





Inserting the SIM Card and the Battery


1. Slide off the battery cover.




2. Slide the SIM card into the SIM holder.



3. Hold the battery so that the metal contacts of the battery are facing down, slide the guides on the top of the battery into the battery slots ①, and then insert it ②.



4. Replace the battery cover as shown below and slide it as shown.




- Make sure that only 3V SIM cards are used.
- Make sure that the standard accessory battery (XN-1BT11) is used.

Removing the SIM Card and the Battery


 Make sure to turn off your phone and disconnect the charger and other accessories. Slide off the battery cover.



2. Pick up the battery using the protruding edge and remove the battery from the phone.



3. Slide the SIM card by pushing the back of the card and remove it from the SIM holder.



Battery Disposal

The device is supported by a battery. In order to protect the environment, please read the following points concerning battery disposal:


- Take the used battery to your local waste depot, dealer or customer service centre for recycling.

Charging the Battery

You must charge the battery for at least 2 hours before using your phone for the first time.

Using the Charger

 Connect the charger to the external socket located at the bottom of the phone with the charger's "PUSH TOP" mark facing towards you, and to an AC outlet.



The mobile light lights red. Standard charging time: Approx. 2 hours.

Note

 Charging time may vary depending on the state of the battery and other conditions. (See "Battery" on page 177.)

To Disconnect the Charger

Push and hold the side buttons of the charger, then disconnect the charger from the external socket of the phone.

When charging is complete, the mobile light turns off. Unplug the charger from the AC outlet, then unplug the charger connector from the phone.

- Do not use any non approved charger, this may damage your phone and invalidate any warranty, please see "Battery" on page 177 for details.
- When the phone is charging, the animated battery status icon () in the upper right of the screen displays the current status.

Battery Level Indicator

The current battery level is displayed in the upper right hand side of the main display and the external display.

Low Battery During Use

When the battery is running low, an alarm will sound and the " I is displayed on the main display and the external display.

If you are using your phone and you hear the "low battery" alarm, attach your charger as soon as possible. The phone may not be able to continue normal operation if you continue to use it. The battery may only last approximately five minutes before the phone itself powers down during a call.

Turning Your Phone On and Off

To turn the power on, press and hold ② for approximately 2 seconds.

The stand-by screen is displayed.

To turn the power off, press and hold 2 for approximately 2 seconds.

To Enter the PIN Code

If activated you are asked to enter a PIN (Personal Identification Number) code after turning on your phone.

- 1. Enter your PIN code.
- 2. Press .


 If your PIN code is entered incorrectly three times in a row, the SIM card is locked. See "Enabling/ Disabling the PIN Code" on page 165.

To Copy Phonebook Entries from the SIM Card When you insert the SIM card into your phone for the first time and start the Call Manager application, you are asked whether you wish to copy Phonebook entries on the SIM card. Follow the on-screen instructions, or you can do it later using the Phonebook menu as follows:

1. Press to display the Main menu.

- 2. Press (a), (b) or (c) to highlight "Call Manager", then press (c) to select.
- 3. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Phonebook", then press ♠ to select.
- **4.** Press ([Options] to display Options menu.
- 5. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Advanced", then press ♠ or ♦ [Select] to select.
- **6.** Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Copy All from SIM", then press ♠ to select.
- Press ♀ [Yes] to start copying.
 To cancel copy, press ♀ [No] in step 7.

Call Functions

Making a Call

- Enter the area code and the phone number you wish to dial.
 - If you enter the wrong number, press \bigcirc [Clear] to delete the number to the left of the cursor.
- Press to dial.

Emergency Calls

- Enter 112 (international emergency number) using the keypad.
- 2. Press to dial.

Note

- Emergency calls may not be available on all mobile phone networks when certain network services and/ or phone features are in use. Contact your network operator for more information.
- This Emergency number can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.

International Calls

- Press and hold until a "+" (international dialling prefix) sign is displayed.
- 2. Enter the country code, followed by the area code and the number
- 3. Press to dial.

Note

 Enter the area code omitting the first 0 when making international calls, in most cases. (It differs for some countries.)

Speed Dialling

Up to 9 phone numbers from the Phonebook memory (Handset and SIM) can be assigned to speed dials. You can call the numbers using the digit keys (② to ② and ②).

For details on setting the Speed Dial List, see "Speed Dial List" on page 51.

 To dial a number using the speed dial, press and hold any of the digit keys (To and).
 The phone number stored in the Speed Dial List is dialled.

Redialling

You can redial the numbers in the call log list that you may have missed, received or dialled. Each list can contain up to 10 numbers.

- 1. Press during stand-by.
- 2. Press ① or ② to highlight a category between "Dialled Numbers", "Missed Calls" and "Received Calls"
- 3. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight the number you wish to call.
- **4.** Press to redial the call.

Automatic Redialling

This setting allows you to automatically redial the number if the first attempt was unsuccessful.

If you wish to stop redialling, press \triangle or \bigcirc [End].

To Set the Auto Redial Function

- 1. Press o to display the Main menu.
- 2. Press ♠, ♥, ♥ or ▶ to highlight "Settings", then press ♠ to select.
- 3. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Call Settings", then press ♠ to select.
- **4.** Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Auto Redial", then press ♠ to select.

 Press nor to highlight "On" to enable the Auto Redial function or "Off" to disable it, then press no.

Note

- When you receive an incoming call, the Auto Redial function is interrupted.
- Automatic redialling is not available for fax and data calls

Ending a Call

1. Press ② to end the call.

Tip

 When the handsfree kit is connected to the phone, you can end calls by pressing the Answer button.

Answering a Call

When an incoming call is detected, the phone rings and the mobile light flashes green.

- 1. Open your phone.
- 2. Press ∅, ⊚ or ◊ [Answer] to answer the call.

 Or press any key except ②, ◊ [Busy], ③ and ③
 when the "Any Key Answer" function is enabled.

 Set the Any Key Answer function in the profile of each mode. (p. 134)

Tip

- When the handsfree kit is connected to the phone and the Any Key Answer function is enabled, you can answer calls by pressing the side-up or side-down key.
- If you have subscribed to the Calling Line Identification (CLI) service and the caller's network sends the number, the caller's number is displayed on the screen. If the caller's name and number are stored in the Phonebook, the caller's name and phone number are displayed on the screen.
- If the number is a restricted number, the display shows "Withheld".
- When receiving a call from the person whose picture is registered in the Phonebook, receiving display and the picture are displayed alternately.

Rejecting an Incoming Call

You can reject a call you do not wish to answer.

1. Press ② or press and hold the side-up or side-down key whilst the phone is ringing.

Letting the Caller Know You are Unavailable You can send a busy tone to the caller of an incoming call letting them know that you cannot answer the call.

1. Press () [Busy] whilst the phone is ringing.

Incall Menus

Your phone has additional functions available whilst a call is in progress.

Adjusting the Earpiece Volume

During a call, you can adjust the earpiece volume (and the handsfree kit volume, if connected).

- During a call, press the side-up or side-down key to display the Earpiece Volume screen.
- 2. Press the side-up key or to increase the volume of the call or press the side-down key or to decrease the volume.

Five levels (level 1 to 5) are selectable.

3. Press when the volume is set to the desired level

The phone returns to the in-call screen automatically if left unoperated.

Putting a Call on Hold

This function allows you to manage two calls at the same time. If you wish to make another call whilst you are talking to someone, you can put the current call on hold to call someone else.

To Make Another Call during a Call

1. During a call, press $\widehat{\Diamond}$ [Options] to display the Options menu.

Press ⊕ or ⊕ to highlight "Hold", then press ⊕ or ⊖ [Select] to select.

The current call is put on hold.

To retrieve a call, press \bigcirc [Options] and press \bigcirc or \bigcirc to highlight "Retrieve", then press \bigcirc or \bigcirc [Select] to select.

3. Enter the phone number you wish to make another call to, then press .

Tip

 You can also make another call by entering the phone number during a call instead of steps 1 and 2. The current call is automatically put on hold.

Call Waiting

This service notifies you of another incoming call whilst you have a call in progress.

- During a call, press ∮ [Options] and press ♠ or ∳ to select "Hold & Answer", then press ♠ or ∳ [Select] to answer the second call.
 The first call is put on hold and you can now talk to the second caller.
- 2. Press ♀ [Options] and press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Swap Calls", then press ♠ or ♀ [Select] to switch between the two calls
- 3. Press ♦ [Options] and press ♠ or ♠ to highlight "Release Call", then press ♠ or ♠ [Select] to end the current call and return to the held call.

Note

- You need to set "Call Waiting" to "On" if you use the Call Waiting service (p. 150).
- Call Waiting service may not be available on all networks. Contact your network operator for more information.
- If you do not wish to answer the second call, press
 {
 [Busy], or press
 {
 [Options], then press
 {
 } or
 {
 } in step 1. If "Reject" is selected, the call log of the second call is saved as a missed call.

Accessing SMS Menu During a Call

During a call, press ♀ [Options] and press ♠ or ♠ to highlight "SMS", then press ♠ or 욧 [Select] to select.

The following options are available: "Create Message" to make an SMS, or "Inbox", "Sent" or "Drafts" to access these folders. For details on SMS, see "SMS (Short Message Service)" on page 76.

Conference Call

Conference call is a call with more than 2 participants. You may include up to 5 participants in a conference call.

To Make a Conference Call

To make a conference call, you must have one active call and one held call.

- **1.** Press \bigcirc [Options] to display the Options menu.
- 2. Press ♠ or ♠ to highlight "Multiparty", then press ♠ or ♠ [Select] to select.
- 3. Press ♠ or ♠ to highlight "Conference All", then press ♠ to join the conference call.
- **4.** Press (2) to end the conference call.

Note

- Conference call service may not be available on all networks. Contact your network operator for more information.
- You have more options for the Conference call in step 3:
 - To put all participants on hold, select "Conference Hold All".
 - To put all participants except the current call on hold, select "Private".
 - To end the call with all participants, select "Release All".

- To disconnect from the conference call but still allow the other participants to continue talking together, select "Transfer".
- To put the current call on hold and continue to have a conference call with the remaining participants, select "Exclude".
- To reject adding more participants to the current party, select "Reject", or you can send the busy tone by selecting "Busy".

To Add New Participants to the Conference Call

- 1. Press 🕅 [Options] to display the Options menu.
- 2. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Dial", then press or ♥ [Select] to select.
- **3.** Enter the number you wish to include in the conference call.
- 4. Press 🕤 to dial.
- **5.** Press \bigcirc [Options] to display the Options menu.
- **6.** Press A or $\textcircled{\nabla}$ to highlight "Multiparty", then press O or O [Select] to select.
- Press or to highlight "Conference All", then press to join the conference call.
 If you wish to add other participants, repeat steps 1 to 7

To End the Call with a Conference Call Participant

- During a conference call, press or to highlight the person that you wish to disconnect from the conference call.
- 2. Press 🖓 [Options] to display the Options menu.
- 3. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Release Call", then press ♠ or ♦ [Select] to select.

To Have a Private Conversation with One of the Participants

If you wish to have a private conversation with one of the participants, you may select the participant from the conference list and put the other participants on hold.

- 1. During the conference call, press (a) or (b) to highlight the person that you wish to talk to.
- 2. Press 🕅 [Options] to display the Options menu.
- 3. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Multiparty", then press ♠ or ♥ [Select] to select.
- **4.** Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Private", then press ♠ to select.
- **6.** Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Conference All", then press ♠ to return to the conference call.

Muting the Dial Tone (DTMF Tone)

To unmute the dial tone, highlight "DTMF Tones On" in step 1.

Muting the Microphone

1. During a call, press *𝔻* [Mute] to mute the microphone.

To unmute the microphone, press \bigcirc [Unmute].

Entering Characters

When entering characters to create Phonebook entries, text messages or multimedia messages, etc., press the corresponding keys.

In multi-tap input method, press each key until the desired character is displayed. For example, press once for the letter "A" or twice for the letter "B"










When "Traditional Chinese" is selected for the Input Language option





When "Simplified Chinese" is selected for the Input Language option







T9 Text Input

T9 text input method is a shortcut to enter text easily and quickly.

- 1. On the text entry screen, press ♀ [Options] to display the Options menu.
- Press or to highlight "Input Method", then press to select.
- 3. Press nor to highlight the T9 mode (T9 Abc, T9 ABC, T9 abc) you wish to change, then press to select.

"T9" is displayed on the main display.

Press each key once for any letter you require on that key.

To enter the word "How", press e g

- 5. If the word shown isn't the one you want, press or vuntil you highlight the correct one.
- **6.** Press to select the word.

Note

 If the correct word is not shown in step 5, enter the correct word again after switching to the multi-tap input method.

Tip

 If you press instead of step 6, a space is inserted next to the selected word.

Symbols and Punctuations

- 1. Perform steps 1 and 2 above.
- 2. Press ♠ or ♥ to highlight "Symbol Table", then press ♠ to select.

Or press from any input mode.

The first symbol page is displayed.

In Chinese input mode, the FullWidth Symbols screen is displayed.





Operation Guidance

The function of the centre key is displayed in the centre at the bottom of the screen by the graphical icon.

Taking Pictures

The preview is displayed through the main display.

4. Press or the side-down key to take the picture.

The shutter sounds and the still image of the taken picture is displayed.

5. Press ([Save].

"Save to Gallery..." is displayed, then the picture is registered.

If you wish to send a picture by multimedia message after taking the picture, press before step 5.

6. Press ② to return to stand-by.

Tip

- Press-and-holding auring stand-by also activates the digital camera mode.
- To leave digital camera mode without registering the taken picture after step 4 in "Taking Pictures": Press (2) and Press (7) [Yes].
- When the distance to the subject is approximately 5 cm, set the macro dial to the macro position (W).
 When the distance to the subject is approximately 40 cm or more, set the macro dial to the normal position ().

To Switch the Viewfinder

You can switch the viewfinder from the main display to the external display for taking a self-portrait.

Press when the preview is displayed through the main display.

Each time you press , the viewfinder switches between the external display and the main display. When you use the external display as the viewfinder, the taken pictures are saved automatically.

Taking Close-up Pictures

- In digital camera mode, set the macro dial to the macro position ().

Using the Zoom Function

Zooming ratio can be altered between "×1", "×2", and "×4". Press () or () to change the zooming ratio.

- When "Picture Size" is set to "Medium", you can use the zoom function in two magnifications (×1, ×2).

• When "Picture Size" is set to "Large", you cannot use the zoom function.

- The digital camera uses a CCD sensor. Although this camera has been manufactured to the highest specifications, some pictures may still appear too bright or too dark.
- If the phone has been left in a warm place for a long time before taking or registering a picture, the picture quality may be poor.

In the Case of No Available Memory

When the number of pictures that can be taken becomes 3 or less, the remaining shots indicator in the upper left of the screen turns red. (The number of pictures that can be taken is approximate.)

When the number of pictures that can be taken becomes 0, and when you try to take a picture again, "Memory full. You cannot take a picture!" is displayed.

Remaining shots indicator

123: Indicates the remaining number of pictures that can be taken

Flash light indicators (p. 59)

Indicates when the flash light is turned on.

: Macro mode





Troubleshooting

Problem	Solution
The phone does not turn on.	Make sure the battery is properly inserted and charged.
PIN code or PIN2 code is rejected.	Make sure you have entered the correct code (4 to 8 digits). Your SIM card/protected functions will become locked after 3 unsuccessful attempts. Contact your SIM provider if you do not have the correct PIN code.
The SIM card becomes locked.	Enter PUK code (8 digits) provided by your service provider (if supported). If the attempt is successful, enter the new PIN code and confirm your phone is operational again. Otherwise contact your dealer.
The display is difficult to read.	Adjust the backlight brightness for the main display, and adjust the LCD contrast for the external display.

Problem	Solution
Phone functions do not work after the phone is turned on.	 Check the radio signal strength indicator as you may be outside the service area. Check to see if any error message is displayed when you turn your phone on. If so, contact your dealer. Make sure the SIM card is correctly inserted.
Calls cannot be made or received.	 If the message "SIM Card Error" is displayed at start-up, you cannot use your SIM card or the SIM card is damaged. Contact your dealer or network service provider. Check your call barring, fixed dialling setting, remaining battery and call forwarding settings. Check if your phone is currently performing data communication using Infrared (IrDA) or a data cable. Check the remaining balance if you are using a pre-paid SIM card.

Problem	Solution
Call quality is poor.	Your current location may not provide good call quality (i.e., in a car or train). Move to a location where radio signal strength is greater.
Cannot access network service.	Check where your account has been registered and where the service is available.
Cannot send or receive Text Message.	Make sure you are correctly subscribed for the Short Message Service, that the network supports this service, and that the centre number is set up correctly. If not, contact your network service provider.
Cannot connect to Multimedia Message service provider.	MMS settings and configuration may be missing or incorrect or the network does not support it. Check your service provider's access point number. Contact your service provider to confirm the correct settings.

Problem	Solution
Limited memory available.	Delete any unnecessary data.
Call is terminated unexpectedly.	Magnetised objects such as health necklaces placed near the phone may terminate the call. Keep your phone away from such objects.
No entries are displayed in the Phonebook	Confirm that the source setting (Handset or SIM) and View Groups setting are made correctly.
Fax transmission failure	Before transmitting fax data, configure your fax software to use the software flow control. Use of the optional data cable is recommended for transmitting fax data.

- Do not touch the battery terminals. Batteries can cause damage, injury or burns if a conductive material touches exposed terminals. When the battery is detached from the phone, use a cover made of nonconductive material for keeping and carrying the battery safely.

- Recommended temperature for using and storing batteries is approximately 20°C.
- The batteries' performance is limited in low temperatures, particularly below 0°C and the phone may not work temporarily regardless of the amount of remaining battery power.
- Exposing the phone to extreme temperatures will shorten battery life.
- The battery can be charged and discharged hundreds of times but it will eventually wear out. When the operating time (talk-time and stand-by time) is noticeably shorter than normal, it is time to buy a new battery.

Aerial Care

• Do not touch the aerial unnecessarily, whilst using the mobile phone. If it is held, call quality may be hindered leading to shortened talk-time and stand-by time because the mobile phone may have to operate on a higher power level than is necessary.

- Use only the aerial supplied or one approved by Sharp for your mobile phone. Using unauthorised or modified aerials may damage the mobile phone. Moreover, since the mobile phone may violate the appropriate regulations, it may lose performance and exceed the limitation of SAR levels.
- To avoid impaired performance, do not damage the aerial of the mobile phone.
- Whilst talking directly to the microphone, please hold the mobile phone so that the aerial is upwards over your shoulder.
- To avoid interfering with blasting operation, please turn off the mobile phone in a blasting area or in a place where a "turn off two-way radio" sign is posted.

Camera Operation

- Learn picture quality, file formats, etc. beforehand.
 The display supports up to 65,536 colours.
 The taken pictures can be saved in JPEG format (JPEG high-colour).
- Be careful not to move your hand whilst taking pictures.

- If the phone moves whilst taking a picture, the picture can be blurred. When taking a picture, hold the phone firmly to prevent it from moving, or use the delay timer.
- Clean the lens cover before taking a picture.
 Fingerprints, oils, etc. on the lens cover hinder clear focusing. Wipe them off with a soft cloth before taking a picture.

- The phone uses the magnet to recognise that the phone is closed. Do not place magnetic cards near your phone or get the card caught in the phone as it may damage the recorded data.
