing missed calls

If you have missed calls, the screen displays how many calls you have missed.

Making a second call

Using the speakerphone feature

Using In-call options

- Transfer: transfer the currently active call to a caller on hold. The two callers can talk to each other, but you are disconnected from the call.

- Hold/Retrieve: place a call on hold or retrieve the call.
- Mute: access the following muting options:
 Voice: switch off the phone's microphone so that the other person on the phone cannot hear you, or switch it back on.

Keypad tones: turn the key tones off or on.



To communicate with answering machines or computerised telephone systems, **Keypad tones** must be selected.

- New call: make a new voice call.
- Create message: create a new SMS or MMS message.
- Contacts: locate or store contacts in Contacts.
- Add to Contacts: add the sender's number to Contacts.
- View contact details: access the contact information, if the caller is saved in Contacts.
- Send DTMF: send DTMF (Dual tone multifrequency) tones as a group. The DTMF tones are the tones used in phones for tone dialling, sounding when you press the number keys. This option is helpful for entering a password or an account number when you call an automated system, like a banking service.
- Memo: create a memo.
- End call/End: disconnect the call currently on hold, active call, or all calls.

Using the video call feature

In a 3G (UMTS) service area, your phone can make or receive a video call, allowing you to see another person on the screen during a conversation. The other person's phone must support the video call feature.

Making a video call

Message (Menu 5.1.1)

You can create and send text messages and multimedia messages.

If you add data or subject to a text message while composing, the phone will automatically send the message via MMS.

Creating and sending an SMS message

The maximum number of characters allowed in a short message varies by Operator. If your message exceeds the maximum number of characters, the phone will split the message.



Drafts (Menu 5.4)

- Details: access the message properties.

Outbox (Menu 5.5)

This folder stores messages the phone is attempting to send or has failed to send.

The following icons on the message list are available to show the message status:

From the message list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- Cancel sending: cancel sending the message, if the message is being sent.
- **Edit**: edit the selected message.
- Send again: resend the message.
- Delete: delete the selected message or all messages.

- Sort by: change the sort order of the message list.
- **Details**: access the message properties.

Sent message (Menu 5.6)

This folder stores messages that you have sent.

From the message list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- View: open the selected message.
- Forward: forward the message to other people.
- Delete: delete the selected message or all messages.
- Move to phone/Move to SIM: move the message between the phone's memory and the USIM/SIM card.
- Sort by: change the sort order of the message list.

Templates (Menu 5.7)

Use this menu to make and use templates of frequently used messages or passages.

MMS templates (Menu 5.7.1)

You can access embedded MMS templates or ones you have saved so that you can use them in composing an MMS message.

Creating a template

- 3. Move up to the subject field and enter the subject for the template.

Message settings (Menu 5.12)

Use this menu to set up various options for using messaging service.

MMS (Menu 5.12.1)

You can configure MMS settings.

 Sending options: set up the options for sending MMS messages:

Priority: set the priority level of messages.

Expiration: set the length of time your messages are stored in the MMS server.

Delivery: set a time delay before messages are sent.

Hide address: set your address to be hidden from the recipient's phone.

Request delivery report: set the network to inform you when your messages are delivered.

Request read report: send a read-reply request along with your messages.

Keep a copy: leave copies of your messages in the **Sent message** folder after sending.

Add my contact details: allow your contact information to be attached to MMS messages.

 Receiving options: set up the options for receiving MMS messages:

Home network: determine if your phone retrieves new messages automatically when you are in your home service area.

Roaming network: determine if your phone retrieves new messages automatically when you are roaming in another network.

Reception within your home network or while roaming has the following options:

- **Auto download**: the phone automatically retrieves messages from the server.
- Manual: the phone receives notifications first from the server. Use the **Retrieve** option to manually retrieve new messages.

 Restricted: you are not able to create and send messages using unsupported file formats.

Warning: the phone informs you when you create and send a message using unsupported file formats.

Free: you can create and send messages adding unsupported file formats.

Default style: customise the default settings for displaying a received MMS message on your phone:

Font colour: select a font colour. **Font style**: select a font style.

Background colour: select a background

colour.

Slide interval: select a length of time the display shows one page in a message.

SMS (Menu 5.12.2)

You can configure the SMS settings.

 Sending options: set up the options for sending SMS messages:

Reply path: allow recipients to reply to you through your SMS server.

Request delivery report: set the network to inform you when your messages have been delivered.

Network selection: select **CS** (GSM) or **PS** (GPRS), depending on your network.

Character support: select a character encoding type. If you select **Automatic**, the phone switches the encoding type from GSM alphabet to Unicode if you enter a unicode character. Use of unicode encoding will reduce the maximum number of characters in a message to about half. If this menu is not shown, your phone provides the automatic encoding by default.

Keep a copy: leave the copies of your messages in the **Sent message** folder after sending.

 SMS centre settings: select a profile to be used for SMS or set up the SMS server. Press
 Options> and select Edit to access the following properties:

Centre address: store or change the number of your message server.

Validity period: set the length of time your messages are stored in the SMS server.

Default type: set the default message type. The network can convert messages into the selected format.

Name: enter a profile name.

E-mail (Menu 5.12.3)

You can configure the e-mail settings.



You cannot change e-mail profile and account settings while an e-mail is being sent or retrieved.

 Sending options: set up the options for sending e-mails:

From: enter a sender name.

Send account: select the default account. **Priority**: change the priority level of your e-mails.

Keep a copy: leave copies of e-mails in the **Sent message** folder after sending.

Include body when replying: set whether or not the phone includes the original e-mail text in a reply.

Request read report: request a report from each recipient as to when your e-mail was read by the recipient.

Request delivery report: set the network to inform you when your e-mails are delivered.

Add my contact details: allow your contact information to be attached to e-mails.

Add signature: attach a tag line to new e-mails or all e-mails including replies.

Input signature: enter your signature.

 Receiving options: set up the options for receiving e-mails:

Set download limit: determine the maximum size for incoming e-mails. Your phone will reject e-mails that exceed the specified size.

Send read report: determine whether or not the phone sends a read-report to a sender.

Block address: specify e-mail addresses to reject e-mails from those addresses, and activate or deactivate mail blocking.

Block subject: reject e-mails which contain subjects you specify, and activate or deactivate mail blocking.

- Email profiles: select a network connection profile to be used for sending and receiving e-mails. You can also create or edit a profile.

- Email accounts: select an account to be used and set up e-mail accounts. Press <Options> and select Edit to access the following options:

Account name: enter a name for the currently selected account.

SMTP server: enter the IP address or domain name of the outgoing e-mail server.

SMTP port: enter the SMTP port number.

Use SSL: use the SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) protocol for accessing the SMTP server.

Email retrieval server type: select the protocol for the incoming e-mail server. The remaining options depend on the protocol type setting.

POP3 server/**IMAP4** server: enter the IP address or domain name of the POP3 or IMAP4 server.

POP3 port/IMAP4 port: enter the POP3 or IMAP4 port number.

Use SSL: use the SSL (Secure Sockets Layer) protocol for accessing the POP3 or IMAP4 server.

IMAP4 retrieval option: (IMAP4 only) set whether the phone retrieves only new e-mails or all e-mails.

Keep on server: leave copies of e-mails in the server after retrieving.

My address: enter your e-mail address.

User name: enter the user name for POP3 or IMAP4 server connection.

Password: enter the password for POP3 or IMAP4 server connection.

Use POP before SMTP authentication: (POP3 only) connect to the POP3 server before connecting to the SMTP server to send e-mails.

Use SMTP authentication: enable SMTP authentication, which requires the user to log in before sending e-mails.

Same as POP3/IMAP4: select if you want the SMTP server to have the same parameters as the POP3 or IMAP4 server.

User name: enter the user name for SMTP server connection.

Password: enter the password for SMTP server connection.

Push message (Menu 5.12.4)

You can change the settings for receiving push messages from the wireless web server.

- Receiving option: enable or disable the reception of push messages.
- Service loading: set whether or not your phone automatically launches the web browser to access a push message as it comes in.

Broadcast message (Menu 5.12.5)

Use this menu to change the settings for the broadcast message service.

- Receiving options: enable or disable the reception of broadcast messages.
- Channel list: indicate the channels from which you wish to receive broadcast messages. To add a new channel, remove the check mark from All channels. Press <Options> and select Add channel and set the channel ID information and title.
 - Please contact your service provider for further details.
- Language: select the preferred languages in which broadcast messages display.

Voicemail (Menu 5.12.6)

Use this menu to set the number of your voicemail server.



You must store the voicemail server number before accessing the server. Your service provider can give you the number.

Messenger (Menu 5.12.7)

Use this menu to set up options for using the Vodafone messenger service.

- Current status: set the current status that will be shown on messenger.
- My details: enter the following user information:

My screen name: enter the display name that will be shown to other users.

First name: enter the first name.

Last name: enter the last name.

- Notification: set whether the phone informs you when other people add you to their contact lists.

To access this menu, press <Menu> in Idle mode and select My Files.

Tips for Digital Rights Management

As a result of the DRM (Digital Rights Management) system, some of the media items you download from the Internet or receive by MMS may require a licence key to access them. You can acquire the key from the website which owns the rights to the content; use the **Activate key** option.

Note the following icons on the list:

Your phone supports only count-based or unlimited access DRM files.

Switching between the phone's memory and a memory card

You can access data stored on a memory card, if a memory card is inserted.

From the My files screen, scroll to the **On card** tab by pressing [Left] or [Right].

Select the folder you want and open files.

Pictures

Use this menu to access photos you have taken and images you have downloaded, received in messages, or imported from your computer.

Viewing an image

Select an image. The selected image displays.

Viewing a slide show

You can view your images as a slide show, a sequential presentation of each image in the current folder.

- While viewing a file, press < Options> and select Slide show. The slide show begins.
- 2. Press < Back > to stop the slide show.

Editing an image

- 1. Select an image.
- 2. Press <Options> and select Edit.
- Press **Options**> and edit the photo using the following options:
 - Effects: change the colour tone or apply a special effect.
 - **Partial effects**: access the following advanced editing options:

Partial blur: adjust the clarity of the image selected by a square box.

Redeye repair: remove the occurrence of red-eye on the image.

- Transform: change the image size or image orientation.
- Crop: select a variously sized and shaped section of the image and crop the image.

To access this menu, press < Menu> in Idle mode and select Organizer & Tools.

Alarms (Menu 7.1)

Use this menu to set alarms to sound at specific times.

Setting an alarm

- 1. Select the type of alarm.
- 2. Specify the following alarm settings:
 - Name: (for a normal alarm) enter a name for the alarm.
 - Alarm activation: activate the alarm.
 - Alarm time: enter the alarm time.
 - Alarm type: select an alert type for the alarm.
 - Alert tone: select an alarm tone.
 - Alarm volume: select the volume for the alarm melody.
 - **Alarm days**: select the days for the alarm.
 - **Snooze**: set the snooze interval you want.
- Press < Options> and select Save to save the alarm.

Stopping an alarm

Press < **OK**> or [Centre] to stop the alarm. To mute the alarm tone, press any key.

If the snooze feature is set for alarms, press <**Snooze**> to cause it to sound again after the specified interval. You can do this a maximum of 6 times.

Deactivating an alarm

You can store scheduled items, anniversaries, holiday items, private items, and important items.

Entering a scheduled item

- 1. Select a date on the calendar.
- 2. Press <Options> and select Create → Schedule, Important, or Private.
- 3. Enter information or change the settings:
 - Title: enter the title of the item.
 - Details: enter item details.
 - **Start date** and **Start time**: enter the starting date and time for the item.
 - **End date** and **End time**: enter the ending date and time for the item.
 - Location: enter information about the item location.
 - Alarm: select to set an alarm for the item.
 - **Before**: set how long before the item the alarm is to alert.
 - Alarm tone: select an alarm tone.
 - Repeat: select to set the item to recur and select a time format for an item to recur.
 - every: set a repeat interval.
 - By date: select a specific date of the month for an item to recur.
 - **By day**: select a specific day of the month for an item to recur.
 - Except weekends: select to set the alarm to sound except for weekends.
 - **Expiry**: set when the item will be removed from the calendar.
- Press < Options> and select Save to save the item.

Entering an anniversary

- 1. Select a date on the calendar.
- Press < Options > and select Create → Anniversary.
- 3. Enter information or change the settings:
 - **Occasion**: enter information about the anniversary.
 - Date: enter the date.
 - **Alarm**: select to set an alarm for the anniversary.
 - Before: set how long before the item the alarm is to alert.
 - Alarm time: enter the time for the alarm to sound.
 - Alarm tone: select an alarm tone.
 - Repeat every year: select to set the phone to remind you of the anniversary every year.
- Press **Options**> and select **Save** to save the anniversary.

By default, the calendar appears in Monthly view mode. You can change the calendar display to Weekly view mode or Daily view mode.

Daily view

- Anniversaries

If you have set the Repeat and Alarm options, the \bigodot and \biguplus icon display.

Select an item to view its details.

Weekly view

You can view items for the selected week. A cell on the timetable indicates the presence of a schedule item. Press $\lceil A/V \rceil$ to access another week.

Select a cell for the date you want.

Bluetooth (Menu 7.4)

Using Bluetooth wireless, you can connect the phone wirelessly to other Bluetooth devices and exchange data with them, talk hands-free, or control the phone remotely.

Bluetooth technology allows free wireless connections between all Bluetooth-compliant devices within a range of 10 metres. Since the devices communicate using radio waves, they do not need to be in line of sight to each other.



- If there are obstacles between the devices, the maximum operation distance may be reduced.
- It is recommended that you do not use the Bluetooth feature while using multimedia features such as voice recorder, camera, and media player, or vice versa, for better performance.
- Some devices may not be compatible with your phone.

Setting up the Bluetooth feature

The **Bluetooth** menu provides the following options:

- Activation: activate or deactivate the Bluetooth feature.
- My devices: search for connectable Bluetooth devices.
- My phone's visibility: allow other Bluetooth devices to locate your phone, or not.

- My phone's name: assign a Bluetooth device name to your phone, which is then displayed on other devices.
- Secure mode: determine if the phone asks for your confirmation when other devices access your data.
- Bluetooth service: display available Bluetooth services.

Searching for and pairing with a Bluetooth device

- 1. From the **Bluetooth** menu, select **My devices**.
- 2. Select Search new device.

After searching, a list of devices to which you can connect displays. The following icons indicate the type of devices:

- Mobile phone
- PDA
- 🥛 Computer
- 🏪 Printer
- Headset or hands-free car
- 8 Unknown device

- 3. Select a device.
- Enter a Bluetooth PIN and press < OK>. This PIN is used just once and you do not need to memorise it.

When the owner of the other device enters the same code, pairing is complete.



Some devices, especially headsets or hands-free car kits, may have a fixed Bluetooth PIN, such as **0000**. If the other device has a code, you must enter it.

Using device options

From the device list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- Connect: connect to a headset or hands-free car kit.
- Disconnect: end the connection with the connected device.
- Browse device: search for data from the selected device and import data directly to your phone.
- Service list: access the Bluetooth service list of the device.
- Authorize device/Unauthorize device: determine whether or not the phone asks you to permit connection when other devices try to connect to your phone.
- Delete: remove the selected device or all devices from the list.
- Rename: rename the paired device.

Sending data via Bluetooth

- 1. Activate the Bluetooth feature.
- 2. Select the application in which the item you want to send is stored.

- 3. Scroll to the item you want and press < **Options**>.
- 4. Select Send contact details/Send my contact details/Send → Via Bluetooth.

The phone searches for devices within range and displays a list of available devices.

- 5. Select a device.
- If necessary, enter the Bluetooth PIN needed for pairing and press <OK>.

Receiving data via Bluetooth

To receive data via Bluetooth, your phone's Bluetooth feature must be active and its visibility must be enabled.

If an unauthorised Bluetooth device sends data to your phone, press <**Yes**> to allow the device to access your phone.

Calculator (Menu 7.5)

Use this menu to perform basic arithmetic functions such as addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division.

- 1. Enter the first number.
 - Press [*] or [#] to include a decimal point or brackets.
 - Press [▲] or [▼] to move the cursor.
- 2. Enter the operation for your calculation by pressing the Navigation keys.
- 3. Enter the second number.
- 4. Press [Centre] to view the result.

If necessary, repeat from step 2 to continue the calculation.



You can access the Converter feature by pressing **Converter**>.

Converter (Menu 7.6)

Use this menu for common conversions, such as currency and temperature.

Performing a calculation

- 1. Select the converter type you want.
- Press [Left] or [Right] to select the original unit and press [Down].
- 3. Enter the value to be converted and press [Down].
 - Press [*] to insert a decimal point.
 - Press [#] to change the temperature to above zero (+) or below zero (-).

The equivalent value for the amount you entered displays.

Recording time: select a maximum recording time.

World clock (Menu 7.0)

Use this menu to find out the current time in another part of the world.

Viewing world time

 From the world map, press [Left] or [Right] to scroll to the city you want on the upper or lower line.

As the time line moves, the time and date of the given zone display.

2. Press [Centre] to save the time zone.

Applying daylight saving time

- On the World clock screen, press < Options > and select Daylight saving.
- Press [Centre] to select the time zone you want and then <**Done**>.
- 3. Press <Options> and select Save.

Memory status (Menu 7.*)

Use this menu to access memory information for the items stored on the calendar, as well as for tasks and memos.

Contacts (Menu 8)

You can store phone numbers on your USIM/SIM card and in your phone's memory. The USIM/SIM card and phone's memory are physically separate, but they are used as a single entity called Contacts. You can also manage your contact entries.

To access this menu, press < Menu> in Idle mode and select Contacts.

Storing a new contact

You can add a new contact to Contacts.

Storing a contact in the phone's memory

- Scroll to the Contacts tab.
- Press < Options > and select Create contact → Phone.
- Change the settings or enter information about the contact.
 - First name/Last name: assign a name.
 - **Display name**: assign a display name.
 - Mobile private: add a phone number.
 - Landline private: enter a fixed phone number.
 - Email: assign an e-mail address.

- **Group**: assign a caller group.
- Caller ID: assign a caller ID image.
- Ringtone: assign a ringtone to alert you to a call from the person.
- Note: enter the additional note of the person.
- If necessary, press < Options> to access the following options:
 - Change type: change the selected number type.
 - Add more fields: add an additional category to the contact.
 - Delete field: remove the selected category from the contact.
- Press **Options**> and select **Save** to save the contact.

Storing a contact on the USIM/SIM card

- 1. Scroll to the Contacts tab.
- Press <Options> and select Create contact → SIM.
- 3. Change the settings or enter information about the contact.
 - Name: assign a name.
 - Phone number: enter a phone number.
 - **Group**: (for USIM) assign a caller group.
 - **Location number**: assign a location number.

- If you are using a USIM card, press < Options > to add additional information:
 - Add more fields: add an additional category to the contact.
 - Delete field: remove the selected category from the contact.
- Press <Save>, or press <Options> and selectSave to save the contact.

Adding a contact to the FDN list

You can create a list of contacts to be used in FDN (Fixed Dialling Number) mode, in which the phone allows outgoing calls only to the specified phone numbers, if your USIM/SIM card supports this feature.

- Scroll to the FDN tab, or press < Options > and select FDN contacts.
- Press < Options > and select Create FDN contact.
- 3. Enter the PIN2 and press < Confirm >.
- Change the settings or enter information about the contact:
 - Name: assign a name.
 - Phone number: enter a phone number.
 - **Location number**: assign a location number.
- Press < Options> and select Save to save the contact.

Finding a contact

You can search for numbers in Contacts.

- 1. Scroll to the Contacts tab.
- 2. Enter the first few letters of the name that you want to find.
- 3. Select the contact you want from the Contacts list.
- Scroll to a number and press [↑] to dial, or press [Centre] and select Edit to edit the contact details.

Using contact options

From the contact list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- View: access contact information.
- Create FDN contact: add a new FDN contact.
- Create contact: add a new contact in Contacts.
- Voice call: make a voice call.
- Video call: make a video call.
- Create message: send an SMS, MMS, voice message, postcard, or e-mail.
- Edit: edit contact information.
- **Synchronise**: synchronise Contacts with the web server you have specified. ▶ p. 76
- **Duplicate**: make a copy of the contact.
- **Delete**: delete the currently selected contact or the contacts you want.

- Save to My files: save the contact as a name card format in the Other documents folder.
- Send contact details: send the contact details via MMS, e-mail, or Bluetooth.
- My contact details: access your name card.
- Assign speed dial: assign a speed dial number.
 If the selected contact has more than one phone
 number, the speed dial number is assigned to the
 first saved number by default.
- Copy to phone/Copy to SIM: copy the selected contact or all contacts to the phone's memory or the USIM/SIM card.
- Move to phone/Move to SIM: move the selected contact or all contacts to the phone's memory or the USIM/SIM card.
- Service number: display the list of Service Dialling Numbers (SDN) assigned by Vodafone, including emergency numbers, directory enquiries, and voicemail server number. This option is available only when supported by your USIM/SIM card.
- FDN contacts: display the FDN contact list.
- Copy to FDN contacts: copy the selected contact to the FDN contact list.
- Print via Bluetooth: print contact information via a Bluetooth-compatible printer. Some printers may not be compatible with the phone.
- **Settings**: change the default settings for Contacts. ▶ p. 85

 Memory status: check the number of contacts you have stored in the phone's memory and on the USIM/SIM card.

Organising contacts in a group

You can organise your contacts in caller groups.

Creating a caller group

- 1. Scroll to the **Groups** tab.
- 2. Press <Options> and select Create group.
- 3. Enter a name for the group and press **Save**.

Editing members in a caller group

- 1. Select a group.
- 2. Press **Options**> and select **Edit group**.
- 3. Press [Centre] to select the contacts you want and then **<Save>**.

Managing caller groups

From the group list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- View: display the members of the selected group.
- Create group: add a new group.
- Create message: send an SMS, MMS, voice message, or e-mail.
- Delete: delete the selected group. Group members, however, will not be deleted from Contacts.
- Rename: change the group name.

 Group settings: assign an image and ringtone to the selected group in the phone's memory.

Synchronising contacts

You can synchronise your Contacts with the web server you have specified. First, you need to set up the profile to be used for synchronisation.

Creating a synchronisation profile

- From the Contacts list, press < Options > and select Synchronise.
- Press <Add>, or press <Options> and select New sync profile.
- 3. Specify profile parameters:
 - Profile name: enter a name for the profile.
 - **Sync category**: select the applications you want to synchronise with the server.
 - **Sync type**: select a synchronisation type.
 - Sync server: enter the web server address, or login ID and password.
 - Network profile: select a connection profile to be used for connecting to the web server.
 You can also create or edit a profile. > p. 87
- 4. Press < Save > to save the profile.

Starting synchronisation

- From the Contacts list, press < Options > and select Synchronise.
- 2. Press <Options> and select Start sync.
- Press **Continue**> to start synchronisation with the web server you have specified.

Using synchronisation options

From the PIM sync screen, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- Start sync: start a synchronisation for the selected profile.
- **View result**: show the result of the last synchronisation.
- New sync profile: add a new profile.
- Edit sync profile: change the properties of the profile.
- Delete: delete the selected profile or all profiles.

Calls (Menu 9)

Use this menu to view the calls you have dialled, received, or missed, and the length of the calls. You can also check the cost of your calls, if your USIM/ SIM card supports this function.

To access this menu, press < Menu> in Idle mode and select Calls.

All calls (Menu 9.1)

This menu displays the most recent calls dialled, received, or missed.

Accessing a call log

- Press [Left] or [Right] to move to another call type.
- 2. Press [Up] or [Down] to scroll through the call list.

Press [Centre] to view the details of a call, or press [] to dial a number.

Using call log options

From the call list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- View: access the call details.
- Voice call: make a voice call to the number.
- Video call: make a video call to the number, if the 3G service is available.
- **Copy to dialling screen**: past the selected number to the normal dialling screen.
- Add to Contacts: save the selected number in Contacts.
- Create message: send an SMS, MMS message, or voice message.
- **Delete**: delete the selected call log or all logs.
- Add to reject list: add the selected number to the list of phone numbers from which calls are rejected.
- View contact details: access contact information, if the caller is saved in Contacts.
- Call manager: check the total amount of data you have sent or received, and the length of calls. You can also check the cost of calls, if supported by your USIM/SIM card.

Accessing data call logs

You can view the total amount of data you have sent or received.

- From the call list, press < Options> and select Call manager.
- 2. Select Data counter → Total sent or Total received.

To reset a counter or all counters, press **Options**> and select **Reset** or **Reset all**.



If the phone is locked, it will require the phone password. The password is preset to **00000000**. You can change this password. ▶ p. 89

Checking call cost

You can check the cost of calls, if your USIM/SIM card supports this network feature. Note that this is not intended to be used for billing purposes.

- From the call list, press < Options> and select Call manager.
- 2. Select **Call costs**. The following options are available:
 - Total costs: check the total cost of all your calls. If the total cost exceeds the maximum cost set in Edit cost limit, you must reset the counter before you can make another call.
 - Last call cost: check the cost of your last call.
 - Cost limit: check the maximum cost set.

Press **<Options>** to access the following options:

- Reset call cost: reset the cost counters.
- **Edit cost limit**: set the maximum cost authorised for your calls.
- Setup currency: set the currency that is applied when the cost of your call is calculated.

Accessing the call time logs

You can access the call time log for calls you have made and received. The actual time invoiced will vary.

- From the call list, press < Options> and select Call manager.
- Select Call times. The following options are available:
 - Total dialled: check the total length of voice calls dialled.
 - Total received: check the total length of voice calls received.
 - **Total video calls dialled**: check the total length of video calls dialled.
 - Total video calls received: check the total length of video calls received.

To reset a counter or all counters, press **Options**> and select **Reset** or **Reset all**.



If the phone is locked, it will require the phone password. The password is preset to **00000000**. You can change this password. ▶ p. 89

Missed calls (Menu 9.2)

This menu displays the most recent calls you did not answer.

Received calls (Menu 9.3)

This menu displays the most recent calls you have received.

Dialled calls (Menu 9.4)

This menu displays the most recent calls you have dialled.

Vodafone (Menu *)

This is available if you use a USIM/SIM card that supports SIM Application Toolkit menus and provides additional services, such as news, weather, sports, and location services. Available services may vary, depending on Vodafone's plans.

To access this menu, press < Menu > in Idle mode and select Vodafone.



If your USIM/SIM card does not support the SIM Application Toolkit menus, the Profiles menu will display instead of the **Vodafone** menu. ▶ p. 79

For further details, see your USIM/SIM card instructions or contact Vodafone.

Mobile TV (Menu 0)

Use this menu to access the Vodafone online TV service. You can watch TV and use various Mobile TV services. For further details, please contact Vodafone.

To access this menu, press < Menu> in Idle mode and select Mobile TV.

Settings (Menu #)

The **Settings** menu provides you with various setting options to customise the phone to your preferences and needs. You can also reset the settings to their default status.

To access this menu, press < Menu> in Idle mode and select **Settings**.

Phone settings (Menu #.1)

Many different features of your phone's system can be customised to suit your preferences.

Phone profiles (Menu #.1.1)

Your phone provides you with sound profiles that allow you to guickly and easily change the sound settings of the phone for different events or situations. Use this menu to adjust the properties of each profile and activate the profile you need.

Editing a profile

- 1. Scroll to the profile you want.
- 2. Press <Options> and select Edit.
- Change the sound settings. Press [Left] or [Right] to access the options in other taps:
 - Call alert type: select an alert type for the call ringer.
 - Voice call ringtone: select a ringtone for the call ringer of voice calls.
 - Video call ringtone: select a ringtone for the call ringer of video calls.
 - Ringtone volume: adjust the volume for the call ringer.
 - Auto reply: set whether your phone automatically sends a specified message to a caller when you do not answer the phone.
 - **Call answer mode**: (for Car) select how to answer an incoming call.
 - Message alert type: select an alert type for the message ringer.
 - Message alert tone: select a ringtone for the message ringer.
 - Message alert repetition: select if the phone repeats reminding you of a new message.
 - Messenger alert tone: select a ringtone for the messenger ringer. This option displays depending on the country.

- Messenger alert repetition: select if the phone repeats reminding you of a new messenger. This option displays depending on the country.
- Alert tone volume: adjust the volume for the message ringer.
- Keypad tones: select a tone which sounds when you press a key.
- Power on type: select an alert type for the power-on ringer.
- Power off type: select an alert type for the power-off ringer.
- **Slide tone**: cause the phone to sound when you open or close the phone.
- Volume, phone sounds: adjust the phone volume for keytones and sound effect tones.
- When you have finished, press < Options> and select Save.

Changing an active profile

From the profile list, select the profile you want.

Phone language (Menu #.1.2)

Use this menu to select a language for the display text or the T9 input mode.

Shortcuts (Menu #.1.3)

You can use the Navigation keys as shortcut keys to access specific menus directly from Idle mode. Use this menu to assign these shortcut assignments.

Assigning a shortcut to a key

- 1. Select the key to be used as a shortcut key.
- 2. Select the menu that will be assigned.

Using shortcut options

From the Shortcuts screen, press < Options > to access the following options:

- Assign: assign a shortcut menu.
- **Change:** change a shortcut menu assignment.
- **Remove**: deactivate the shortcut assignment to the selected kev.
- Remove all: deactivate all shortcut assignments.

Time & date (Menu #.1.4)

Use this menu to change the current time and date displayed on your phone.

- **Time**: enter the current time.
- Date: enter the current date.
- Time format: select a 12-hour or 24-hour time format. To select AM or PM for 12-hour time format, press [Right].
- Date format: select a date format.
- **Home zone**: select your home time zone. You can view the time difference between your home time zone and Green witch Mean Time (GMT). If you want to apply Daylight Saving Time (DST) to your time zone, select **Daylight saying**.
- Automatic update: select to receive time information from your network.

Volume key (Menu #.1.5)

Use this menu to set whether the phone mutes the call ringer or rejects a call if you press and hold [▲/▼] when a call comes in.

Anykey answer (Menu #.1.6)

Use this menu to answer an incoming call by pressing any key, except for < Reject>, [], and [▲/▼].

Camera key (Menu #.1.7)

Use this menu to set a default function for the Camera/Video call key, [10]. If you select **Always ask**, the phone will ask you to select the function each time you press and hold the key.

Slide settings (Menu #.1.8)

Use this menu to set how the phone reacts when you open it for an incoming call, and when you close it while using a function.

- **Slide up:** set whether or not to answer a call by opening the phone.
- **Slide down**: set whether or not the phone maintains the menu you are using when you close the phone.



When you set Slide down to Continue operation, the keypad lock works just in Idle mode.

Display settings (Menu #.2)

Use this menu to change the settings for the display and lighting.

Wallpaper (Menu #.2.1)

Select a wallpaper type for the display.

- Pictures: the phone displays the image you have set as wallpaper for the idle screen.
- **Photo slide**: the phone displays a photo slide of your favourite images for the idle screen.
- **Use theme**: the phone uses the theme you have selected in the **Theme** menu.

Greeting message (Menu #.2.2)

Use this menu to enter the greeting that is displayed briefly when the phone is switched on.

Calendar (Menu #.2.3)

Set the phone to display the calendar of the current month on the idle screen.

Theme (*Menu #.2.4*)

Select a theme. The theme is a collection of Idle mode wallpaper, Menu mode wallpaper, power on/off image, voice/video call ringtone, and message alert tone assembled into one theme.

Brightness (Menu #.2.5)

Adjust the brightness of the display for varying lighting conditions.

Backlight time (Menu #.2.6)

Select the length of time the backlight or display stays on:

- On: select the length of time the backlight stays on.
- Dim: select the length of time the display stays on in Dim mode after the backlight turns off.
 After a specified time, the display turns off.

Dialling display (Menu #.2.7)

Select a font type, font colour and size for the numbers entered and background colour of the display while dialling.

Messaging settings (Menu #.3)

Use this menu to change the default settings for using the messaging services. ▶ p. 51


Call settings (Menu #.4)

Use this menu to set options for call functions.

All calls (Menu #.4.1)

Use this menu to change the default settings for voice calls, video calls, and data calls.

 Show my number: hide your phone number from the person you are calling. If you select By network, the phone will use the default setting provided by the network.



- **Show Caller Information**: set the phone to display missed call notifications with the most recently missed caller's information.
- Closed user group: set incoming and outgoing calls to be restricted to a selected user group.
 For details about how to create a closed user group, please contact Vodafone:

Use this user group: activate Closed User Group (CUG) index numbers.

Outside access: enable calls to numbers other than those in the Closed user group. This feature depends on the nature of your CUG subscription.

Default group: enable the default CUG, if you have set one with Vodafone. When making a call, you are given the option of using your default CUG, instead of selecting one from the list.

Group index: add, delete, or activate CUG index numbers.

- Auto redial: set the phone to make up to ten attempts to redial a phone number after an unsuccessful call.
- Auto reject: activate the Auto reject feature.
 You can also set the phone to reject a call from the unknown or specified numbers.
- **Call status tones**: select the various tones on the phone you want to turn on or off:

All: enable all tones

Call connect tone: cause the phone to beep when an outgoing call is connected to the system.

Minute minder: cause the phone to beep every minute during an outgoing call to keep you informed of the length of your call.

Call end tone: cause the phone to beep when a call is disconnected by the other person or the faded signal.

 Alerts on call: set the phone to beep when you receive a new message or when the time for an alarm comes during a call.

Voice call (Menu #.4.2)

Use this menu to access network services for voice calls.

Setting a call diverting option

This network service reroutes incoming calls to a different phone number that you specify.

- 1. From the Voice call screen, select **Diverts**.
- 2. Select a call diverting option:
 - Always: divert all calls.
 - Busy: divert calls when you are on another call.
 - **No reply**: divert calls when you do not answer the phone.
 - Unreachable: divert calls when you are not in an area covered by Vodafone or when your phone is switched off.
 - Cancel all: cancel all call diverting options.
- Enter the number to which the calls will be diverted in the **Divert to** line.

- If you select No reply, move to the Waiting time line and select the length of time the network delays before diverting a call.
- Press < Options > and select Activate. To deactivate the call diverting, select Deactivate.

Setting a call restriction option

This network service allows you to restrict your calls.

- 1. From the Voice call screen, select **Restrict calls**.
- 2. Select a call barring option:
 - All outgoing calls: prohibit outgoing calls.
 - Outgoing intl calls: prohibit international calls.
 - Intl except home: only allow calls to numbers within the current country when you are abroad, and to your home country.
 - All incoming calls: prohibit incoming calls.
 - Incoming when roaming: prohibit incoming calls when you use your phone outside of your home country.
 - Cancel all: cancel all call barring settings, allowing calls to be sent and received normally.
- Enter the call barring password supplied by Vodafone.
- Press < Options> and select Activate. To deactivate the call barring, select Deactivate.



You can change the call barring password obtained from Vodafone. On the Restrict calls screen, press < Options > and select Change password.

Setting a call waiting option

This network service informs you when someone is trying to reach you while you are on another call.

- 1. From the Voice call screen, select Waiting.
- Press < Options> and select Activate. To deactivate the call waiting, select Deactivate.

Video call (Menu #.4.3)

Use this menu to change the default settings for using the video call feature.

- Show my picture: set whether or not the phone displays your image on the other's phone via the camera. If you select Always ask, the phone will ask you to turn on the camera.
- Select still picture: select an image to be displayed on the other's phone if you will not show your image via the camera.
- Retry with: set what to do when a video call does not connect:

Always ask: the phone always asks you to whether or not to retry.

Voice call: the phone retries with a voice call.

Camera: the phone turns on the camera and switches to Record mode so that you can record a video and send it as an MMS message.

Messages: the phone retries with an SMS or MMS message.

None: the phone does not retry.

- Diverts: reroute incoming video calls to a different phone number that you specify. ▶ p. 83
- Restrict calls: restrict video calls. ▶ p. 84

Data call (Menu #.4.4)

Use this menu to change the default settings for using the data call feature.

- Diverts: reroute incoming data calls to a different phone number that you specify. ▶ p. 83
- **Restrict calls**: restrict data calls. ▶ p. 84
- Waiting: set the network to inform you when someone is trying to reach you while on another call. > p. 84

Contact settings (Menu #.5)

Use this menu to set up the default contact settings.

Speed dialing (Menu #.5.1)

Use this menu to assign speed dial numbers (2 to 9) to eight of your most frequently dialled numbers.

Assigning speed dial entries

- Select a key location from 2 to 9. Key 1 is reserved for your voicemail server.
- Press < Options > and select Assign → Contacts or FDN contacts.
- 3. Select the contact you want from the contact list.
- 4. Select a number, if the contact has more than one number.

Managing speed dial entries

From the Speed dial screen, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- Assign: assign a number to an unassigned key.
- **View**: check the name and number assigned to a key.
- Voice call: make a voice call.
- Video call: make a video call.
- Change: assign a different number to a key.
- Remove: clear the speed dial setting for a key.

Dialling speed dial numbers

In Idle mode, press and hold the appropriate key.

Save new contacts to (Menu #.5.2)

Use this menu to select the default memory location for saving contacts. If you select **Always ask**, the phone will ask you to select a memory location each time you save a number.

View contacts from (Menu #.5.3)

Use this menu to set the memory location from which Contacts shows entries.

Own number (Menu #.5.4)

Use this feature to check your phone numbers, or to assign a name to each of the numbers. Changes made here do not affect the actual subscriber numbers on your USIM/SIM card.

Calendar settings (Menu #.6)

Use this menu to change the default settings for the calendar.

- Starting day: select which day of the week the calendar starts with.
- Default view mode: select the default calendar view mode.

live cast settings (Menu #.7)

Use this menu to change the settings for using the live! Cast feature. This feature may not be available, depending on the country.

- Activation: set whether or not the phone receives live! Cast messages from the live! Cast server.
- Channel list: edit the channels from which the phone receives live! Cast messages.
- **Ticker speed**: set the speed at which the live! Cast headlines scroll across the screen.
- Number of messages in ticker viewer: set the number of headlines the thicker will display.

Camera settings (Menu #.8)

Use this menu to customise the settings for using the camera.

- Camera settings: change the default settings for taking photos. ▶ p. 38
- Video settings: change the default settings for recording video clips. ▶ p. 40

Network settings (Menu #.9)

Use this menu to customise settings for connecting to a network.

Network selection (Menu #.9.1)

This network service allows you to manually select the network to be used while roaming outside of your home area, or to let the network be chosen automatically.

You can select a network other than your home network only if there is a valid roaming agreement between the two.

Network mode (Menu #.9.2)

Use this menu to select the network you use.

- Automatic: the phone scans for available networks.
- **GSM 900/1800**: the phone operates in the combined GSM 900/1800 network.
- GSM 1900: the phone operates in the GSM 1900 network. This option is only available in the U.S.A.
- UMTS: the phone operates in UMTS (3G network) networks. You can get a higher speed quality than on lower generation networks, and use advanced data and information services, such as video calls.

Preferred networks (Menu #.9.3)

Use this menu to add a new network to your preferred network list, if your USIM/SIM card supports it.

Adding a network from the network list

- From the network list, press < Options > and select Insert or Add → Network list.
- Select the network you want and press <Insert> or <Add>.

Creating a network

- 1. From the network list, press < Options >.
- 2. Select Insert or Add → New network.
- 3. Specify network parameters:
 - Country code: enter the country code.
 - Network code: enter the network code provided by the network operator.
 - Network name: enter the name for the network.
- 4. Press < Insert> or < Add> to add the network.

Connections (Menu #.9.4)

Use this menu to create and customise the profiles containing the settings for connecting your phone to the network. You need these settings to use the web browser or send MMS messages or e-mails.

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Your phone is set up by default connecting to the network. If you change the settings without first checking with your service provider, the web browser, MMS, and e-mail features may not work properly.

Creating a profile

- 1. Press <Options> and select New.
- 2. Specify profile parameters:
 - Set name: enter a profile name.
 - Access name: edit the access point name used for the address of the GPRS network gateway.
 - Authorisation type: choose the type of authentication used.
 - User ID: enter the user ID.
 - Password: enter the user password.
 - Protocol: select the protocol from among WAP, HTTP, and Other.
 - Home URL: enter the URL address of the page to be used as your homepage.
 - Gateway address: (WAP only) enter the gateway address of the proxy server.
 - **Proxy address/Port**: (HTTP only) set the proxy server address and port.
 - Secure connection: (WAP only) turn the secure mode on or off.
 - Log-in timeout (sec.): set a time period after which the network is disconnected if there has been no new data traffic in that time.

 Advanced settings: provide you with the following options:

Static IP: specify if you want to manually enter an IP address; see the **Local phone IP** option. If you want the IP address to be automatically assigned by the server, remove the check mark.

Local phone IP: enter the IP address obtained from the network operator, if you checked the Static IP option.

Static DNS: specify if you want to manually enter the Domain Name Server (DNS) address; see the **Server 1/Server 2** option. If you want the address to be automatically assigned by the server, remove the check

mark.

Server 1/Server 2: enter the Domain Name Server (DNS) addresses.

Traffic class: select the traffic class.

3. Press **<Save>** to save the profile.

Using profile options

From the profile list, press **Options**> to access the following options:

- View: view the properties of the selected profile.
- **Edit**: edit the selected profile.
- New: add a new profile.
- Rename: change the profile name.
- **Delete**: delete the profile.

- Restore: restore the changed settings to the default settings.
- You cannot edit or delete the default connection profiles.

Browser settings (Menu #.9.5)

Use this menu to select a connection profile to be used for accessing the Internet. You can also create or edit a profile. ▶ p. 87

Streaming settings (Menu #.9.6)

Use this menu to activate a connection profile to be used for accessing streaming servers. You can also create or edit a profile. ▶ p. 87

Security (Menu #.0)

Use this menu to protect the phone against unauthorised use by managing the several access codes of your phone and the USIM/SIM card.

If you enter an incorrect PIN/PIN2 three times, the USIM/SIM card is blocked. To unblock it, you need to enter your PUK/PUK2 (Personal Unblocking Key). The codes are supplied by your network operator.

Phone lock (Menu #.0.1)

The Phone lock feature locks the phone from unauthorised use.

When this feature is enabled, you must enter a 4- to 8-digit phone password each time the phone is switched on.

The password is preset to **00000000**. To change the password, use the **Change phone password** menu.

SIM lock (Menu #.0.2)

The SIM lock feature allows your phone to work only with the current USIM/SIM by assigning a USIM/SIM lock code. You must enter the USIM/SIM lock code to use a different USIM/SIM card.

PIN lock (Menu #.0.3)

The 4- to 8-digit PIN (Personal Identification Number) protects your USIM/SIM card against unauthorised use. When this feature is enabled, the phone requires your PIN each time it is switched on.

Fixed dialling mode (Menu #.0.4)

If supported by your USIM/SIM card, Fixed Dialling Number (FDN) mode restricts your outgoing calls to a limited set of phone numbers. When this feature is enabled, you can make calls only to phone numbers specified in the USIM/SIM card.

Change phone password (Menu #.0.5)

Use this menu to change your phone password. The password is preset to **00000000**.

Privacy lock (Menu #.0.6)

Use this menu to lock access to messages, media files, call logs, Calendar items, or Contacts entries. When a lock option is enabled, you must enter the phone password to access the locked items.

Change PIN code (Menu #.0.7)

Use this menu to change your PIN. The PIN lock feature must be enabled to use this feature.

Change PIN2 code (Menu #.0.8)

If supported by your USIM/SIM card, the Change PIN2 code feature changes your current PIN2.

Mobile tracker (Menu #.0.9)

When someone tries to use your phone with another USIM/SIM card, the phone will automatically send the preset tracking message to your family or friends. You can check the phone number from which the messages are sent and then track your phone. This feature is useful when the phone is stolen or lost.

- Enter the phone password and press
- 2. Specify the following options:
 - Activation: activate the Mobile tracker feature.
 - **Recipients:** specify phone numbers to which you want to send the tracking messages.
 - **Sender**: enter the sender's name.
 - Messages: check the preset tracking message text.
- 3. When you have finished, press < Save>.
- Press < Accept> if you agree to the terms and conditions of service listed on the screen.

Memory settings (Menu #.*)

Use this menu to manage your phone's memory or a memory card.

Phone memory (Menu #.*.1)

Use this menu to delete data in the phone's memory or reset your phone.

Deleting data

You can delete messages, media files, Contacts entries, Calendar items, and DRM activation keys.

- On the Phone memory screen, select Clear memory.
- 2. Press [Centre] to select the data type you want and then $< {\bf OK}>$.
- 3. Enter the password and press **<Confirm>**.
 - The password is preset to **00000000**. You can change this password. ▶ p. 89
- 4. Press < Yes> to confirm the deletion.

Resetting the phone

You can reset the phone to its default settings.

- On the Phone memory screen, select Master reset.
- 2. Enter the password and press **<Confirm>**.
- 3. Press **Yes**>. The phone automatically turns itself off and then back on.

Memory card (Menu #.*.2)

Use this menu to customise settings for using a memory card. This menu is shown only when a memory card is inserted into the phone.

- Memory card details: check the name of the memory card and amount of memory being used.
- Format: format the memory card.
- Rename memory card: change the name of the memory card.
- AutoRun activation: set whether or not the phone automatically runs the Vodafone services when you insert a memory card into the phone.
- **Bluetooth visibility**: allow other devices to locate the memory card, or not.

Set default memory (Menu #.*.3)

Use this menu to select the default memory location for saving messages and media files received from other phone or downloaded from the Internet. If you select **Always ask**, the phone will ask you to select a memory location each time you save an item.

Memory status (Menu #.*.4)

Use this menu to check the amount of memory being used for storing data, such as Messaging, My files, Organizer & Tools, and Contacts. You can also view the amount of shared memory.

Solve problems

Help and personal needs

To save the time and expense of an unnecessary service call, perform the simple checks in this section before contacting a service professional.

When you switch on your phone, the following messages may appear:

"Please insert SIM card"

Be sure that the USIM/SIM card is correctly installed.

"Phone lock"

 The automatic locking function has been enabled. You must enter the phone's password before you can use the phone.

"PIN lock"

- You are using your phone for the first time. You must enter the PIN supplied with the USIM/SIM card.
- The PIN lock feature is enabled. Every time the phone is switched on, the PIN has to be entered.
 To disable this feature, use the PIN lock menu.

"PUK lock"

 The PIN was entered incorrectly three times, and the USIM/SIM card is now blocked. Enter the PUK supplied by your service provider.

"No service," "Network error," or "Not done" displays

- The network connection has been lost. You may be in a weak signal area. Move and try again.
- You are trying to access an option for which you have no subscription with your service provider. Contact the service provider for further details.

You have entered a number but it was not dialled

- Be sure that you have pressed [➤].
- Be sure that you have accessed the right cellular network.
- Be sure that you have not set an outgoing call barring option.

Your correspondent cannot reach you

- Be sure that your phone is switched on. ([
 pressed for more than one second.)
- Be sure that you are accessing the correct cellular network.
- Be sure that you have not set an incoming call barring option.

Your correspondent cannot hear you speaking

- Be sure that you have switched on the microphone.
- Be sure that you are holding the phone close enough to your mouth. The microphone is located at the bottom of the phone.

The phone starts beeping and "Low battery" flashes on the display

 Your battery is insufficiently charged. Recharge the battery.

The audio quality of the call is poor

- Check the signal strength indicator on the display (* , , ,). The number of bars indicates the signal strength from strong (* , , , ,) to weak (* ,).
- Try moving the phone slightly or moving closer to a window if you are in a building.

No number is dialled when you re-call a Contacts entry

- Use the Contacts feature to ensure the number has been stored correctly.
- Re-store the number, if necessary.

The battery does not charge properly or the phone sometimes turns itself off

 Wipe the charging contacts both on the phone and on the battery with a clean soft cloth.

If the above guidelines do not help you to solve the problem, take note of:

- The model and serial numbers of your phone
- Your warranty details
- · A clear description of the problem

Then contact your local dealer or Samsung aftersales service.

SAR certification information

THIS MODEL MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile phone is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by independent scientific organisation ICNIRP and include margins designed to assure the protection of all persons, regardless of age and health.

This guidelines use a unit of measurement known as Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2.0 W/kg and the highest SAR value for this device when tested at the ear was 0.601 W/kg.* As mobile phones offer a range of functions, they can be used in other positions, such as on the body as described in this User's Guide.** In this case, the highest tested SAR value is 0.958 W/kg.

The tests are carried out in accordance with international quidelines for testing.

^{***} For body worn operation, this model phone has been tested and meets the RF exposure guidelines when used with a Samsungsupplied or approved accessory designated for this product or when used with an accessory that contains no metal and that positions the handset minimum of 1.5 cm from the body.

As SAR is measured utilizing the devices highest transmitting power the actual SAR of this device while operating is typically below that indicated above. This is due to automatic changes to the power level of the device to ensure it only uses the minimum level required to reach the network.

The World Health Organization has stated that present scientific information does not indicate the need for any special precautions for the use of mobile devices. They note that if you want to reduce your exposure then you can do so by limiting the length of calls or using a 'hands-free' device to keep the mobile phone away from the head and body.

Precautions when using batteries

- Never use a charger or battery that is damaged in any way.
- Use the battery only for its intended purpose.
- If you use the phone near the network's base station, it uses less power. Talk and standby time are greatly affected by the signal strength on the cellular network and the parameters set by the network operator.
- Battery charging time depends on the remaining battery charge, the type of battery, and the charger used. The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times, but it will gradually wear out. When the operation time is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

- If left unused, a fully charged battery will discharge itself over time.
- Use only Samsung-approved batteries, and recharge your battery only with Samsungapproved chargers. Disconnect the charger from the power source when it is not in use. Do not leave the battery connected to a charger for more than a week, since overcharging may shorten its life.
- Extreme temperatures will affect the charging capacity of your battery: it may require cooling or warming first.
- Do not leave the battery in hot or cold places because the capacity and lifetime of the battery will be reduced. Try to keep the battery at room temperature. A phone with a hot or cold battery may not work temporarily, even when the battery is fully charged. Li-ion batteries are particularly affected by temperatures below 0°C (32°F).
- Do not short-circuit the battery. Accidental short-circuiting can occur when a metallic object like a coin, clip or pen causes a direct connection between the + and terminals of the battery (metal strips on the battery). For example, do not carry a spare battery in a pocket or bag where the battery may contact metal objects. Short-circuiting the terminals may damage the battery or the object causing the short-circuiting.

 Dispose of used batteries in accordance with local regulations. Always recycle. Do not dispose of batteries in a fire.

Road safety

Your wireless phone gives you the powerful ability to communicate by voice, almost anywhere, anytime. But an important responsibility accompanies the benefits of wireless phones, one that every user must uphold.

When driving a car, driving is your first responsibility. When using your wireless phone while driving, follow local regulations in the country or region you are in.

Operating environment

Remember to follow any special regulations in force in the area you are in, and always switch off your phone whenever it is forbidden to use it, or when it may cause interference or danger.

When connecting the phone or any accessory to another device, read its user's guide for detailed safety instructions. Do not connect incompatible products.

As with other mobile radio transmitting equipment, users are advised that for the satisfactory operation of the equipment and for the safety of personnel, it is recommended that the equipment should only be used in the normal operating position (held to your ear with the antenna pointing over your shoulder).

Electronic devices

Most modern electronic equipment is shielded from radio frequency (RF) signals. However, certain electronic equipment may not be shielded against the RF signals from your wireless phone. Consult the manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Pacemakers

Pacemaker manufacturers recommend that a minimum distance of 15 cm (6 inches) be maintained between a wireless phone and a pacemaker to avoid potential interference with the pacemaker. These recommendations are consistent with the independent research and recommendations of Wireless Technology Research. If you have any reason to suspect that interference is taking place, switch off your phone immediately.

Hearing aids

Some digital wireless phones may interfere with some hearing aids. In the event of such interference, you may wish to consult your hearing aid manufacturer to discuss alternatives.

Other medical devices

If you use any other personal medical devices, consult the manufacturer of your device to determine if it is adequately shielded from external RF energy.

Your physician may be able to assist you in obtaining this information.

Switch off your phone in health care facilities when regulations posted in these areas instruct you to do so.

Vehicles

RF signals may affect improperly installed or inadequately shielded electronic systems in motor vehicles. Check with the manufacturer or its representative regarding your vehicle.

You should also consult the manufacturer of any equipment that has been added to your vehicle.

Posted facilities

Switch off your phone in any facility where posted notices require you to do so.

Potentially explosive environments

Switch off your phone when in any area with a potentially explosive atmosphere, and obey all signs and instructions. Sparks in such areas could cause an explosion or fire resulting in bodily injury or even death.

Users are advised to switch off the phone while at a refuelling point (service station). Users are reminded of the need to observe restrictions on the use of radio equipment in fuel depots (fuel storage and distribution areas), chemical plants, or where blasting operations are in progress.

Areas with a potentially explosive atmosphere are often but not always clearly marked. To make or receive calls, the phone must be switched on and in a service area with adequate signal strength. Emergency calls may not be possible on all wireless phone networks or when certain network services and/or phone features are in use. Check with local service providers.

To make an emergency call:

- 1. Switch on the phone.
- 2. Key in the emergency number for your present location. Emergency numbers vary by location.
- 3. Press [**↑**].

Certain features like Call Barring may need to be deactivated before you can make an emergency call. Consult this document and your local cellular service provider.

Other important safety information

- Only qualified personnel should service the phone or install the phone in a vehicle. Faulty installation or service may be dangerous and may invalidate any warranty applicable to the device.
- Check regularly that all wireless phone equipment in your vehicle is mounted and operating properly.
- Do not store or carry flammable liquids, gases, or explosive materials in the same compartment as the phone, its parts, or accessories.
- For vehicles equipped with an air bag, remember that an air bag inflates with great force. Do not place objects, including installed or portable wireless equipment, in the area over the air bag or in the air bag deployment area. Improperly installed wireless equipment could result in serious injury if the air bag inflates.
- Switch off your phone before boarding an aircraft. It is dangerous and illegal to use wireless phones in an aircraft because they can interfere with the operation of the aircraft.
- Failure to observe these instructions may lead to the suspension or denial of telephone services to the offender, or legal action, or both.

Care and maintenance

Your phone is a product of superior design and craftsmanship and should be treated with care. The suggestions below will help you fulfill any warranty obligations and allow you to enjoy this product for many years.

- Keep your phone and all its parts and accessories out of the reach of small children and pets. They may inadvertently damage these things or choke on small parts.
- Keep the phone dry. Precipitation, humidity, and liquids contain minerals that corrode electronic circuits.
- Do not use the phone with a wet hand. Doing so may cause an electric shock to you or damage to the phone.
- Do not use or store the phone in dusty, dirty areas, as its moving parts may be damaged.
- Do not store the phone in hot areas. High temperatures can shorten the life of electronic devices, damage batteries, and warp or melt certain plastics.
- Do not store the phone in cold areas. When the phone warms up to its normal operating temperature, moisture can form inside the phone, which may damage the phone's electronic circuit boards.
- Do not drop, knock, or shake the phone. Rough handling can break internal circuit boards.

- Do not use harsh chemicals, cleaning solvents, or strong detergents to clean the phone. Wipe it with a soft cloth slightly dampened in a mild soap-and-water solution.
