#### Information for parents

Remember to comply with legal requirements and local restrictions when using the phone. For example, in aeroplanes, petrol stations, hospitals or while driving.



Mobile phones can interfere with the functioning of medical devices such as hearing aids or pacemakers. Keep at least 20 cm/9 inches between phone and pacemaker. When using the mobile phone hold it to the ear which is further away from the pacemaker. For more information consult your doctor.

The ring tones (p. 20), info tones and handsfree talking are reproduced through the loudspeaker. Do not hold the phone to your ear when it rings or when you have switched on the handsfree function (p. 11). Otherwise you risk serious permanent damage to your hearing.

# Using the SIM card/battery

Your phone's display is delivered with a protective film. Remove this film before getting started. The service provider supplies you with a SIM card on which all the important data for your account is stored. If the SIM card is credit card-sized, snap out the smaller segment and trim any rough edges.

Press depression (1) to remove the cover downwards in the direction of the arrow 2



Insert SIM card (3) and push it fully into

the locating slot (make sure the angled



To remove the SIM card push the card here (5)

Insert the battery sideways into the phone 6, then press downwards 7 until it engages.



To remove, press the retaining tab (8) then lift the battery out.

Place cover on phone and push to the upper edge, until it clicks into place 9.



Always switch off phone before removing the battery!

Only 3V and 1.8V SIM cards are supported. Please contact your service provider if you have an older card.

# Charge battery

The battery is not fully charged when delivered. Plug charger cable into the bottom of the phone, plug power supply unit into a mains power socket and charge for at least two hours. The power supply unit heats up when used for long periods. This is normal and not dangerous.



When charging is in progress 😅 is displayed.

#### Charging time

An empty battery is fully charged after about 2 hours. Charging is only possible within a temperature range of +5 °C to +40 °C. If the temperature rises/falls 5 °C above/below this, the charge symbol flashes a warning. The mains voltage specified on the power supply unit must not be exceeded (Operating time, p. 35).

#### Charge icon not visible

If the battery has been discharged fully the charge icon is not immediately visible when the power supply unit is plugged in. It will appear after up to two hours. In this case the battery is fully charged after 3-4 hours.

#### Only use the power supply unit provided!

#### Display while in service

A beep sounds when the battery is nearly empty. The charge level of the battery is only displayed correctly after an uninterrupted charging/discharging cycle. You should therefore **not remove the battery unnecessarily** and where possible **not terminate the charging process early**. Switch on/off, PIN

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key 🐨 to switch on or off.

## Enter PIN

The SIM card can be protected with a 4- to 8-digit PIN.

Enter the PIN using the number keys. The characters \*\*\*\* appear to ensure nobody can read your PIN on the display. Correct errors with Clear.

Confirm your input with OK. Logging on to the network will take a few seconds.

# Emergency number (SOS)

#### Only to be used in real emergencies!

By pressing the soft key **SOS** you can make an emergency call on any network **without** a SIM card and without entering a PIN (not available in all countries).

# Switching on your phone for the first time

#### Time/date

Set the clock to the right time once at start-up.

Press Yes. First enter the date (day/month/year), then the time (24 hours, including seconds). Press OK. The time and date are updated.

If the battery is removed for longer than 30 seconds, the clock will be reset.

#### Time zones

Set the time zone for your area.

Select the required time zone from list with (). Apply with Set.

#### 8 General instructions

#### Phonebook or Addressbook

You can choose whether you want to use the **Phonebook** on the SIM card or the internal **Addressbook** as standard.

You can copy the SIM card Phonebook to the Addressbook on the phone. Please **do not interrupt this procedure**. During this time **do** not **accept incoming calls**. Follow instructions in the display.

To copy data on the SIM card at a later time, highlight entries (see p. 9) and copy these with the function Copy into  $\square$  (Phonebook options menu).

You can change the default book at any time (p. 14).

# Signal strength

Strong reception signal.

A weak signal reduces the call quality and may lead to loss of the connection. Change your location.

# Without SIM card

E.g. to display call list for missed calls:

Press Menu → \$ → Calls missed → Select.

This comprises the following steps:

Open main menu, select 📳 , then select the function Calls missed. You have to confirm with Select.

# Standby mode

Very often function descriptions begin in standby mode.

The phone is in **standby mode** and is **ready for use** when the name of the service provider appears on the display.

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key The return to standby mode from any situation.

# Security

Menu  $\rightarrow @ \rightarrow Security$  $\rightarrow$  Select function.

The phone and SIM card are protected against misuse by several security codes.

Keep these confidential numbers in a safe place where you can access them again if required.

# Codes

#### PIN control

You can stop the PIN prompt being activated when the phone is switched on, but you then risk unauthorised use of the phone.

Press Change. Enter PIN and confirm with OK.

#### Change PIN

You can change the PIN to any 4- to 8-digit number you find easier to remember.

Enter current PIN and confirm with ox. Enter new PIN twice and confirm each time with ox.

#### Change PIN2

(Display only if PIN2 is available). Proceed as with Change PIN.

#### 10 Calling

#### Change phonecode

You define the phone code (4-8 digits) when you call up a protected function for the first time. It is then valid for all phonecode protected functions. If the wrong code is entered three times then the phone will be locked. Contact Siemens Customer Care for instructions on how to unlock your pone.

# **Clear SIM card barring**

If the PIN is entered incorrectly three times, the SIM card is barred. Enter the PUK (MASTER PIN), provided by your service provider with the SIM card, according to instructions. If the PUK (MASTER PIN) has been lost, please contact your service provider.

# Preventing accidental activation

Even if PIN control is deactivated confirmation is required to switch on the phone.

This prevents the phone from being switched on accidentally, e. g. when carried in a pocket or whilst you are on an aircraft.

Press and **hold** the On/Off/End key and confirm with **OK**. The phone switches on.

# Dialling with number keys

The phone must be switched on (standby mode). Dial number (always with area code, if necessary with international dialling code). To dial international dialling code press and hold 0 until a "+" is displayed. Press **4List** and select country.

Short press Clear to clear the last digit, a long press clears the entire phone number. To dial press the Call key 🌈 .

# End call

Press the End key 💿 briefly. Press this key even if the person on the other end of the line has hung up first.

# Set volume

Use navigation key  $(\stackrel{\bullet}{)}$  to start adjusting the volume during conversation. Set volume with navigation key  $(\stackrel{\bullet}{)}$ .

If a Car Kit is used, its volume setting will not affect the usual setting on the phone.

# Redial

To redial numbers that were dialled previously, press the Call Key  $\checkmark$  once, pick up the required phone number from the list with  $(\clubsuit)$ , then press  $\checkmark$  again.

# If the number is busy

Press Auto dial for automatically dialling the phone number ten times at increasing time intervalls or press Call back ( (%!) for phone ringing when the busy number is free. Press Prompt and a beep reminds you to redial the dispayed phone number after 15 minutes.

# Accept call

The phone must be switched on (standby mode). An incoming call will interrupt any other use of the phone. Press Answer or  $\checkmark$ .

Please make sure you have accepted the call before holding the phone to your ear. This will avoid damage to your hearing from loud ring tones!

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A phone number transmitted by the network is displayed or the corresponding name if it is contained in the Phonebook (p. 14) or Addressbook (p. 15). A picture may also appear (settings p. 15).

# Reject call

Reject or 🕤 press briefly.

## Handsfree

You can put the phone aside during a call. You can then hear the caller via the loudspeaker.

Activate handsfree function with Handsfr. and switch on with Yes.

Adjust the volume with (). Pressing Handsfr. switches off "handsfree talking".

Always switch off "handsfree talking" before holding the phone to your ear! This will avoid damage to your hearing!

# Swapping between 2 calls

Make a new connection during a call with  $(menu \rightarrow Hold \rightarrow ())$  (dial a new phone number). With  $(menu \rightarrow Swap you can swap back and forth between both calls.$ 

If you are called during a phone call and you can hear the "call waiting tone" (p. 23), you can accept the waiting call with <u>Swap</u>, putting the current call on hold to do so.

"T9" deduces the correct word from the individual key entries by making comparisons with an extensive dictionary.

If several options are found in the dictionary for a key sequence (a word), the most probable is displayed first. If the word you want has not been recognised, the next suggestion from T9 may be correct.

The word must be highlighted. Then press [1][6]. The displayed word is replaced with a different word. If this word is also incorrect, repeat until the correct word is displayed.

To add a word to the dictionary, select Spell. Now write the word without T9support and accept with Save into the dictionary.

# Camera (Accessories)

The photo is taken with the flash. You will hear an advisory tone when the exposure time has expired. The photo is shown on the display and saved automatically.

#### Sending a photo by MMS

You can easily send a photo as an MMS immediately after taking it.

Options → Send via MMS → Select (select the desired resolution) → Skip (skip recording a melody p. 19).

The MMS Editor starts. Simply complete the following input fields:
